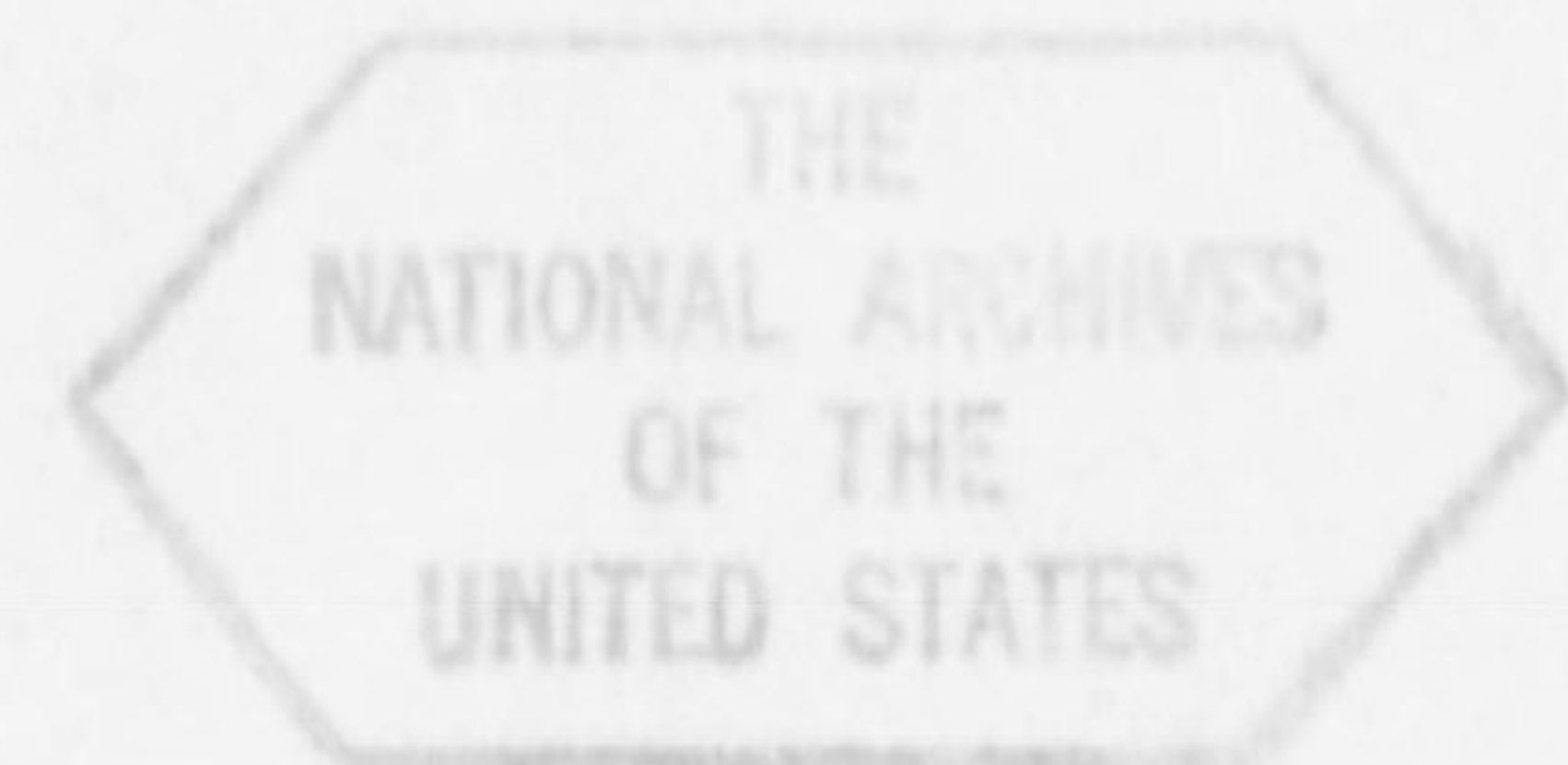

1. The Adjutant General, Department of the Army, directed, effective 1 April 1951, the establishment of an Organized Reserve Corps Evaluation Program in the Far East Command, which requires that all Reserve officers, not on extended active duty, be administered a final type medical examination to determine their physical qualifications for recall to Extended Active Duty or retention in the active reserve.

2. To effect this program, Military Districts (ORC) established by General Order 75, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 30 November 1950 and General Order 62, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 30 March 1951, have been instructed to communicate direct with hospitals in scheduling reservists to report for such examinations. Upon determination of scheduled dates, Military Districts (ORC) will advise reservists by a letter of instruction on date to report for examination.

3. The following paragraph is extracted from instructions issued by General Headquarters, Far East Command, on 1 April 1951, to major subordinate commanders.

"United States Government employees holding reserve commissions, will be granted, under the provisions of paragraph 9 c, Civilian Personnel Regulations L1, Department of the Army, 21 June 1948, sufficient administrative leave from their duties to report to appropriate medical

installations for accomplishment of final type medical examinations.
No delay in reporting to medical installation as directed by major


