2. Mrs. [REDACTED], age 21, [REDACTED], Georgia, was interviewed by a representative, this office, at 1425 hours on 4 September 1952. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that at approximately 1730 hours 3 September 1952 she was talking to her neighbor Mrs. [REDACTED] in her ([REDACTED]) front yard, at which time Mrs. [REDACTED] pointed at the sky and told her to "look at those funny things." Mrs. [REDACTED] looked in the direction to which Mrs. [REDACTED] was pointing and saw five (5) round and flat objects which appeared to be bright aluminum in color. The objects as first sighted by Mrs. [REDACTED] was at the south west about 45 degrees from eye sight. The objects were moving in a horizontal line, toward the Veteran's Hospital in a southwest direction.

3. Mrs. [REDACTED] observed the objects for possibly four (4) minutes before they disappeared. She stated that once during the observation the objects appeared extremely bright and then they regained their original aluminum color.

4. Mrs. [REDACTED] was not under the influence of intoxicants at the time of observation.

5. She detected no sound, vibration, smoke, flame, or odor. Attached is a drawing made by Mrs. [REDACTED] in an attempt to present in pictorial form the outline and position of the object.

2. Mrs. [REDACTED], age 28, [REDACTED] Dublin, Georgia, was interviewed by a representative, this office, at 1455 hours, 4 September 1952. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that at approximately 1730 hours 3 September 1952 while she was in her front yard, her neighbor, Mrs. [REDACTED] called her attention to some flying objects.

3. These objects as first sighted by Mrs. [REDACTED] were in the southwest and appeared to be moving fairly fast toward the Veteran's Hospital in a southwest direction. The objects appeared to be flat and round, dull aluminum in color and about 2 feet in diameter. The objects traveled in a horizontal line never gaining or losing altitude. The objects appeared extremely bright at one time and then regained original color before disappearing. The weather was bright and clear and the objects were observed for approximately five (5) minutes. At approximately 1740 hours, Mrs. [REDACTED] called Radio Station WMLT and described the sighting to Mrs. [REDACTED]

4. Mrs. [REDACTED] was not under the influence of intoxicants at the time of observation.

5. She detected no sound, vibration, smoke, flame, or odor. Attached is a drawing made by Mrs. [REDACTED] in an attempt to present in pictorial form the outline and position of the object.



2. Mrs. [REDACTED] of Radio Station WMLT, Dublin, Georgia, was interviewed by a representative, this office, at 1305 hours, 4 September 1952. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that at approximately 1740 hours, 3 September 1952, Mrs. [REDACTED], Dublin, Georgia, reported that she [REDACTED] and a number of neighbors observed several peculiar objects in the air which were moving from east to west. The objects were described as being flat and round with an aluminum color.

3. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that this information was broadcasted at 1800 and 1945 hours, 3 September 1952.

4. Mrs. [REDACTED] further revealed that shortly after the 1945 news bulletin, an anonymous phone call was received at the radio station. 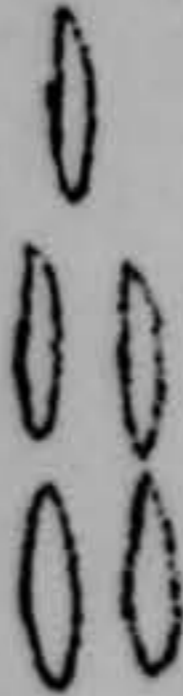

Mrs. [REDACTED] then looked in the direction of the Hospital and saw five (5) peculiar looking objects. This was in a southwest direction. The objects as first sighted by Mrs. [REDACTED] appeared to be round and flat and a dull aluminum color. 
