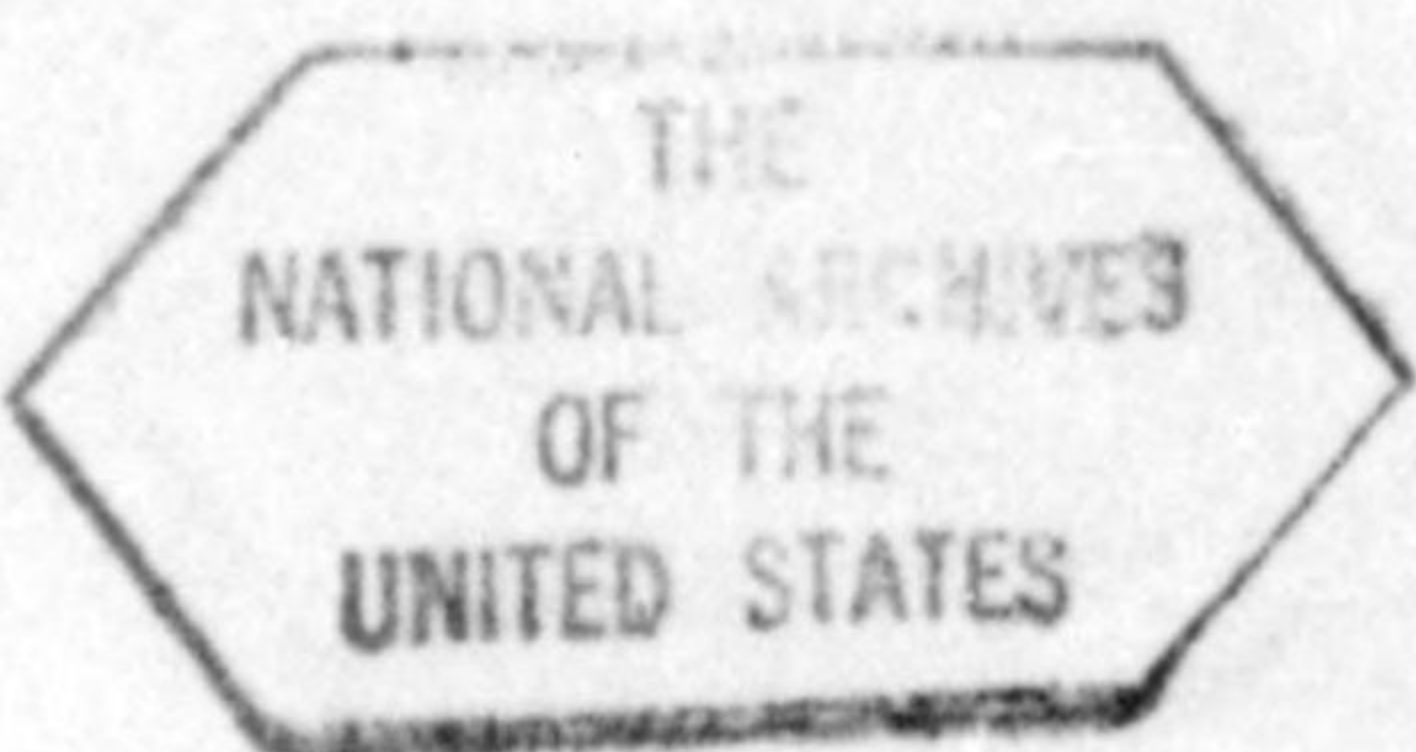

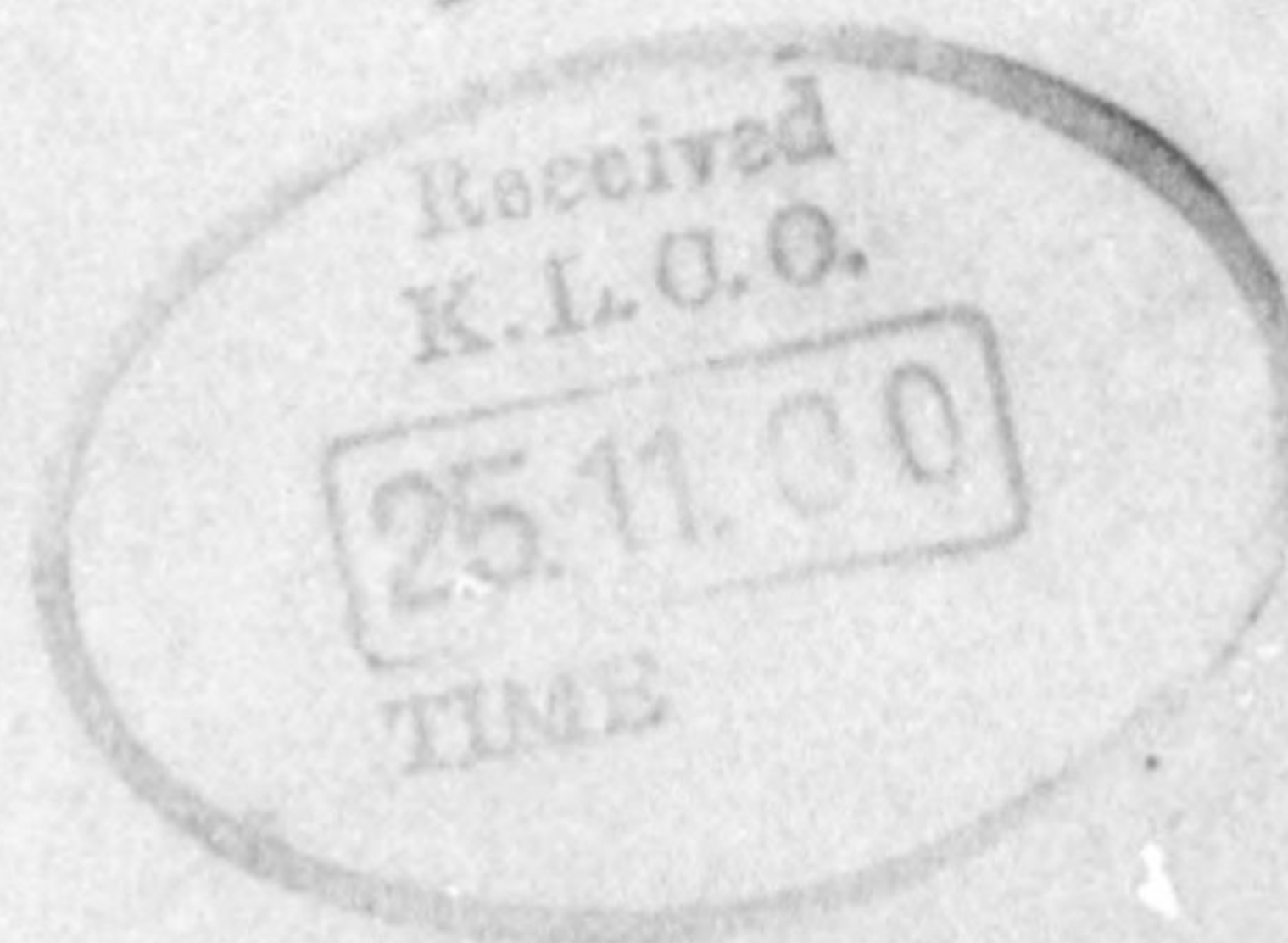

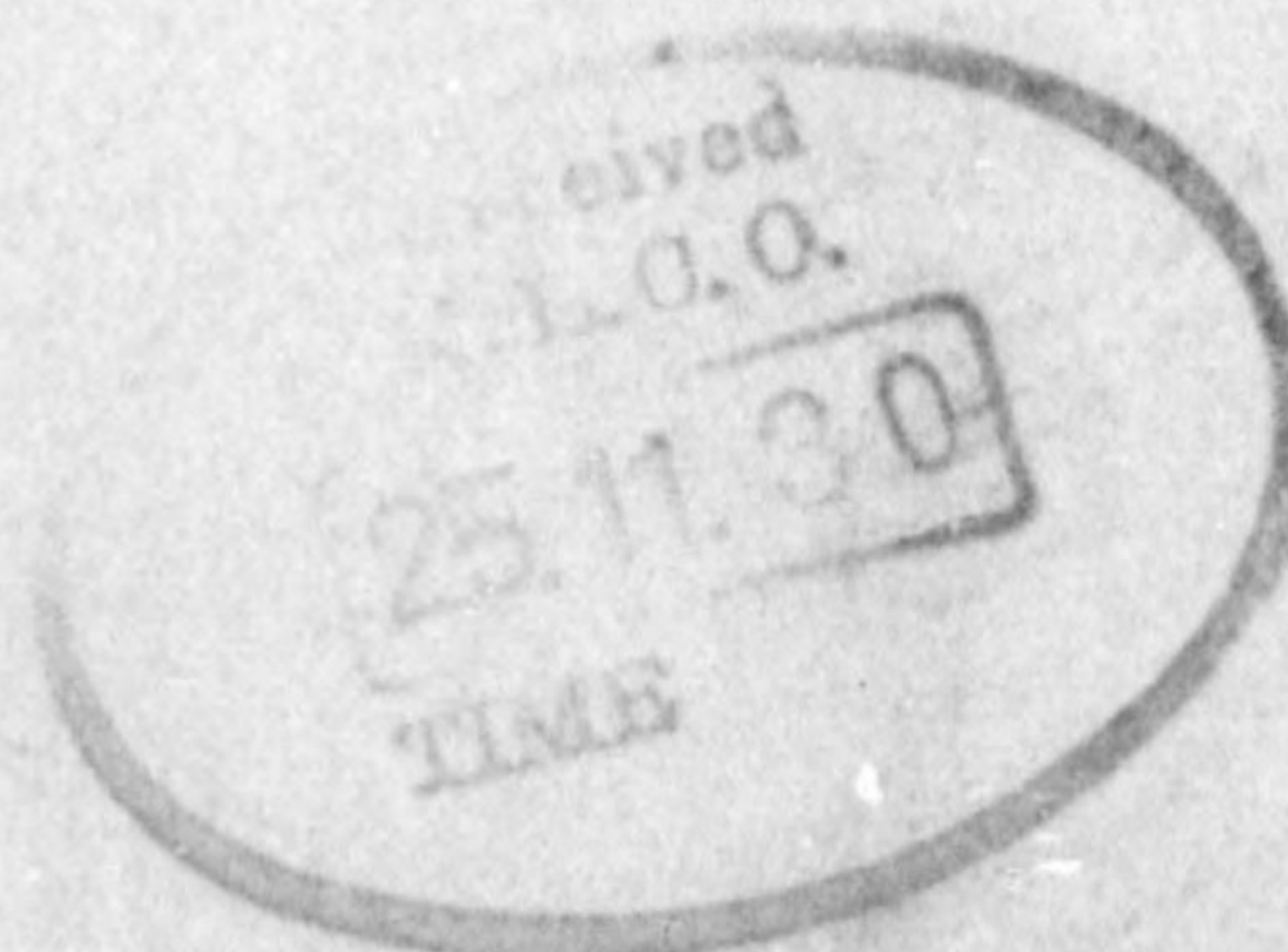

The Farm Land Consolidation is in effect as prescribed by "Land Reform Law".

Let's cooperate with the consolidation campaign, getting rid of such selfish thoughts as "this is my forefathers' land" or "my land is the best of all others".

The consolidation will result in the following benefits:

- (1) Not only trips to and from your arable land, but also your labor to carry the crop will be saved.



- (2) The labor for the water control will be reduced.
- (3) By good use of animal and mechanical power, your working efficiency will increase.
- (4) Unnecessary ridges between padd<sup>y</sup>-fields will disappear and, in return, arable lands increase.

Not only that, he gladly consults with and gives positive aid to holders of forests and those engaging in the forestry industry, in respect of technical matters in the line.

### 5. MORE THAN 80 PERCENT OF RESIDENTS IN THE PREFECTURE ARE FALLEN VICTIMS TO PARASITIC DISEASES.

We hereby submit to you the result of investigation into the petition by Fukuji Arie, Hasuda-machi, Minamisaitama-gun, Saitama-ken as follows.

- Name and address of petitioner:  
Fukuji Arie, No. 3,027 Oaza Urudo, Hasuda-machi, Minamisaitama-gun.
- Date and place of investigation made:  
All persons concerned were called together to the Council Hall of Hasuda Town Office at 10:30 a. m. on 25 November 1950.
- Investigator and attendants:  
Michio Hayazaka, clerk of Pref. Agricultural Land Commission; President of Hasuda-machi Agricultural Land Commission; Commissioner in charge; Assistant member; Fukuji Arie; Kakunosuke Saito.
- Summary of investigation:  
The land-owner Fukuji Arie lent 9 se 28 bu of farmland to Kakunosuke Saito about 1940 upon the contract that the farm-rent should be paid at the end of December every year. From 1940 to 1944 the rent was paid in kind, but since 1945 when the rent was to be paid in money Saito has paid no rent for five years. Arie asks if he can take back the land or receive the rent unpaid in such a case.  
Kakunosuke Saito says that he borrowed 9 se 28 bu of tenant-land from Fukuji Saito. He thought he paid the rent till about 1948 but as the result of investigation of documents it became clear that he had not paid the rent for five years since 1945. He says if the land-owner had pressed him for the payment of the rent, he would have paid it, and nothing of the kind would have happened.

## 5. Measures taken:

According to the state of affairs stated by the persons concerned, it was found that Saito had not paid the rent on purpose, but he left it unpaid simply through misunderstanding. On the other hand, it was not the intention of Arie to take back the land now that it was made clear that unpayment of the rent was through the misunderstanding of Saito. He only made a hasty conclusion that Saito did not pay the rent intentionally. Therefore agreement was reached as shown in separate sheet.

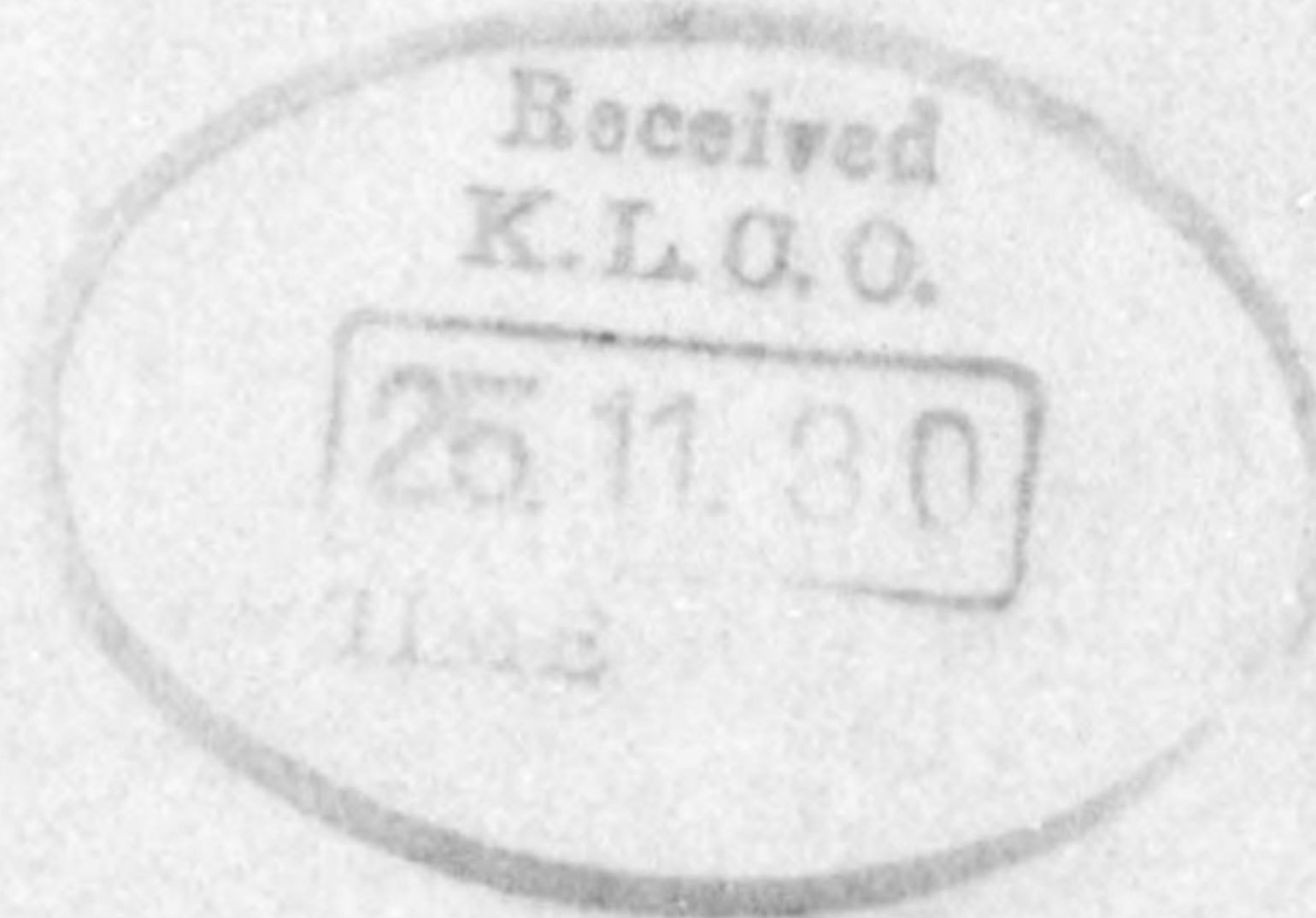

FOR 1950 CROP YEAR

All Japan Gubernatorial Conference was held on 11 & 13 November for the revision of delivery quota of rice for 1950 crop year. As the result of conference the delivery quota allotted to this prefecture was increased as shown below.

In this prefecture the rice crop was not only hampered by unseasonable weather, but also affected by flood and harmful insects. It is anticipated that the actual amount estimated by Agriculture and Forestry Ministry will fall far short of the estimated amount of harvest made public the other day.

For this reason the abovesaid revised quota is a heavy burden to this prefecture and it is expected that the task of rice collection will be beset with not a little difficulty.

We are determined, however, to make our utmost efforts overcoming all obstacles in order to repay the good-will of the Allied Forces, especially the sympathetic assistance of the United States of America. So it is sincerely requested that furthermore help be granted for the fulfilment of our responsibility.

At present Agricultural Adjustment Committee is holding conferences regarding the revision of the delivery quota. As soon as the decision is reached, we shall give notifications to individual farmers. You are additionally informed that we have established plans for insuring the rice collection, as shown in attached sheet.

## 1. Expediting policy

In view of the poor condition of rice-crop after the completion of early-rice delivery (1 November) reasonable adjustment ought to be made and we will expedite the date of delivery. For this purpose prefecture-wide delivery expediting campaign will be held so that we may complete the collection as soon as possible.

## 2. Essentials for expediting

## A. General matters

## (1) Establishment of Rice Expediting Headquarters

Rice Expediting Headquarters will be established in each gun, city, town and village. They will be composed just as they were made at the time of Mugi Collection and they will be kernels of formation of collection projects and the execution thereof.

## (2) Holding of rice collection Expediting Rally.

Rice-collection Expediting Rally of Prefectural level will be held at the end of November (expected attendants; mayors of all cities, towns and villages; Representatives of Agricultural Adjustment Committee-men of the City, Town & Village; Representatives of farmers( and then Expediting meetings will be held in each gun, city, town, and village. To these meetings members of the Prefectural Expediting Headquarters will be dispatched to exalt the delivery will of the farmers and to propel the delivery strongly.

## (3) Prefecture-wide rice-collection campaign.

A meeting will be held for representatives of Agricultural Adjustment Committee Council, Prefectural Assembly; Town and Village Mayors Association; City, Town and Village Assemblies;

and Federations of various agricultural Cooperatives; Farmers' Union; Foodstuffs Office; National Rural Police; Municipal Police; Organs relating to Local Economic Investigation Bureau and other representatives of consumers. At the meeting their wholehearted cooperation will be requested for the delivery of rice. This prefecture-wide campaign will be held in parallel with said Expediting Rally.

In gun, city, town or village, a similar campaign will be held respectively.

(4) Field Expediting program

Officials will be dispatched as occasion calls to city, town or village to expedite individual revised quota and also to expedite delivery. Especially, in December systematically planned field-expediting will be conducted all over the prefecture.

(5) Strengthening of flanking expediting

Rice delivery will be indirectly expedited controlling diversion of rice into illegal channel with the assistance and cooperation of police, Economic Investigation Bureau, Local Administration Offices, City, Town and Village Offices, Agricultural Adjustment committees, Agricultural Cooperative Assns. (Designated agent of staple-food collection) and the Committee for prevention of staple-food illegal diversion which is composed with Saitama Local Economic Investigation Bureau as its center.

(6) Establishment of incentive system.

Model city, town and village that have completed early delivery will be officially commended in the same way as in the case of Mugi delivery.

B. Actual business matters

(7) Fixing of collection targets

Prefectural targets of collection are fixed as follows and in gun, city, town and village their targets will be fixed in accordance with their actual situation, provided that their targets must not be

below the prefectural level.

(8) Expedition of shipping plan and practice

According to the abovesaid collection targets, shipping plans (Examination plans) for Buraku or individual delivery will be formed and they will be surely and promptly executed.

(9) Setting up of Rice Delivery Progress Table

Delivery progress table will be set up in prefecture, gun, cities, towns and villages.

(10) Prompt payment of price of rice delivered.

Measures will be taken for the increase of funds of Agricultural Cooperatives so that the price of rice delivered may be paid promptly.

(11) Increase of storage capacity

We are going to make a request to the Central Government for the shipment of Mugi stored and also for changes of storage of rice to make room for the rice newly collected (at present we are making plans for storing about 500,000 koku). At the same time we are planning to increase the capacity of designated store houses.

(12) Consolidation of information and propagation organs

By means of news-papers, radio, posters and leaflets we are making efforts for the thorough-

going understanding of the purport, exaltation of farmers' delivery will and control of illegal transaction. Saitama Megaphone will issue a specially compiled edition and our prefectural expediting program will be fully prepared.

(13) Grasp of situation through collection of informations

We shall be able to grasp the delivery condition through tendays reports on rice examination. From December onward we are going to have a daily report and we shall be able to form adequate plans according to the actual situation.

(14) Others

Besides the abovesaid projects, we will call together the Chiefs of Local Administration Offices, Agricultural Adjustment Committee-men and designated agents of staple food collection as occasion requires and hold conferences with them for the expediting of delivery and permeation of programs.

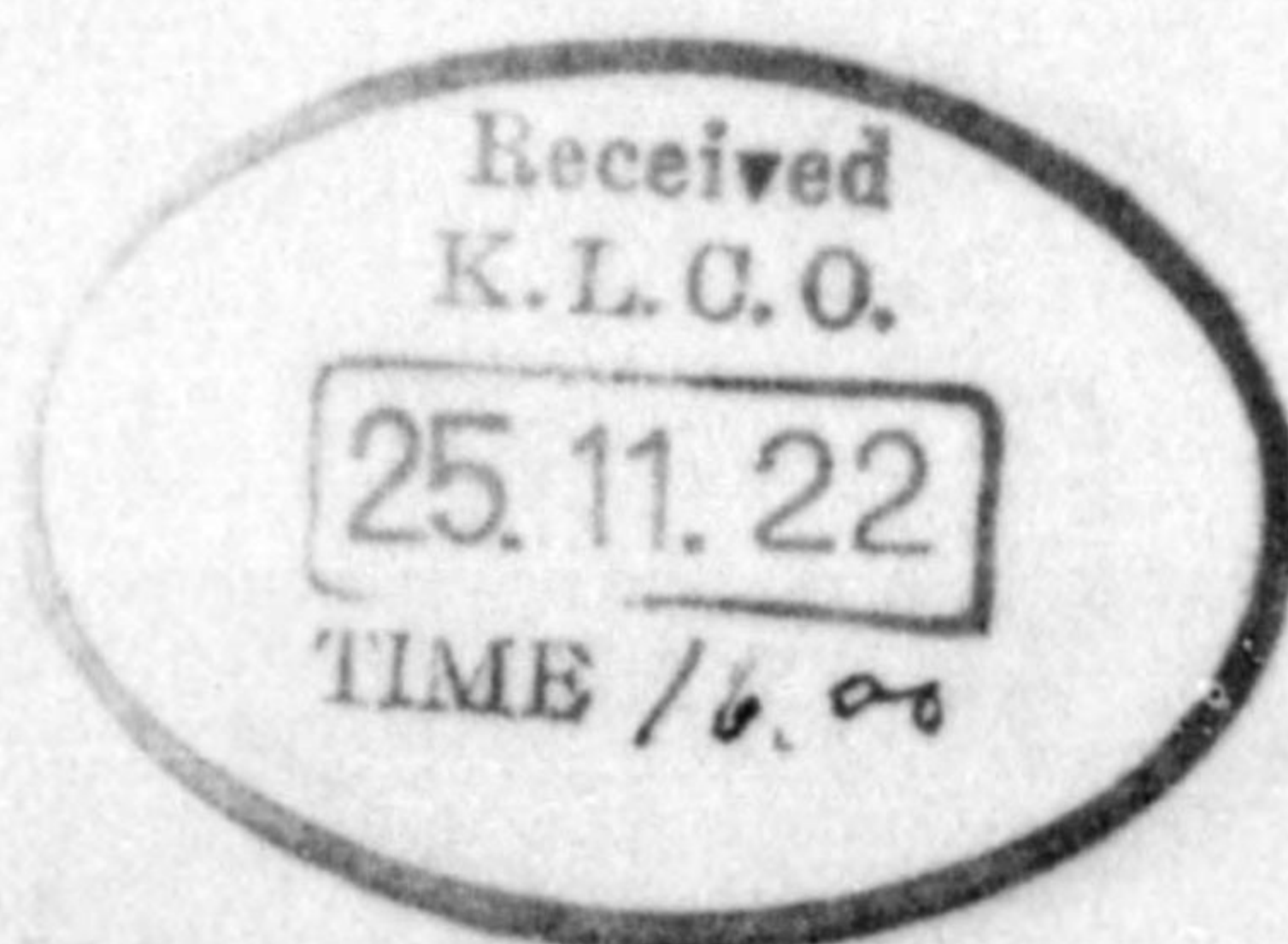

1. Saitama Shisaku 3 November Circ:54,000

a. ELECTION IN HATOGAYA TOWN EXPECTED NOT It has been decided that the election of town headsmen and town assemblymen of Hatogaya-machi, Kitasada-gun, will be carried out on 26 November. 97 candidates for the election applied for the public office qualification's examination.

b. PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS REGULATED In view of the fact that petitions to the prefectural assembly are important from the democratic point of view of the assembly management, the Prefectural Assembly Secretariat regulated the gist of presentation of petitions at the ordinary October assembly meeting.

c. TENTATIVE LOCAL FINANCE EQUILIBRIUM GRANT DECIDED Resting on the basis of applications of towns and villages, the amount of the local finance equilibrium grant for this prefecture has recently been decided by the prefectural authorities tentatively. Consequently 22 towns and villages in Kitasaitama-gun have to return 50 % of the rough estimated grant before the New Year so that they are throwing up their hands in despair.

d. CITIZEN'S DESIRE TO BE REALIZED Sewerage works in Gyoda City which have been desired eagerly for a long time by the citizen will be set to work on 6 November. It is a ten-year construction work at an estimated price of ¥106,600,000.

2. Mainichi Saitama Section-3 5 November Circ:113,000

a. VD INVESTIGATION The Prefectural Epidemics Prevention Section announced that the number of VD cases in this prefecture during the period from April to the end of September this year reached 2,542 in total, showing a 20 % increase over the like period of last year. It is remarkable that the cases of farm village youths and students showed a 50 % and 30 % increase in number respectively.

3. Azumi Saitama Section 4 November Circ:97,000

a. FACTORY MANAGER'S IRREGULARITY The Kawagoe District Police arrested on 2 November a representative of the barley-cleaning mill designated by the Agriculture-Forestry Ministry on the charge of having embezzled 400 bales of the Government-owned rice and barley amounting to ¥660,000.

a. APARTMENT HOUSES TO BE BUILT IN SUCCESSION The Prefecture Housing Cooperation will start the construction of nine ferro-concrete apartment-houses within next month. Besides 12 apartment-houses are expected to be built in Yokohama, Kawasaki, and Yokosuka cities by next March by state subsidies.

b. EIGHT CITIES INSPECTION COMMITTEES LIAISON COUNCIL On October 27, the inspection committee of the Prefectural Office and eight cities held the inaugural general meeting of a "Liaison Council." The chairman is to be elected from among four members of the prefectural committee.

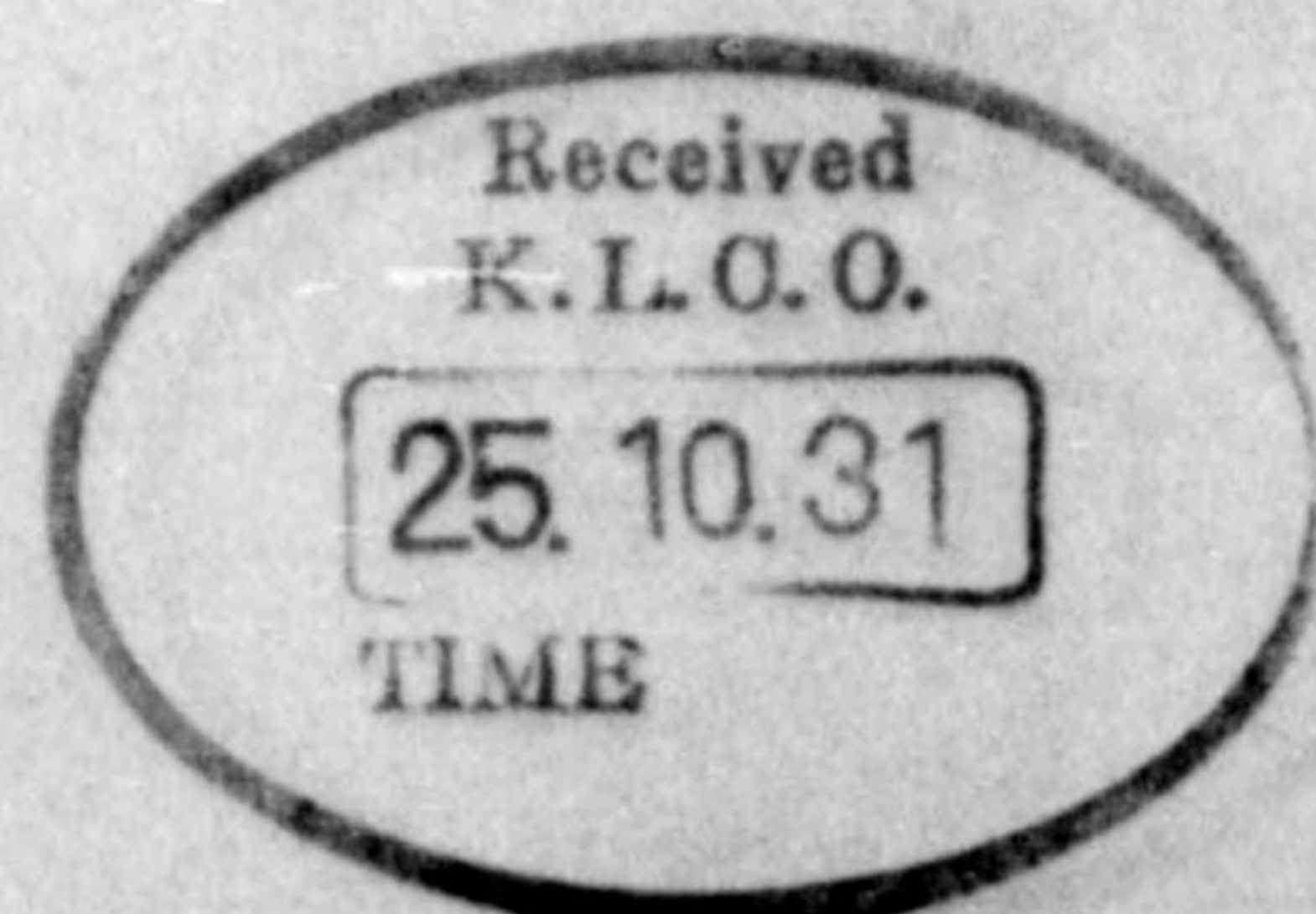

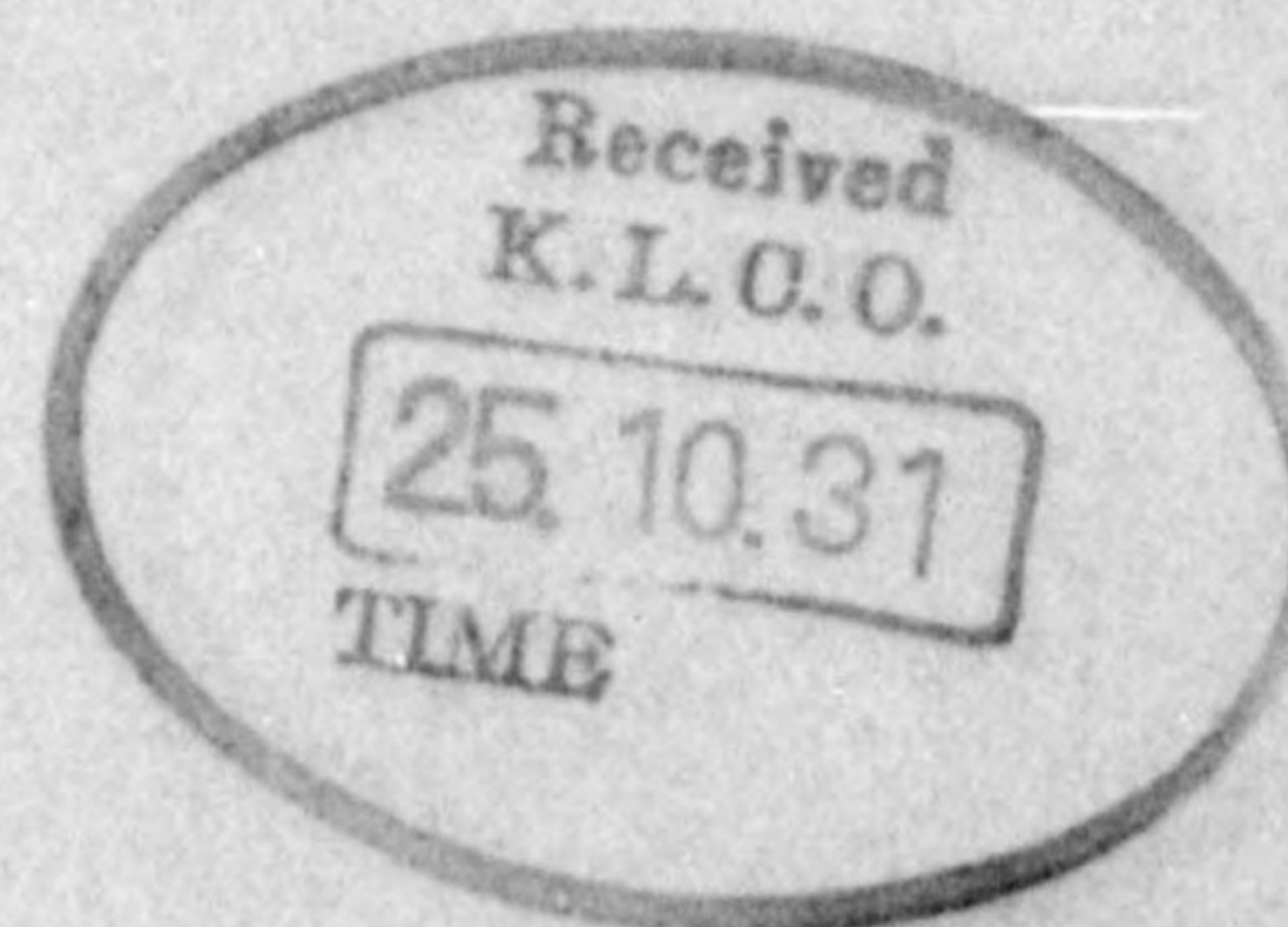

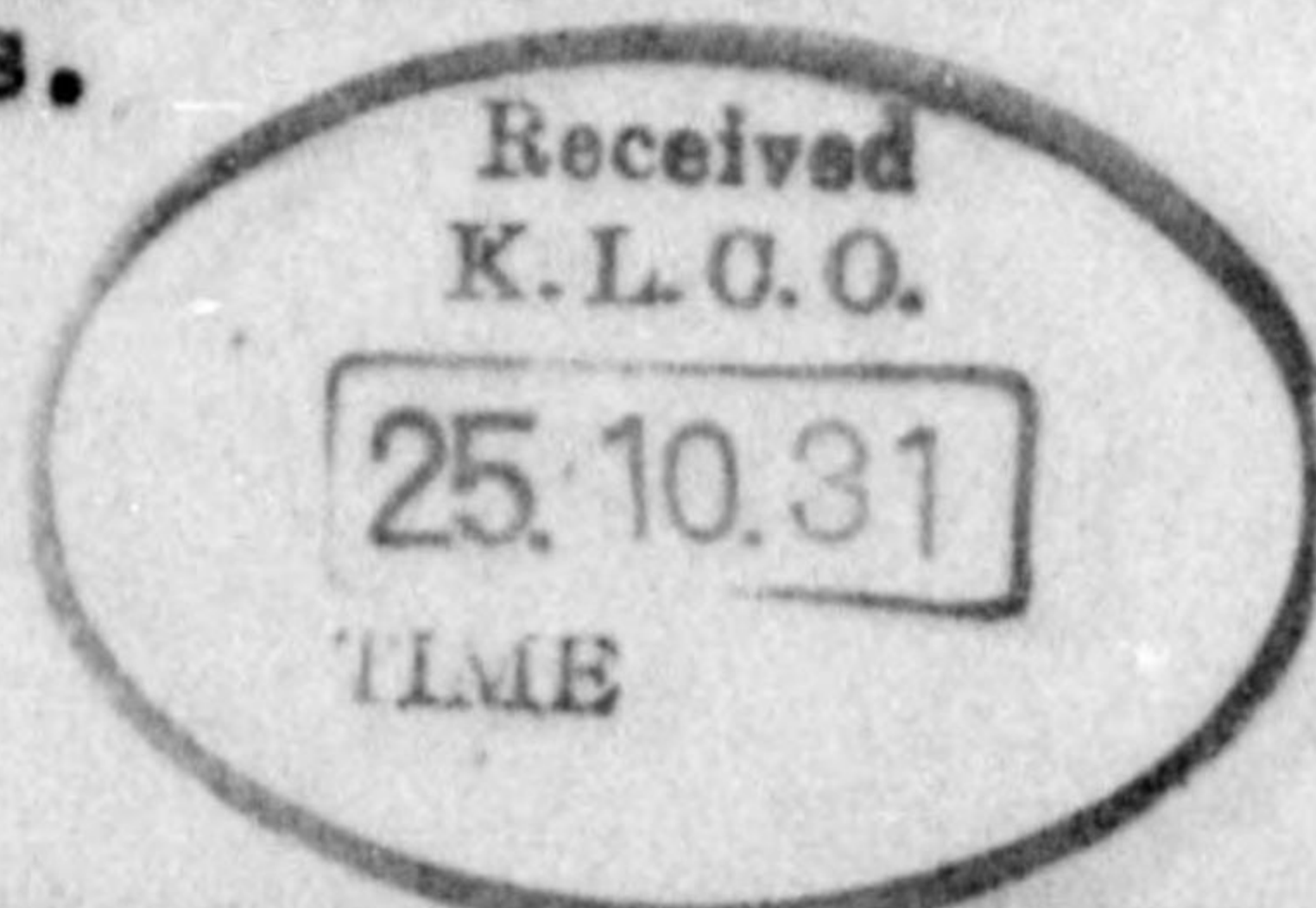
