MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Action radio is CG China's (Gen Marshall) GOLD 1349, dated (19 Aug) wherein China desires information concerning agreements made between Soviets and SCAP for repatriation of Japanese through Dairen - Port Arthur areas. Action is directed by G-3.

2. GOLD 1057 from China (Gen Marshall), Tab A, paraphrased in WAR SVC 7907, Tab B, is a Soviet proposal that Japanese now in Soviet - Port Arthur area should be repatriated through Dairen in a similar manner to that proposed by Soviet representative in Tokyo for evacuation of repatriates from North Korea, details to be worked out in Tokyo.

3. GOLD 1163 China to WARCOS, Tab C, (erroneously referred to as GOLD 1063 in action radio), indicates there are 250,000, 100,000 and 14,000 in areas: Vicinity of Dairen; Port Arthur; and Dairen Proper respectively and recommends that WARCOS make representations to Soviets on governmental level to evacuate all 364,000 through Dairen.

4. Ourad C 62607 of 14 July to WARCOS, Tab D, is a full report of negotiations between SCAP and Soviets, their failure and the fact that SCAP is awaiting instructions from WARCOS before taking further action.

5. China should be apprised of the status of negotiations between SCAP and Soviets, and contents of ourad C 62607 (para 4 above). Action to accomplish this as of 23 July was disapproved by C/S, but is reopened at this time in view of action radio (para 1 above).

6. By making WARCOS an info addressee, stating we are awaiting instructions, passing GOLD 1349 (para 1 above) to WARCOS, the matter is again brought to attention of WARCOS. It may be productive of action of their part.

7. Concurrence: Dipl Sec (Mr. Bishop)

8. Korea has been considered.

9. This completes action on radio but not on this subject.

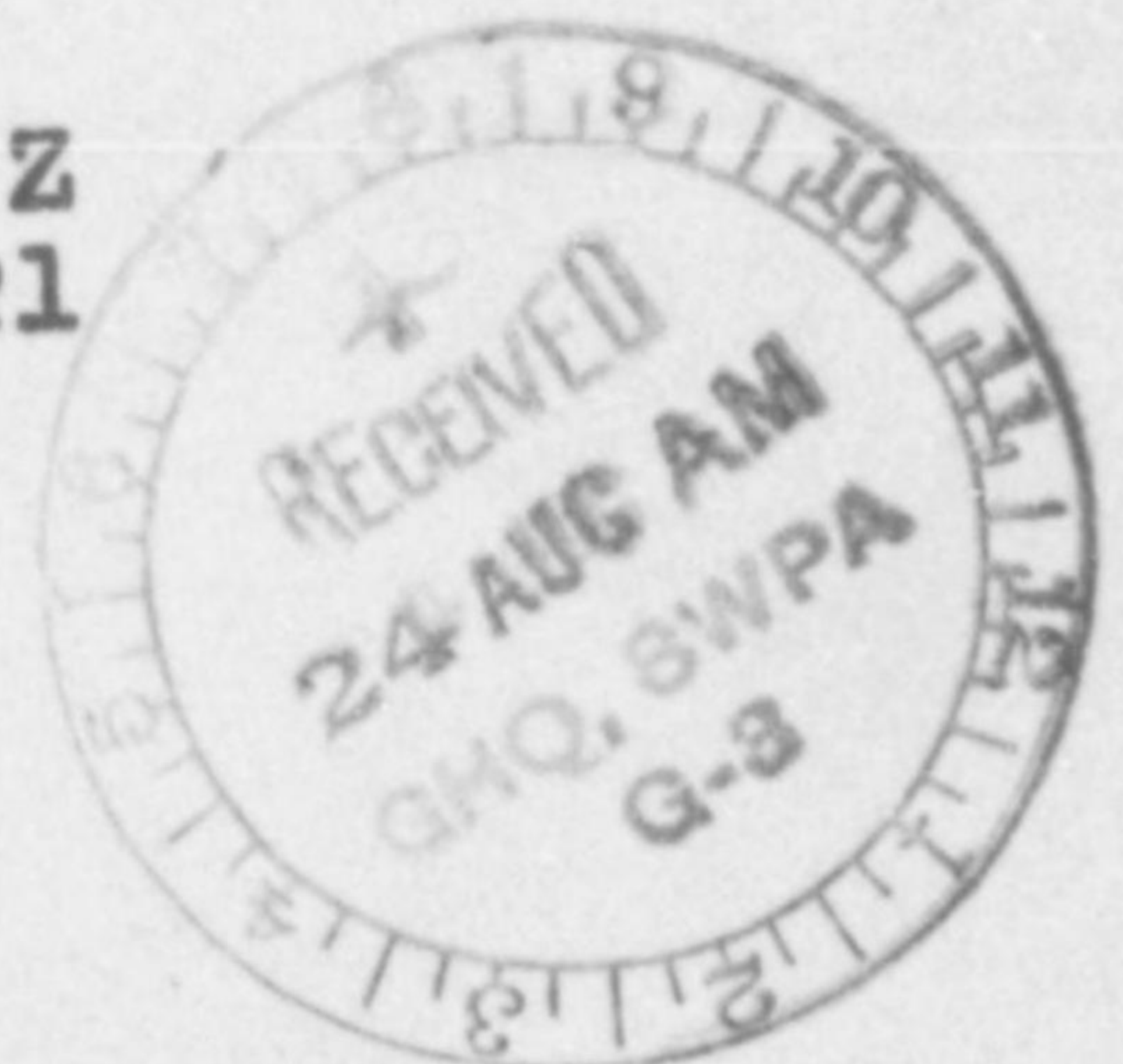

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Action is result of Confidential Peiping radio DOVE 7119, 19 August requesting that repatriate Ogata Torahiko who arrived Sasebo on 17 August be interrogated.
2. Peiping radio DOVE 7047, 17 Aug (Restricted) stated Hulutao had discovered that repatriates had been advised to conceal illness in order to speed return, Jap medical personnel cooperated in concealment. Possible cholera suspects aboard several ships. This radio requested interrogation of Japanese as to source of advice.
3. SCAP radio CX 64265, 18 Aug (Restricted) to 8th Army requested interrogation of Japanese on suspect ships with information furnished earliest.
4. Information contained in action radio passed to 8th Army by telephone 20 August.
5. No concurrence deemed necessary.
6. USAFIK is not concerned.
7. This completes action on DOVE 7119 but not on this subject.

1. Action originates in G-3 Repatriation.
2. Latest information available on expected repatriation, numbers, rate of flow, areas concerned, expected date of completion of present repatriation program from Manchuria is necessary. Manchurian political situation changes rapidly and radically effects repatriation. No new information has been received on the cholera situation on Manchuria.

1. Action Hq Peiping Comd radio DCVE 7047 wherein we are informed that Japanese are concealing medical symptoms in order to be repatriated promptly to Japan. Indicates cholera suspects are aboard the following ships: VHO04, VO57, VO44, VO69, Q034, Q001, Transper 20, Eitoku Maru; requests repats aboard these vessels be interrogated as to source that advised against reporting illness to American authorities.
2. PH and Welfare has been informed.
3. All ships from Hulutao, a cholera suspect port, are routed to one of 3 ports, Hakata, Sasebo, Uraga, equipped to inspect all repatriates clinically. Ships from Hulutao are not unloaded until all repats are cleared. Procedure is prescribed in Annex 5, SCAPIN 927.
4. Since SCAJAP does not work Sunday, ports of debarkation cannot be checked hence radio is sent info to CG 24th Div (for Hakata and Sasebo) and CG 1st Cav Div (for Uraga).
5. This action is for purpose of obtaining information requested by China.
6. Concurrence: PH & W (Maj Bradley, Sunday Duty Officer).
7. Recommend dispatch of attached radio.
8. Action does not concern Korea.

Investigation upon unusual death of Jap Repatriate at Hulutao revealed that groups of Japanese Repatriates arriving at Hulutao had been informed in advance that in the event that they wished to proceed to Japan without delay that the Americans should not be advised of any illness. Preliminary investigations have not as yet revealed source that so advised but evidence indicates that some Japanese Medical Personnel have cooperated with the advisors. Investigation is underway to determine identity of personnel involved. Possible that cholera suspects may not have been eliminated and may be aboard Hospital Ship John C Ainsworth VH 004, and Repats V 057, V 044, V 069, Q 034, Q 001, transport 20 and Eitoku due Sasebo 17 August. Request that Japanese be interrogated as to source that advised against reporting illness to the Americans.

Due to inexperienced personnel at Hulutao, Hospital Ship John C Ainsworth VH 004 was inadvertently misused to repatriate persons other than patients as well as small number of hospital patients. Corrective action has been taken to avoid repetition in future.

Reurad ZX 13316 prompt service in shipment by air of needed vaccines is very much appreciated as well as the prompt water shipment of the hospital equipment.

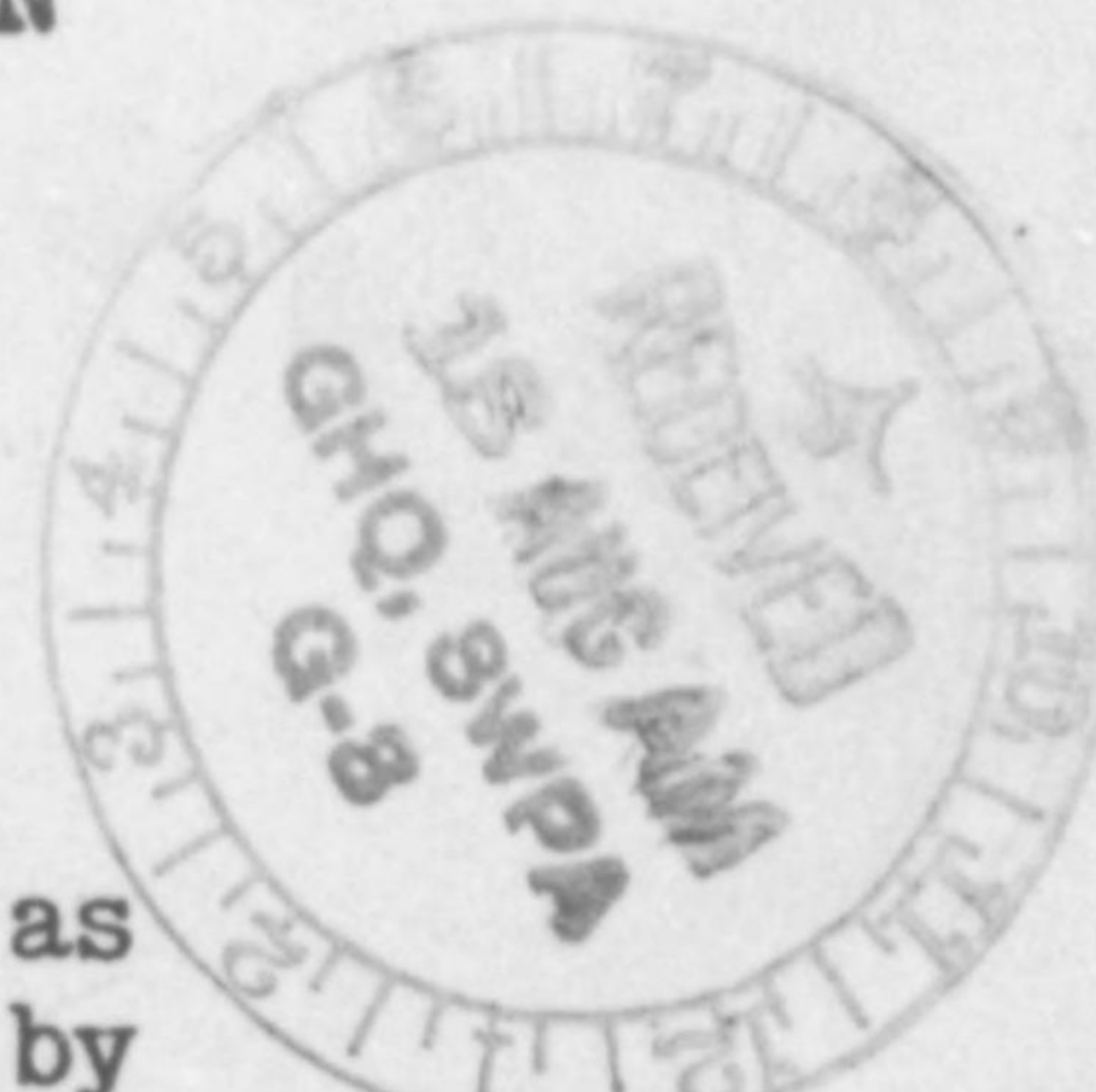

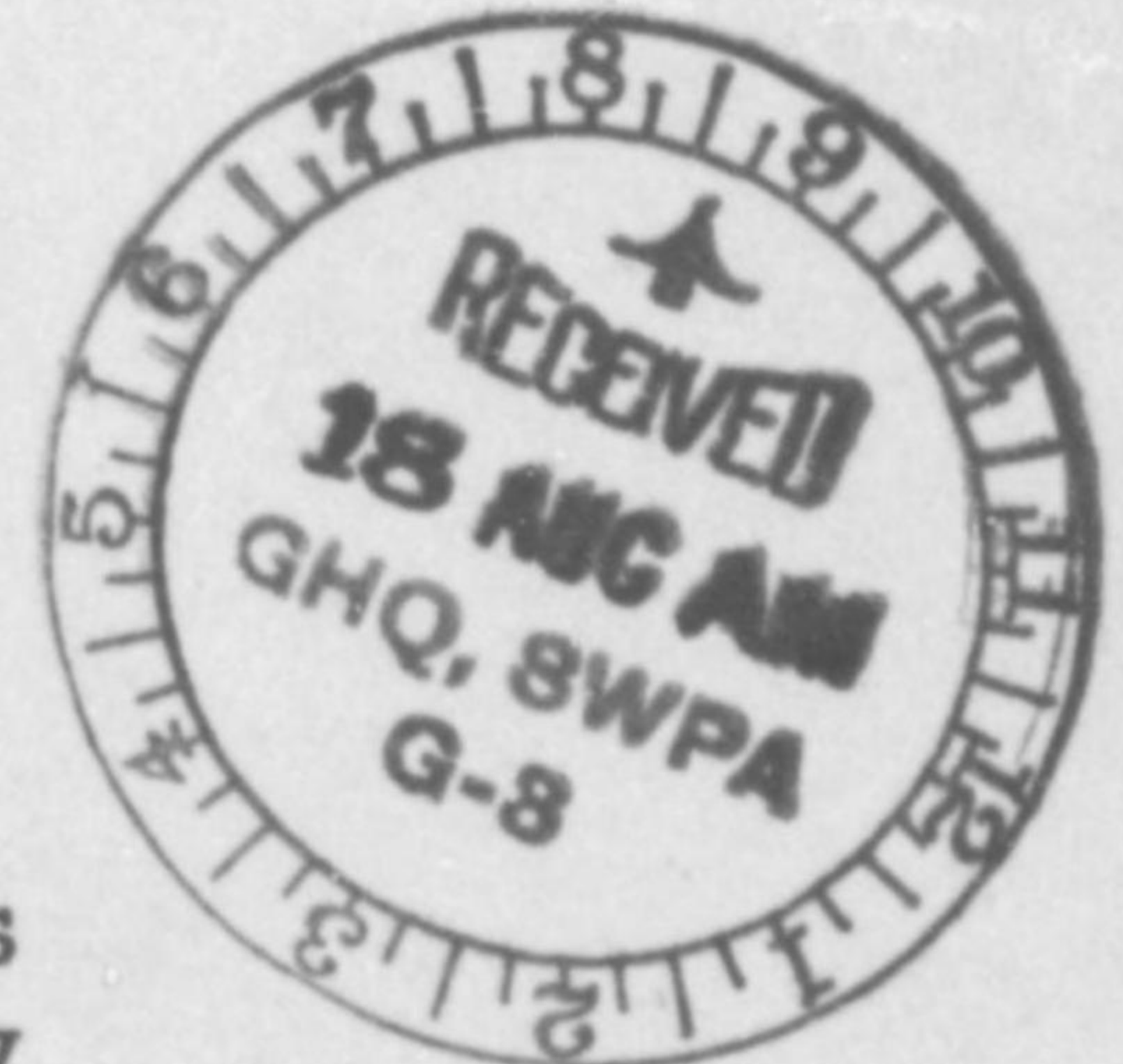

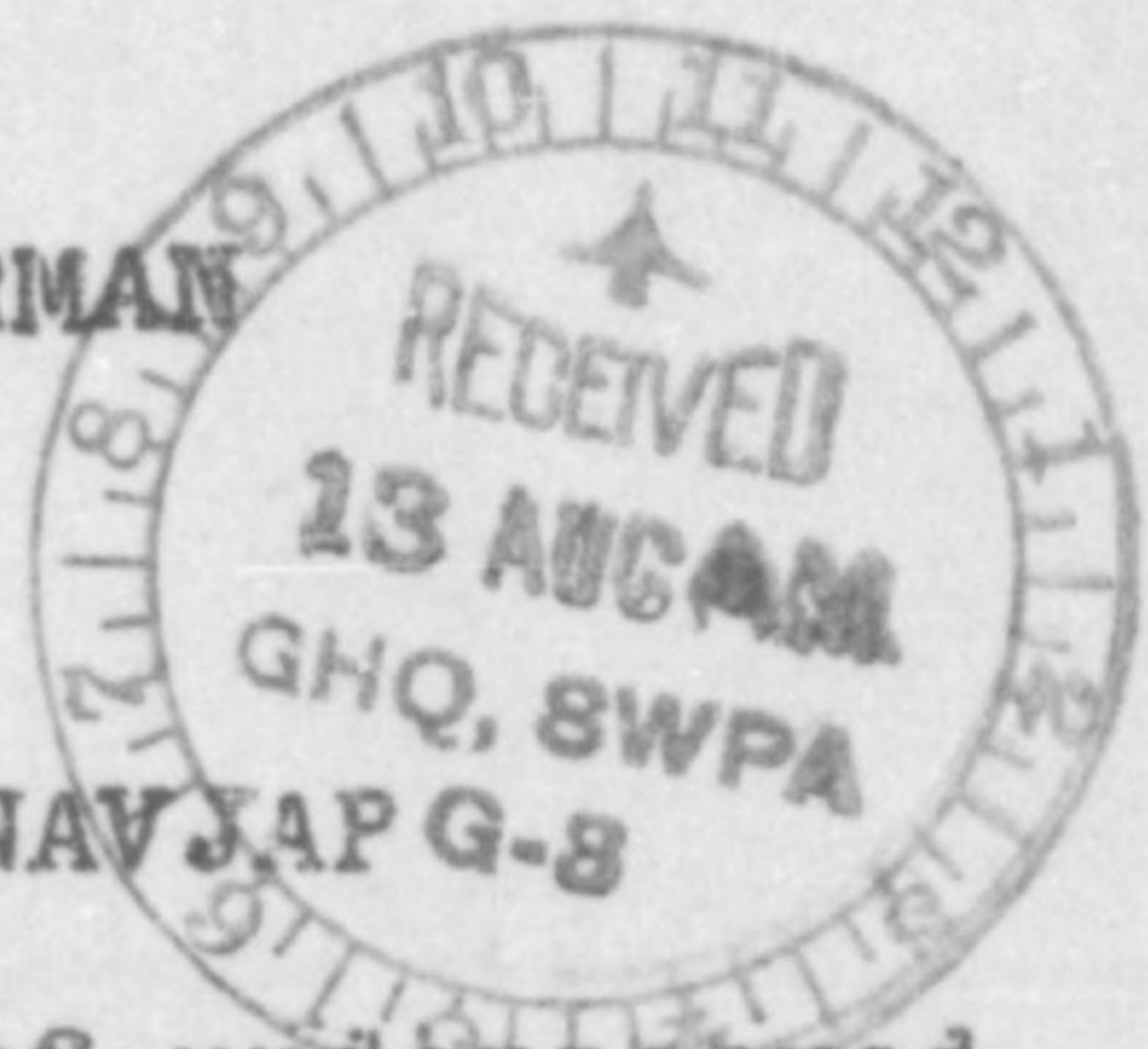

Shipment of repatriates from Harbin area is expected to begin in near future. It is deemed advisable to give inoculations prior to shipment to Hulutao. Request the following quantities of serum be shipped by air to Peiping China: 750,000 CC cholera vaccine, 640,000 CC typhus vaccine, 750,000 CC plague vaccine, 250,000 CC triple typhoid vaccine. Request first available water shipment to Hulutao of 50,000 pounds DDT.

Request that following experimental serum for use of Japanese medical personnel be shipped to Hulutao: ten CC of original, changed and middle form cholera laboratory experimental serum. Five CC each of type JA, A, B, C and Gaetner, Serman IA laboratory experimental serum. Five CC each shig, strong, yoe, etc dysentery serum. Five CC black plague serum.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Action is result of C/N from G-2, 9 August, transmitting a petition for early repatriation of Japanese from Manchuria and Russian-held areas.
2. In view of fact that the C-in-C has charged the Diplomatic Section with conduction negotiations with the Soviets for repatriation from Soviet controlled areas, and the fact that speeding up repatriation from Manchuria depends on opening Russian-held ports, using Russian controlled railways, or internal movement of repatriates by the Chinese Government, the petition is of primary importance to the Diplomatic Section.
3. It should be noted that the petition is addressed to the Chairman for the Allied Council. This is one among many similar petitions received in the past.
4. The Diplomatic Section has received a copy of the petition according to G-2 Check Note, it is recommended that no further action be taken.
5. No concurrences deemed necessary.
6. USAFIK is not concerned.
7. This completes action on this subject.

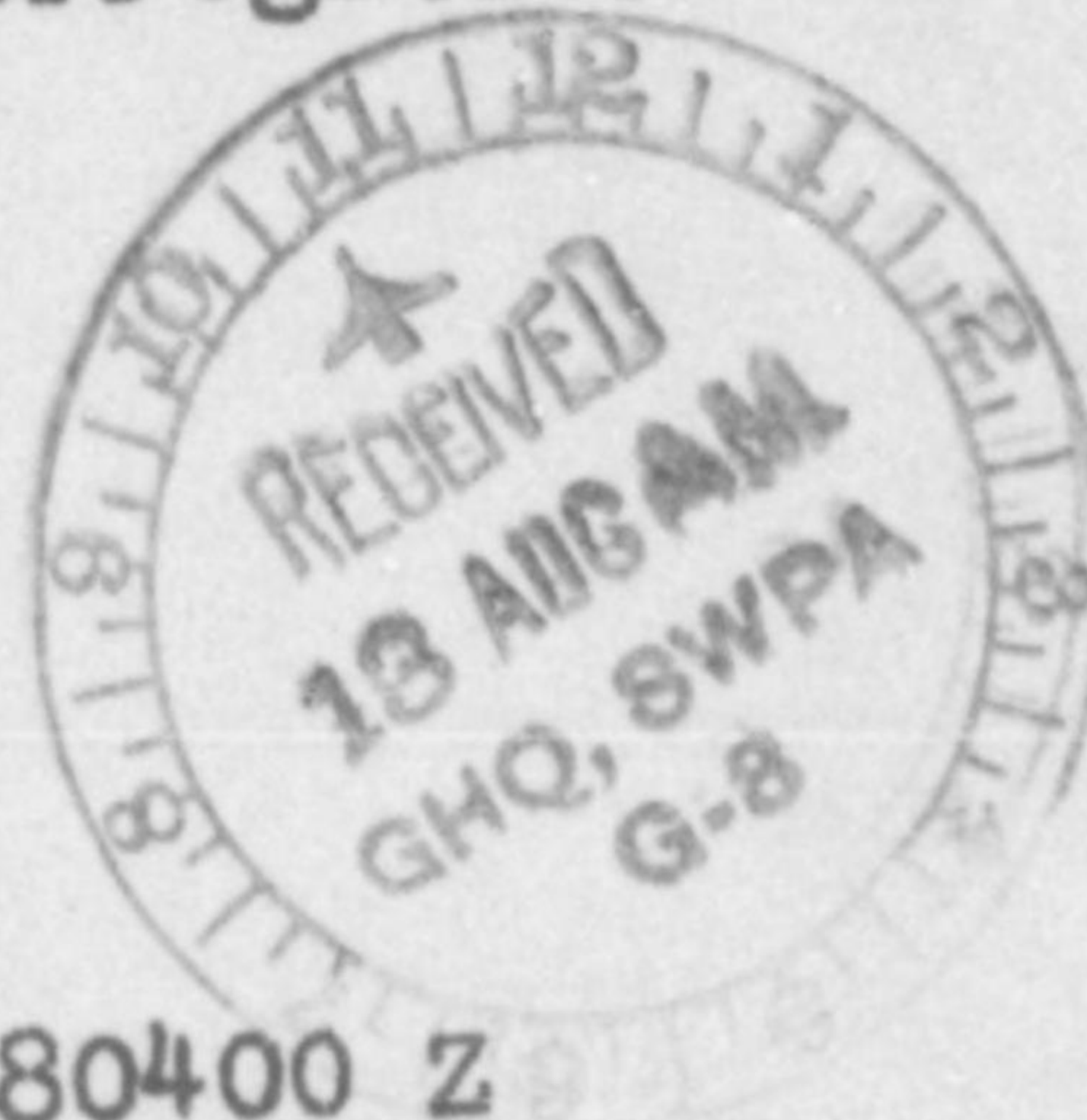

On 18th July expect change in the method of handling repatriates renders Hulutao useless as such place of interrogation. Repats do not remain overnight in Hulutao, they unload dock area and embark same day. In view of repat team procuring English speaking Japanese the services of Army interpreters is not required. It is suggested that in order to facilitate its proper functioning, authorization be given the interrogating team to operate in Chinchow where repatriates are interned for 6 day quarantine and in Mukden where the Japanese Liaison Office is located, this Office has the function of contacting all Japanese in Manchuria and coordinating repatriation to Chinchow. The above suggestion has the approval of the CO Hulutao Repat Team and from Japanese interpreters are sufficient for interrogation mission.

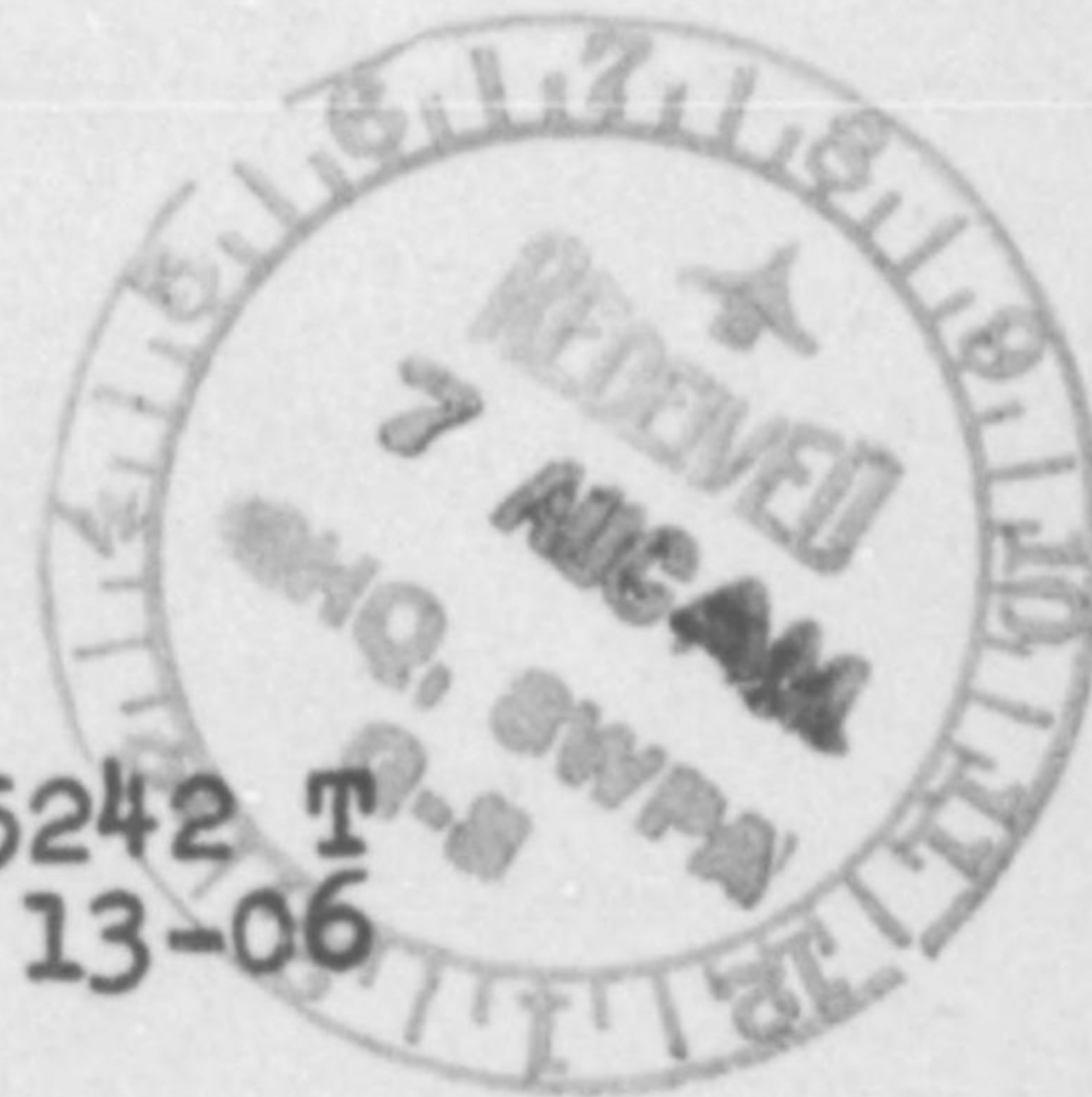

1. The attached staff study and allied papers have been redrafted incorporating recommendations in your Note No. 2.

2. The ports of Sasebo and Hakata will be set up to medically process 10,000 cholera suspects per day by 10 August. It is recommended that in view of the fact that the port of Hakata is physically located near the center of a large city, that known cholera ships be remanded to the port of Sasebo until that port has reached its capacity.

1. G-3 concurs in principle with the recommended action.
2. The following changes are recommended:

a. That the draft radio to CG Peiping Grp attached as Tab D be dispatched in lieu of proposed radio Tab B. Tab B is incorrectly addressed inasmuch as CG Peiping Grp is responsible for repatriation matters in China and Manchuria. CG Hulutao is made info addressee to keep him conversant with action being taken.

b. That the measures being taken by PH & W to set up the port of Hakata as a processing port for ships from cholera or cholera-suspect ports include preparation of facilities at Hakata and Sasebo adequate to process a combined total of 10,000 cholera suspects per day.

c. That the instructions to the Imperial Japanese Government include necessary directives for establishing Hakata as an inspection port as mentioned above, and Memorandum Containing Information of General Application contain plan for use of Hakata as processing port for ships from Hulutao.

d. That in the Memorandum Containing Information of General Application reference to Korea in paragraph 3 d be deleted and a similar reference to Manchuria be inserted.

e. That the effective date of Hulutao being declared a cholera or cholera-suspect port be set at 10 August 1946. This will permit shipment of disease-free repatriates now in protective quarantine at Hulutao and allow sufficient time to set up Hakata as a cholera quarantine port.

I. THE PROBLEM PRESENTED.

To prevent the further introduction of Asiatic cholera into Japan

II. FACTS BEARING ON THE PROBLEM.

1. Repatriates are being brought to Japan from Manchuria through the port of Hulutao.

2. Three repatriation vessels from Hulutao (Q-023, Q-044 and VH-004) have brought cholera into Japan during the period 12 June to 22 July.

3. Radio from Peiping to SCAP dated 27 July 1946 cite DUNE 6016 reports that cholera has broken out in additional concentration areas in Manchuria and appears to be spreading. (Tab A)

4. Recommendations from G-3 that notification to CG Peiping Group (Tab B) designate 10 August as the date of declaring Hulutao a cholera port to allow for readjustment in shipping schedules.

III. CONCLUSIONS.

1. That cholera is present in Manchuria in epidemic proportions.

2. That there is immediate danger of introducing more cholera into Japan from Manchuria.

3. That further measures must be adopted to prevent the introduction of cholera into Japan from Manchuria.

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS.

1. That the port of Hulutao be declared a cholera port or a cholera suspect port and that the attached radio to the CG Peiping Group be dispatched. (Tab B)

2. That the attached Memorandum to the Imperial Japanese Government be signed and dispatched. (Tab C)

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Action is result of C/N from PH & W dated 29 July 1946, subject: "Staff Study, Control of Cholera."
2. Cholera was brought to Japan from Hulutao on 3 repat ships during period 12 June to 22 July (QO23, QO44, and VH 004). This was the first indication of cholera among repatriates from Manchuria. The following radios refer: Port Quarantine 12 NPT of 12 July; BCOF GO 7401, 14 July; Hakata Rept 241400 I.
3. Our ZX 08410, 15 July, called China's attention to cholera from Hulutao and reiterated request for careful screening in Hulutao in compliance with ourad ZX 33034, 25 April (which set up quarantine restrictions for all China and Manchurian ports). CG Peiping in turn, in DOVE 5697, 20 July, to Nanking gave instruction to subordinate headquarters and Chinese Dept of National Defense.
4. Peiping radio DOVE 6016, 27 July indicated further cholera outbreaks in Manchuria. Requested further shipping for Hulutao be cancelled; shipping for 11,000 repats now in quarantine who will be ready by 7 August for shipment; and disposition of other shipping excess to Hulutao needs. It also states China promises rigid enforcement of quarantine restrictions.
5. Our radio ZX 1057g, 28 July replied to above radio, stopped shipping as requested, and told China that shipping at Hulutao would remain at Hulutao pending outcome of survey for cholera-free areas from which to draw repats.
6. Applying proposed restriction will require following changes in present repat plan:
 - a. Shuttles out of Hulutao will have terminal points in Japan of Uraga, Sasebo or Hakata. This will affect 14 LST's on the Hulutao - Senzaki shuttle and 18,880 Jap spaces on Kure- Hulutao shuttle.
 - b. Number of trips per month will be reduced to comply with restriction of a minimum of 6 days from departure Hulutao to debarkation. This will require assignment of additional shipping to maintain the 10,000/day rate.
7. In order to complete repatriation of groups already at Hulutao and to permit setting up Hakata to process cholera suspect repats, believe effective date of restrictions should be set at 10 August.
8. Recommend approval of C/N.
9. No concurrence deemed necessary.
10. CG USAFIK's interests have been considered.
11. This completes action on this subject.

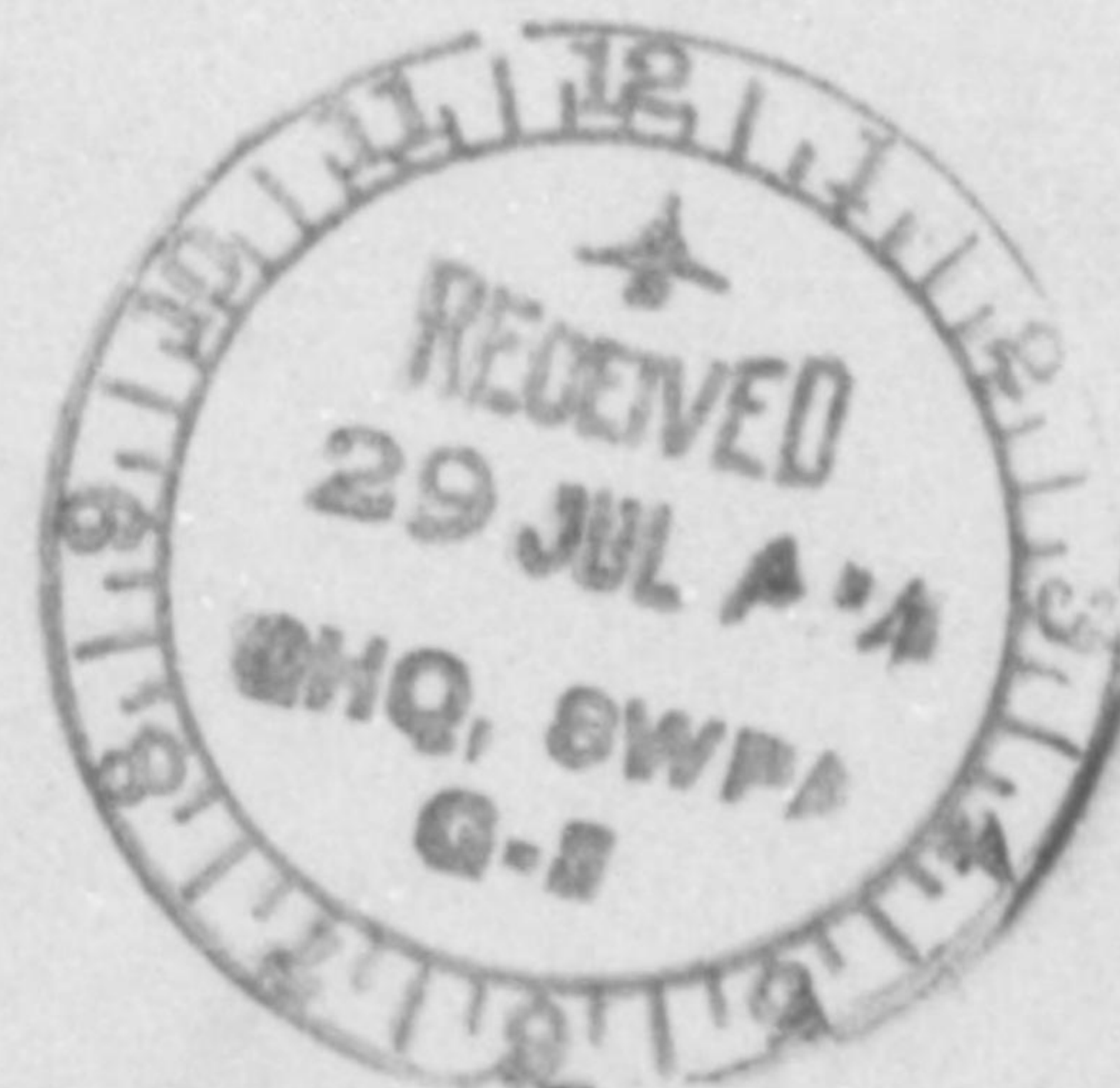

Cholera has broken out in additional concentration areas in Manchuria and appears to be spreading. Additional US Army Medical personnel are enroute to Hulutao. A survey is being made of all Japanese concentration areas in Manchuria to determine which areas are disease-free and to make readjustment in the order of evacuation of repatriates to the processing stations in the vicinity of Hulutao.

There are approximately 5000 repatriates in quarantine at Chinese Processing Station (near Hulutao) who will have completed their quarantine and will be ready for shipment on 26 July. There are approximately 6000 repatriates in quarantine in Hulutao who will complete their quarantine on 7 August if no new cases develop. Request that all shipping scheduled for Hulutao be cancelled immediately until further notice. Request disposition you desire made of shipping now present in Hulutao in excess of that required to accommodate repatriation of 11,000 mentioned above.

New subject: Reourad DOVE 5697 of 20 July. Chinese Ministry of National Defense has promised rigid enforcement of quarantine restrictions listed in urad ZX 33034 China Theater radio CFBX 29590 refers.

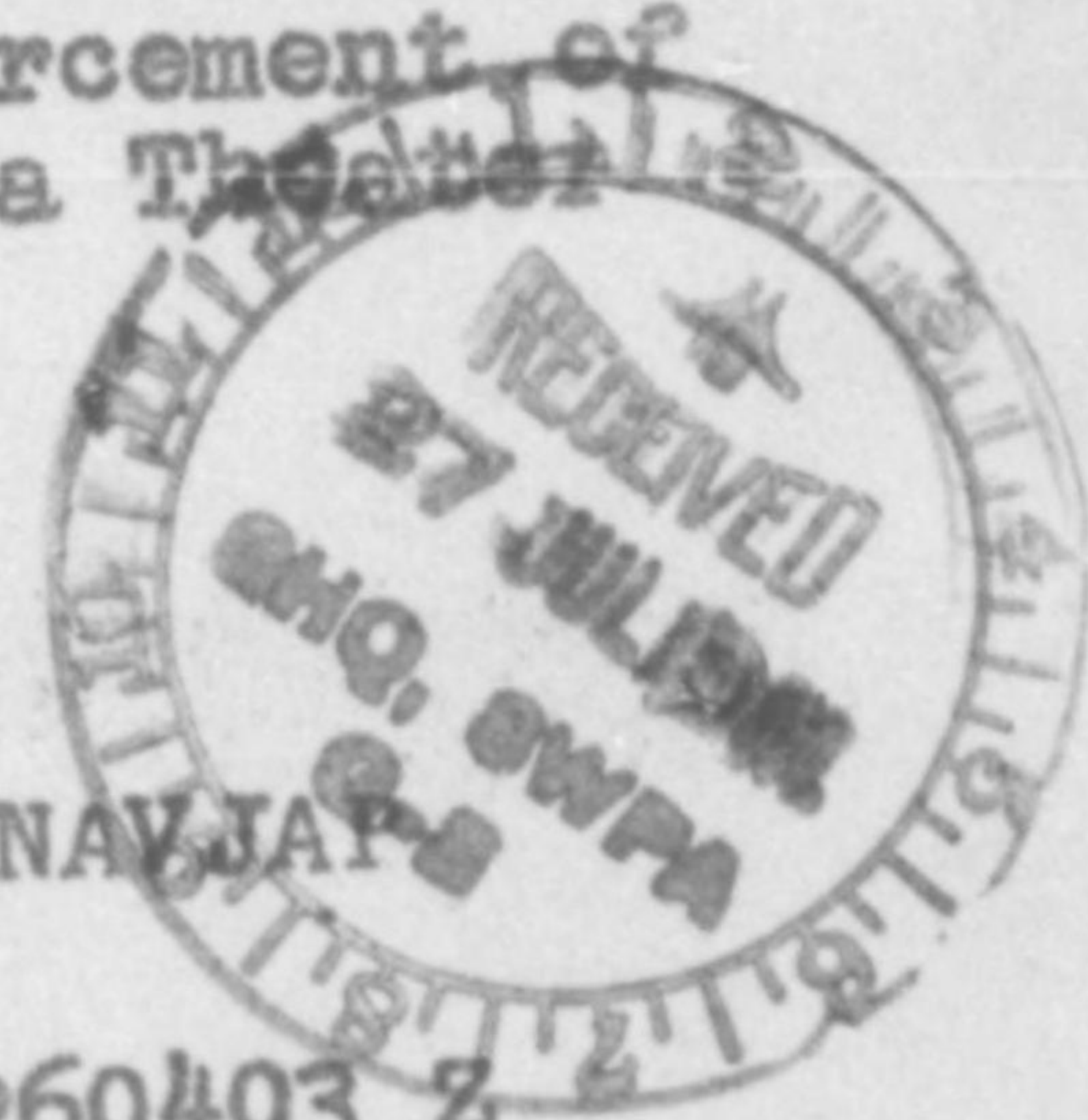

SUBJECT: Hulutao Cholera.

1. Action is PEIPING radio DOVE 6016 of 26 July, to G-3 for action, which informs of cholera in Manchurian repat concentration areas:

a. Requests cancellation of all scheduled Hulutao shipping (except for lift for 11,000 repats).

b. Requests desired disposition of excess shipping now at Hulutao.

2. Shipping has been operating for about 10,000 daily lift from Hulutao. Adequate shipping to lift the 11,000 requested in para 2 action radio is presently available at Hulutao. The 11,000 should be lifted as scheduled, if no new cholera cases develop, as it is apparent from the text of action radio that the quarantine provisions of ourad ZX 33034, 25 April, are being complied with.

3. Shipping in excess of 11,000 lift should remain at Hulutao pending completion of survey, para 1 action radio, readjustment resulting therefrom.

4. Dispatch of shipping to Hulutao should be suspended as requested and shipping enroute Hulutao recalled (where practicable) pending readjustment shipping schedules.

5. SCAJAP is implementing the provisions of para 3 and 4 above by separate action (SCAJAP, Capt Weiss).

6. Last para, action radio (para 1) assures rigid enforcement quarantine for cholera and requires no further action. Ourad ZX 08410, of 15 July, requested strict cholera procedures at Hulutao, conforming with ourad ZX 33034, of 25 April. PEIPING radio DOVE 5697, 20 July, requested Nanking to pass cholera instructions to Chinese Dept of National Defense.

7. Recommend approval of attached radio to PEIPING.

8. Concurrence: SCAJAP (Capt Weiss).
PH & W *(Weaver)*.

9. Korea is not affected by this action.

10. This completes present G-3 action on radio, para 1 above, but not on this subject.

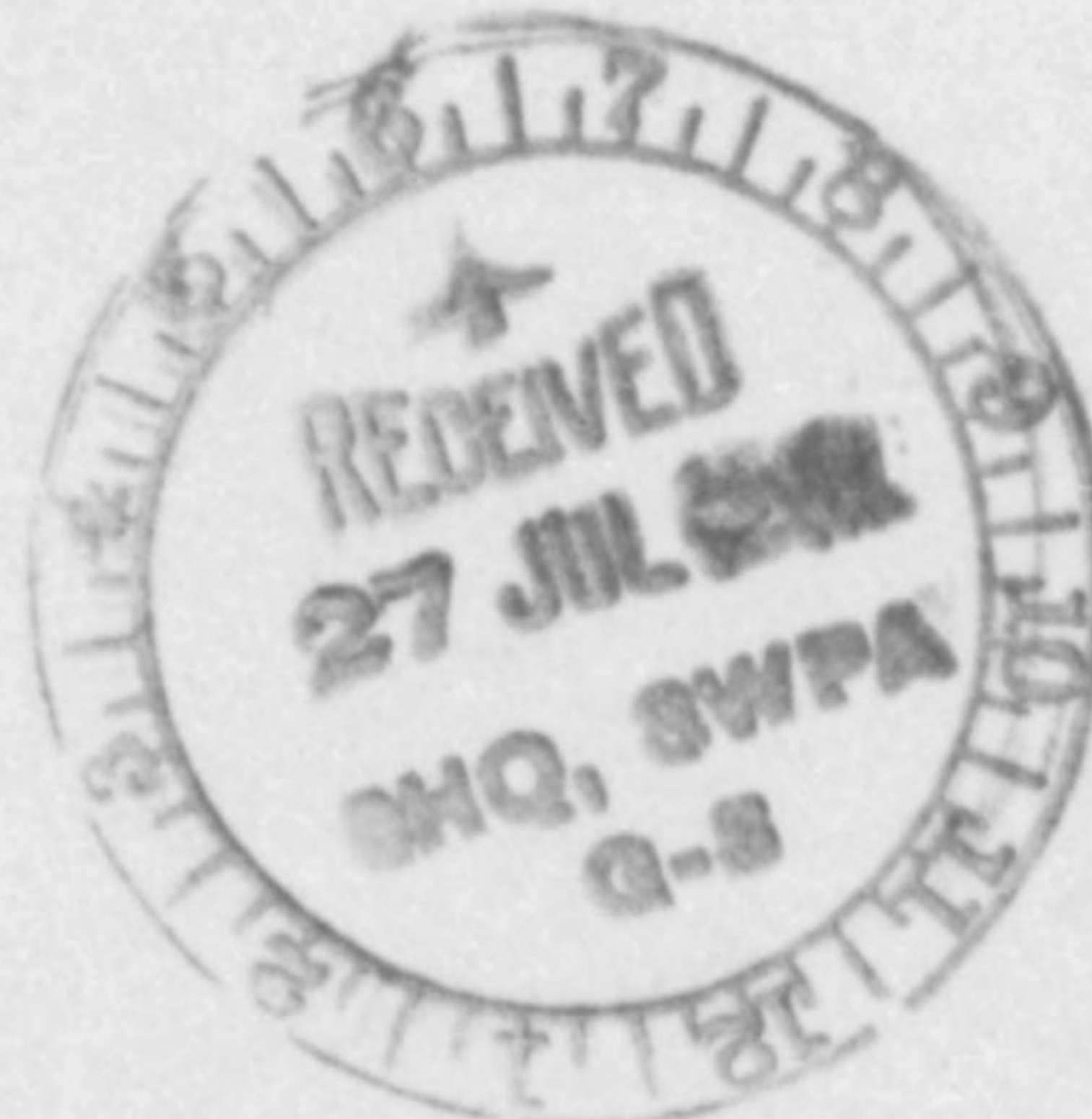

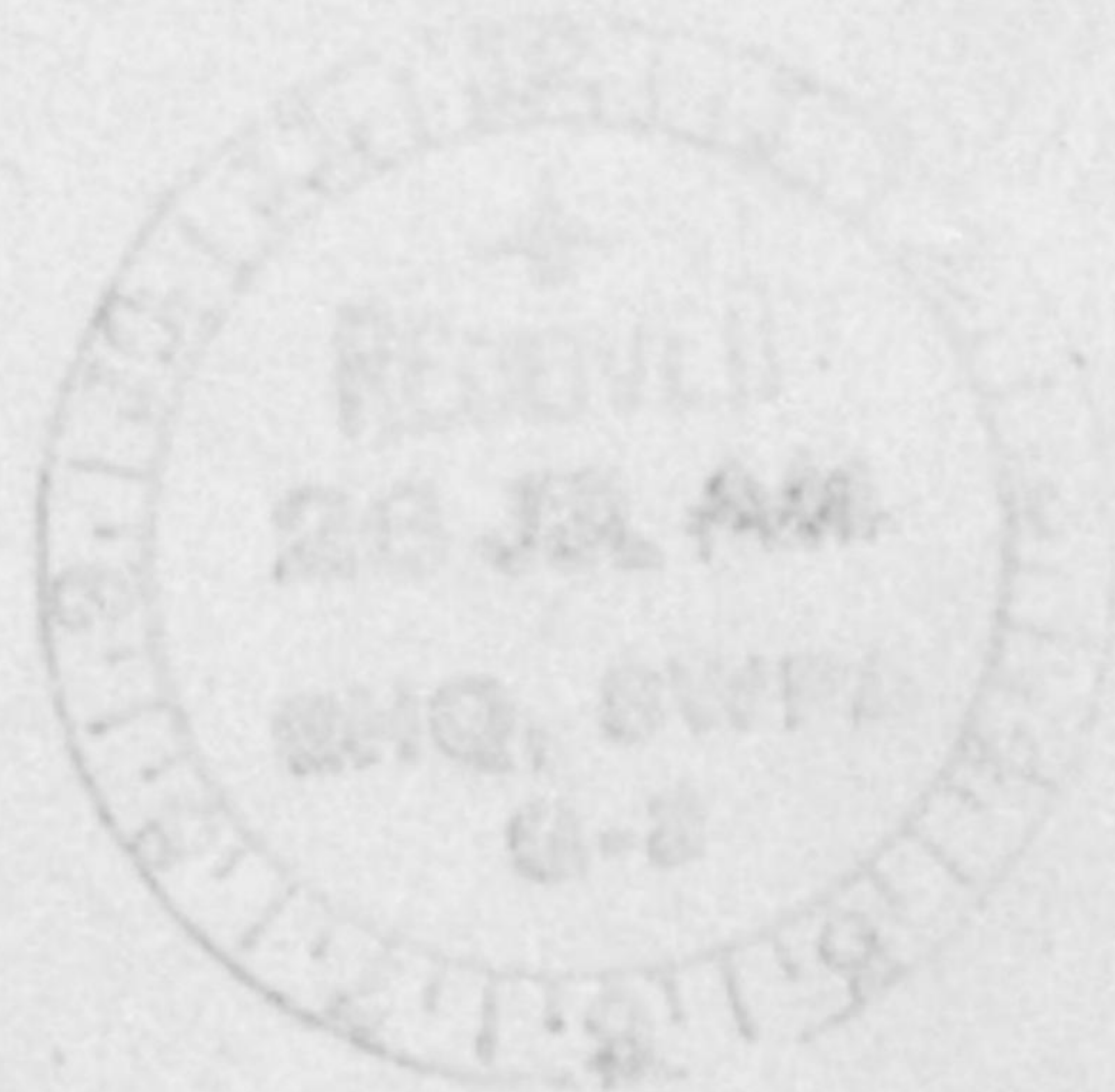

MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHIEF OF STAFF:

SUBJECT: Brief of SWNCC Decision Amending SWNCC 258/5, subject: "Repatriation of Civilian Japanese from China."

1. Plans and Operations Division, WDGS, in a memorandum dated 8 July 1946, subject: "Repatriation of Civilian Japanese from China," forwarded SWNCC 258/5 as amended by SWNCC 258/6 and SWNCC 258/7 to CINCPAC for information. The forwarded paper was approved by the State, War and Navy Departments on 25 June 1946. SWNCC recommended that a copy be sent to the U.S. member of the Far Eastern Commission.

2. The State-War-Navy Coordinating Subcommittee for the Far East considered the following:

a. The U.S. policy toward China is, in part, the maintenance of peace in the Pacific. It is felt that many Japanese civilians, if permitted to remain in China, would secretly strive for a resurgence of Japanese power and influence on the Asiatic continent. Peace in the Pacific then may be jeopardized if Japanese influence in China is not wholly removed.

b. A serious problem in replacing many highly trained Japanese formerly employed in China, Manchuria and Formosa, faces Chinese authorities. In China Proper the problem is relatively small. In Formosa it is extensive since the industry and agriculture were developed principally under Japanese supervision. Formosan Chinese were never permitted to acquire the higher administrative and technical skills. To overcome this situation 5,600 technicians and 22,400 dependents are authorized to be retained in Formosa temporarily. The situation in Manchuria appears to be somewhat between that in China Proper and in Formosa.

3. It was concluded that:

a. The U.S. favors the repatriation of all Japanese from China and is prepared to continue to assist the Chinese Government in attaining this end.

b. The U.S. Government should urge upon the Chinese Government the desirability of repatriating at once, Japanese civilians now residents in China except those indispensable to China's recovery. Those permitted to remain should not represent any threat to the peace or entering wedge for the resurgence of Japanese influence on the Asiatic continent.

c. No change is desired in current directives.

4. a. SWNCC 258/5 as amended has been transmitted to the Commanding General, Nanking Headquarters Command for information.

CONFIDENTIAL

b. The Department of State has been requested to transmit a note to the Chinese Government emphasizing

- (1) The danger of keeping Japanese in China.
- (2) That every effort should be made to repatriate the maximum number of Japanese while U.S. shipping and personnel are available.
- (3) The points stated in paragraphs 3 a and b above.

5. SCAP policies as now in effect on this subject are in accord with provisions of SWNCC 258/5, as amended.

Following letter from Ambassador Apollon A. Petrov dated 4 July has now been received and forwarded for information: "My dear General, in connection with your letter of April 27th, I deem it necessary to inform you of the following proposals of the Soviet Military authorities concerning repatriation of the Japanese from Manchuria. The Soviet Military authorities propose that repatriation of the Japanese from the Port of Dairen and the area of Port-Arthur Naval Base should be carried out through Dairen, the order of repatriation being similar to that, proposed by the Soviet Representatives in Tokyo in regard to repatriation of the Japanese from Northern Korea.

If this order is accepted, the Soviet Military authorities will assume the responsibility for delivering the repatriees to the Port of Dairen, sanitary service and their embarkment whereas General MacArthur's Headquarters will be responsible for their transportation by the ships at their disposal from Dairen to Japan.

Details of repatriation through Dairen could be agreed upon in Tokyo.

As far as the Japanese outside the Naval Base and Dairen are concerned, the Soviet Military authorities are of the opinion that for their repatriation it is advisable to use other near-by ports of Manchuria.

4. It will be noted that a daily lift of 10,100 per day has been set up for Dairen. This will be a reserve to accommodate an increased rate of evacuation should China be in a position to deliver that additional number to either Dairen or Hulutao; or to be used in the evacuation of the Kurile Islands and Sakhalin should they be opened to repatriation. This reserve is necessary because of the uncertainty as to repatriation requirements of China and the Soviets.

5. Requirements for shipping to be assigned to lift repatriates from Philippines, Ryukyus, and Marianas are for planning purposes only. They are based on assumption that POWs will be cleared by 1 October in shuttle to be established by 1 July. Policy will have to be approved by C/S before it is implemented.

6. It is requested that, considering the above, recommendations for the release of shipping excess to the requirements of the repatriation program, as outlined above, be furnished. Recommendation should include priority by type for release, and the number of each type to be released by date.

1. Reference your radio CX 61204. In our radios CFBX 00887 dated 11 May and CFBX 01337 dated 17 May it was requested that sufficient shipping be allocated to Hulutao to increase the daily lift from 5000 to 10000 per day effective 1 June. However due to difficulty in maintaining a steady flow of Japanese into Hulutao, it was necessary to send radio CFBX 01822 dated 22 May, cancelling our previous requests to increase the Hulutao shipping allocation from 5,000 to 10,000 per day effective 1 June as mentioned in the 2 radios listed above.

2. It is expected that a daily lift of 5,000 per day from Hulutao will be maintained throughout the balance of May and June. It is further expected that the staging areas now in construction in vicinity Hulutao will be completed during the month of June so as to accommodate a backlog that will maintain a lift of 10,000 daily, effective on or about 1 July. The situation in Manchuria as a whole is very obscure. The best available estimate indicates that there are a total of 1,300,000 Japanese in Manchuria of which approximately 400,000 are concentrated in the Mukden-Hulutao area. It is believed that 265,000 Japanese are concentrated in the immediate vicinity of Darien, 64,000 along the railroad between Darien and Mukden, and an additional 80,000 in the vicinity of Antung. The remainder of the Japanese estimated to be in Manchuria (approximately 500,000) are scattered throughout the north and eastern parts in areas under communist control.

3. The exact number of Japanese to be repatriated via either Hulutao and or Darien cannot definitely be determined because of unstable conditions in Manchuria. It will be necessary to constantly revise our repatriation plans in accordance with the political situation. This headquarters will keep you informed of the changing situation as far in advance as it is possible in order that shipping space will not be wasted.

4. Negotiations for use of Darien as a Port for repatriation are being taken up on a higher level. No definite information available at this time.

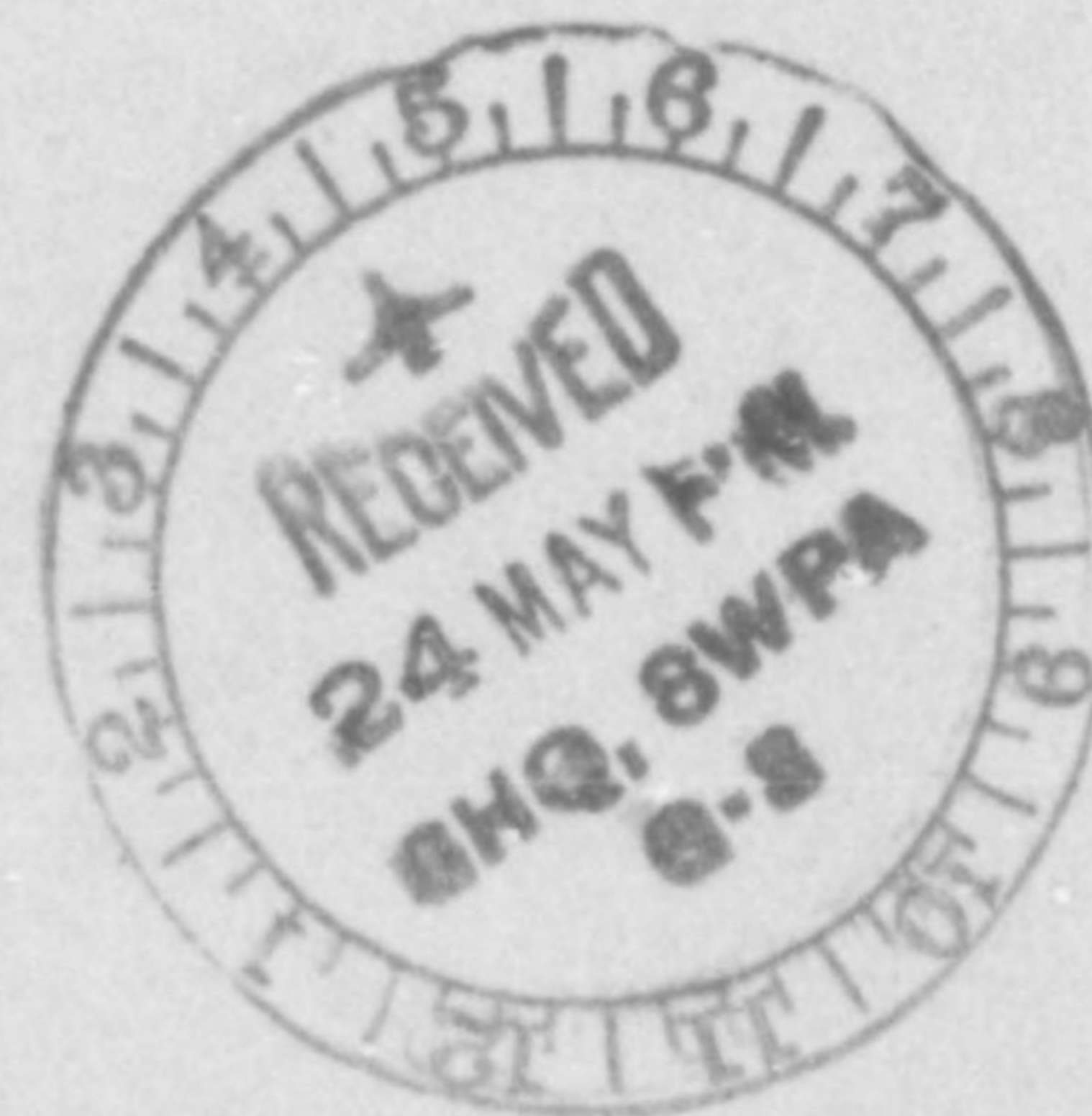

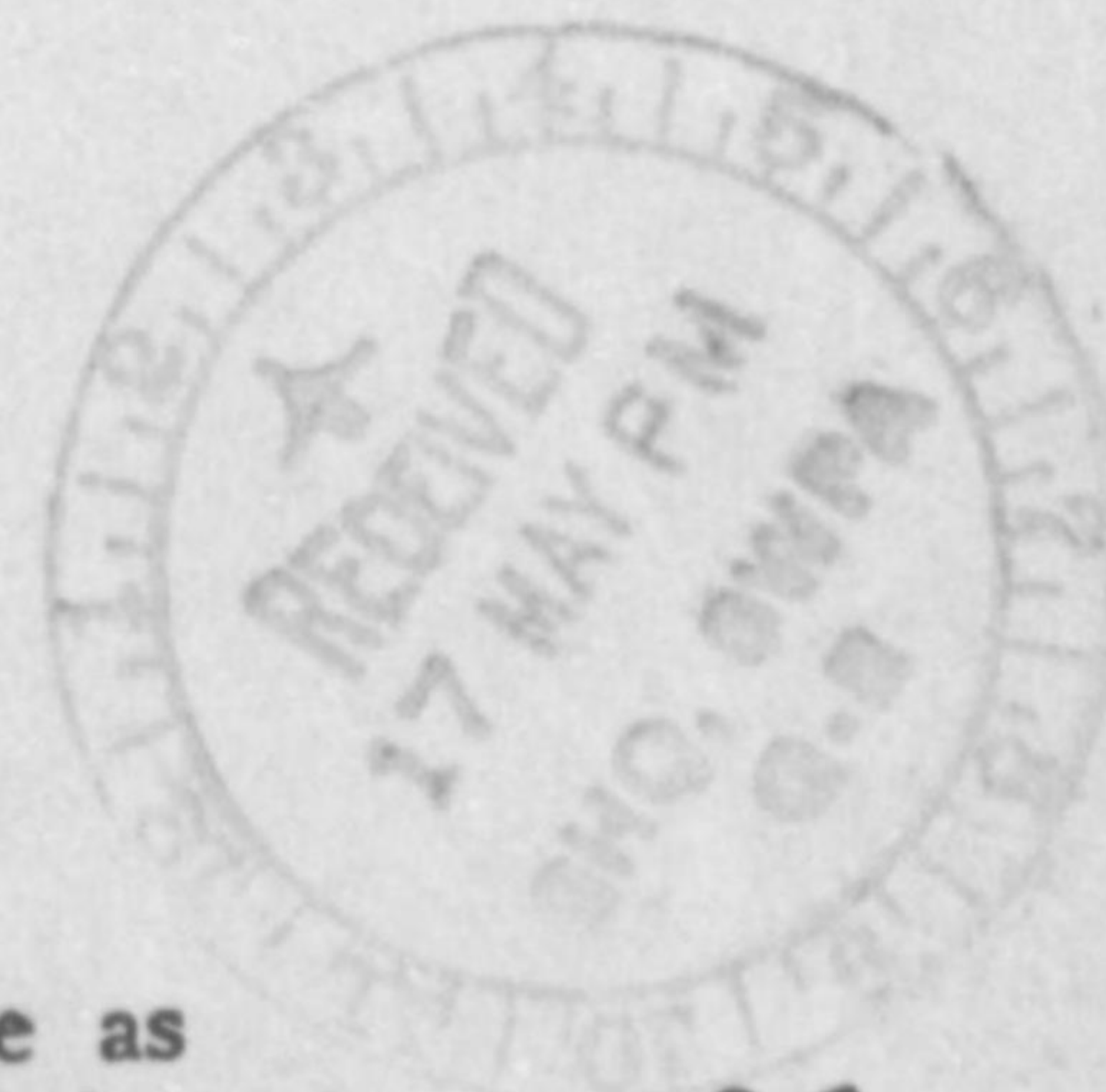
