



**Ethiopia – IDPs**

- East Harargue: 50 433 IDPs in need of humanitarian assistance.
- The ECHO supported Emergency Response Mechanism is playing a central role in covering the most important needs (e.g., primary health care, NFIs, WASH), under coordination by government of Ethiopia (DRMFSS) and UNOCHA.

**Mali – Flash Floods**

- Bamako, 28 August: 34 died, several injured, thousands houses damaged or destroyed.
- 931 families, sheltered in schools, received assistance through government's DGPC and humanitarian partners. 1 202 families, hosted by relatives or still in damaged houses, require assistance. Flooded houses and latrines cause worries.
- Stagnant waters and lack of mosquito nets may cause increase in malaria cases and water borne diseases. (ECHO)

**Kenya – Refugees**

- The verification exercise in Dadaab, run by UNHCR, resulted in a reduction by almost 16% of the total number of refugees in Dadaab Camps, from approximately 475 000 to 402 455. (ECHO)

**Ethiopia – Floods**

- Amhara region: 39 died, 39 009 households affected in 219 districts, 32 753ha of crops damaged, 398 livestock died.
- Most affected: North Shoa, South Wollo, North Wollo, Oromiya, North Gondar, East and West Gojam. Emergency response organised (shelter, NFIs, food relief).
- The ECHO supported Emergency Response consortium is providing shelter and NFIs assistance to the most affected areas. Seeds distribution and unconditional cash transfer are two other options currently under consideration. (ECHO)

**Nigeria – Severe Weather**

- Cross River State, 4 September: rainfall, flash floods and landslides; nine people dead due to landslide in the flood-prone community of Edim Otop.
- Kebbi State, 4 September: rainfall and flash floods; one person died, 45 were injured. (Local Media (1), (2))

**Kenya – Conflict / Population Displacement**

- Moyale town, over the past month: intermittent attacks (revenge and retaliatory) between the majority Borana and a coalition of other smaller tribes, most notably the Gabra and Burj; over 20 people killed, similar number of wounded.
- An estimated 25 000 people are said to have fled the town in the last few days. (ECHO)

**South Sudan – Floods**

- NW South Sudan, since June: OCHA reports 27 000 people in need of assistance in 6 states; Warrap state most affected (17 300 people).
- Jonglei state: new floods; ca. 400 houses destroyed in Bor, by the rising waters of the Blue Nile river. (OCHA, Local Media (1), (2))
