

We have now agreed with the Surveyor of Taxes the amended figure for which you are assessable for the year 1917/18, and enclose a Statement showing how that figure is made up. We also send you an amended Statement showing what your liability will be for Tax for the year ending 5th April 1918 if the rates are not increased.

We are glad to inform you that we have been able to induce the Surveyor of Taxes to give you a rebate on your Earned Income in respect of the assessment for the year ending 5th instant.
