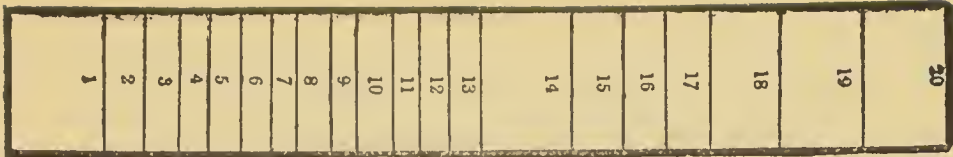

CONDITIONS OF SALE.


