# Corfupedia

Students learn values of collaboration and cooperation  
with Wikimedia

- **The project was proposed by students** to their teachers, after noticing there is not much content about Corfu on Wikipedia in an introductory course to the encyclopedia.
- **60 students involved**, ages 12 to 68, from traditional and evening high schools.

# Hungarian Revolution of 1956

A future built through affiliate collaboration.



- A writing contest to commemorate the **60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution.**
- The challenge was taken on by affiliates of **Wikimedia Central and Eastern Europe.**
- 7 participating countries, **390+** articles edited, only **1** edit-a-thon (in Hungary).

# WikiIndaba 2017

- The **regional conference for Africans** to strengthen, support, and share knowledge within wikimedia communities both in the continent and in the diaspora.
- Took place in Accra, Ghana from **January 20th - 22nd**. Supported through a Wikimedia Foundation grant.
- **45+ participants** from **18 countries**.
- **Increasing visibility and awareness** of the movement identified as key area for development.

# Foundation highlights

- **Inspire Campaign on gender gap.** The report for the first inspire campaign was published, offering key lessons learned from the first campaign on the topic of increasing gender diversity on the Wikimedia sites.
- **Structured Data on Commons.** A 3 MM dollars grant will enable work to connect Wikimedia Commons with Wikidata, improving search and machine-readable media.
- **1Lib1Ref.** The second annual 1Lib1Ref campaign kicked off in January 2017. The campaign encourages librarians to get involved with Wikipedia by adding citations to articles.

# Foundation highlights

- **Wikimedia Developer Summit.** The international gathering took place in San Francisco from January 9-11. Volunteer and staff developers discussed 6 key topics, among which were creating a plan for the 2016 Community Wishlist top 10 ideas and how to grow the developer community.
- **Wikimedia Foundation All Hands.** The Foundation hosted its annual all staff meeting in January 12-13, where employees participated in sessions, connected in person, and discussed issues important to our work (also -- we had an amazing talent show from staff).

# How many were bots?

Today, we only know how many *\*are\** bots right now.

# How many were bots?

CONTAINS(event\_user\_groups, 'bot')  
and  
CONTAINS(event\_user\_groups\_latest, 'bot')

# “Historified” fields

- User name (why do users change their names?)
- User blocks
- User groups (how does membership change over time?)
- Page title
- Page namespace
- Page was considered content



# New helpful fields

- Is a user anonymous, self-registered, named like a bot?
- User registration date?
- Was a revision deleted? When?
- Was a revision **reverted**? By what revision?
- How many bytes does a revision add or remove?
- Is a revision “**productive**”? What does reverting it mean?

# A strategic pilot (by CR)

The hypothesis:

- There are certain community capacities all thriving communities need developed.
- Some Wikimedia communities have under-developed capacities, or plateaued and aren't developing a particular capacity.
- WMF can usefully assist a particular community to build a specific capacity, and to "level up".

# The process

- Conduct research (community interviews)
- Select (emerging) communities for pilots -- **Brazil** (communications); **Tamil** (on-wiki tech skills); **Ukraine** (conflict engagement)
- Develop curriculum
- Deliver in-person in-country training with experts (hi Greg V., Yuvi P.)
- Evaluate
- (^ you are here)
- Decide about resourcing next fiscal year



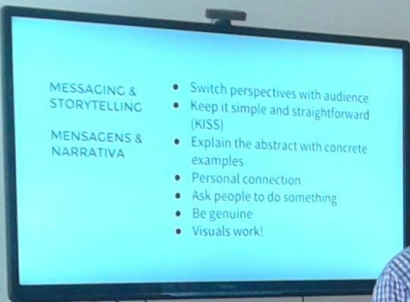

MESSAGING & STORYTELLING

MENSACENS & NARRATIVA

- Switch perspectives with audience
- Keep it simple and straightforward (KISS)
- Explain the abstract with concrete examples
- Personal connection
- Ask people to do something
- Be genuine
- Visuals work!

# So, does this work?

Short answer: yes

Longer answer: yes, and it has additional beneficial side-effects

# Key lesson

This "high-touch" approach works: communities appreciate attention and customization to their context. Communities successfully "leveled up".

# Key lesson

Materials are significantly re-usable. Needs are largely shared across many different communities.

# Some concrete impact

Brazilians revamped their site, revived their blog and social media handles, created a press kit.

Tamil community now engages with Wikidata. One volunteer amassed 200K manual(!) edits to Wikidata in under a year.



# Some quotations

- "The **quality and depth of the training** by experienced WMF staff can't be matched by outsiders."
- "Very few people can come to the international events. **We need WMF to come to communities** in their own countries, and ideally in their own language."
- "I was aware of Wikidata, but **found it complicated, too confusing** to understand beyond interwiki. **Now I think it is the future** of Wikipedia. My mind was blown. **I was inspired and started contributing massively.**"
- "I attended lectures about [Wikidata], but not one had engaged me and made me actually want to contribute. [...] I was finally persuaded that I should invest time and go to actively contribute to Wikidata"

# So now what?

- This strategic **pilot** was **successful**. Recommended next steps are:
  1. **Scale up** (additional communities; additional capacities)
  2. Develop "**core curriculum**" and **track** individual communities' progress in pursuing capacities toward mastery/comfort in curriculum. Plan training/help according to need and opportunity.
  3. Identify **already-effective trainers** and knowledge diffusers; **enhance their opportunities** to share knowledge; train prospective trainers and empower **successful** trainee trainers.
- The above implies **increased resourcing** (budget and staff time), as well as participation from additional teams. **Is WMF leadership interested?** When do we make a decision?
