



#### **Define Topics for Impact**

First thing I do is to define topics for impact. For this, I consider the following factors:

- Need: Are there any topics related to gender that are underrepresented or poorly covered on Wikipedia?
- Impact: What topics would have the greatest impact on people's understanding of gender and women's contributions to the world?
- **Interest:** What topics are most likely to engage and motivate Wikipedia editors, especially women editors?



Some examples of topics for impact you can consider include:

- Women in STEM
- Women in leadership
- Women in business
- Women's rights
- Gender-based violence
- Gender and health
- Gender and education
- Gender and the arts



#### **How I find the articles**

To find the missing articles, I use the following tools:

- Petscan
- Wikidata Query
- Gap Finder
- Wikipedia Categories



Once I have defined my topics for impact, it is important to articulate how I will provide curatorial support for content. This may include:

- Developing a list(s) of articles to create/translate/edit.
- Developing style guides and best practices for writing about gender.
- Providing feedback and support to editors who are working on gender-related content.

#### **Content Partnerships**

Sometimes, I also partner with other organizations to develop and promote content related to gender and women's contributions.

#### This could involve:


- Collaborating on edit-a-thons and other events to create new content or improve existing content
- Developing shared resources, such as training materials and topic guides
- Promoting each other's content on social media and other platforms

These are the steps I've taken in identifying knowledge gap, hosting gender gap campaigns and making Wikipedia/Wikidata/Wikiquote more inclusive..





#### **Program and Events Dashboard**




Suppose that there is a wiki program, for example, a wiki editing drive to improve a certain sort of content, or a wiki event, for example a wiki editing meetup at a local community center. In either of those cases, the dashboard provides the following:

- A registration button for participants to note that they are joining the program
- Tracking functions for organizers to measure and report the outcome of a program
- Training modules, such as those on dealing with online harassment and keeping events safe

**Registration & Tracking** 






Hashtags or the Wikimedia Hashtag Search is a tool for monitoring and searching the usage of hashtags in Wikimedia edit summaries.

The tool monitors edits to all Wikimedia projects (except Wikidata) and allows users to search for them. It was initially created in 2016, but was rewritten in 2018.






#### Learning on using on-wiki campaign tools

#### **Event Registration Tool**



#### Try the new tool!

The event registration tool is the first on-wiki solution for event registration. With this tool, event participants can click on a "Register" button to sign up for events, rather than needing to add their signature to an event page or using third-party registration solutions that are off the wikis.



#### **Event Discovery**

The event discovery project aims to create or improve tool(s) that make it easier for editors to learn about campaign events on the wikis. We hypothesize that, if more editors can stumble upon and learn about events, then more editors will join events and therefore improve the number of articles on high impact topics.


