This company gives the address 303 Alexandra Its Prosident is listed as C. M. Caupbell, Building, Edmonton. Edmonton, Alta. Secretary-Treasurer and Vice-President is R. K. Bannister also of Edmonton. It would appear that this may be a holding company as the aircraft, a Camadair DC-4, has been leased to Cubana Airlines ( 105-89660-96) On September 14, 1961, the same cource furnished the following information concerning the crew of this airplane: (C) \*Colin Campbell appears to be the main pilot and in charge of the aircraft. CAMPBELL was employed by T.C.A. for about ten years and prior to leaving the employ of that company he was a captain on T.C.A's Atlantic flights. years ago he left T.C.A. as a result of a disagreement with his superiors. Our source felt that CAMPBRILL would take part in smuggling if conditions were ideal as he was experiencing financial difficulties."() (105-89660-107) On October 24, 1961, the same source furnished the following additional information: "Colin Campbell, pilot of CF-TFC was beard to remark recently that he would be receiving two cargo planes Orig & one to Deputy Director, Plans Belmont Central Intelligence Agency Mohr by 0-14Cosper Callahan 4M Conrad . 'A confidential source, believed reliable, stated that some difficulty had risen between International Air Freighters and Cubana Airlines. He understands that a Mr. HEGLER, barrister from Fontreal, P.Q., representing Cubana Airlines, travelled to Toronto recently attempting to change the Cubana franchise from International Air Freighters to Vorld Wide Airlines. International Air Freighters continue to fly to Cuba. Source believes that some difference exists between Colin CAMPBELL and Cuban authorities but did not know what caused this difference. On April 13, 1962, the same source advised that information had been received that Colin Campbell had left International Air Freighters and was believed to have moved to Nassau. Continuing, the source advised as follows: (C)

"CAMPBILL appeared to resent the circumstance of his separation with the company and during conversation with Customs officials inferred that certain crew members were illegally exporting goods in their personal luggage. As a result of this and other information special attention was directed to luggage of crew members. Two seizures were made during Earch: (2)

- (1) Repair parts for some 15 different makes of automobiles, total value \$360.00.
- (2) A small seizure of U.S. pade automobile bearings and oil seals."(C)(105-89660-159)
