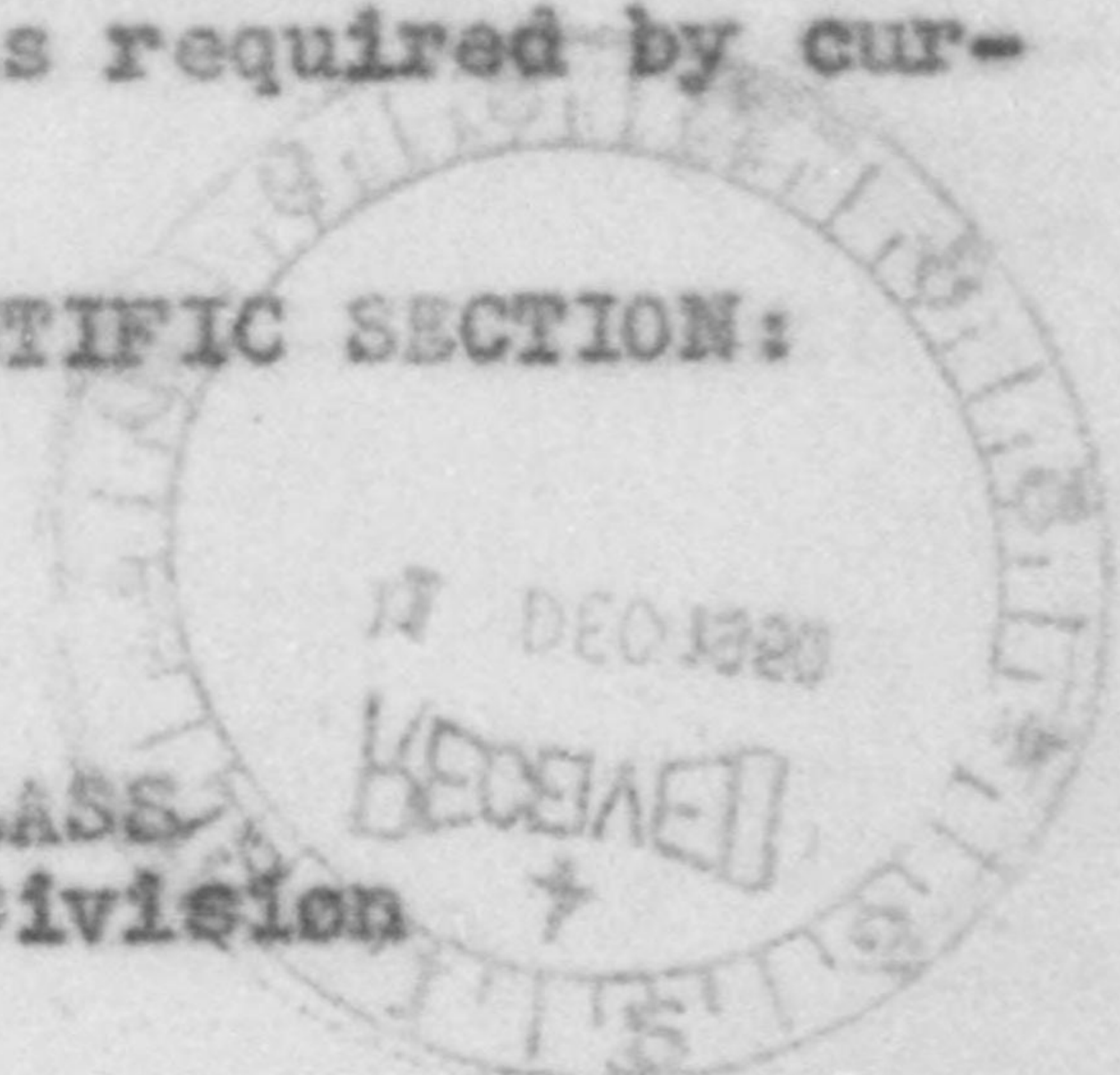

This guaranty shall then continue as to refurbished or replacing articles or parts thereof until one year after date of delivery. If the Government does not require replacement or refurbishing of a defective or nonconforming article, the contractor, if required by the Contracting Officer within a reasonable time after the notice of defect or nonconformance, shall repay such portion of the contract price of the article as is equitable in the circumstances.

4. EXPORT TAX CLAUSE:

Any export tax, fee or other charges of whatsoever nature now existing or which may hereafter be imposed shall be for Contractor's account.

5. INSPECTION:

Within 20 days from the effective date of this contract, the Government shall appoint an inspector to inspect at Contractor's expense, the mer-

merchandise prior to delivery. The rate to be charged by the appointed inspector for the commodities to be purchased under this bid will be _____ per centum of the total contract price less freight costs. Contractor shall cause Government's inspector to be advised that merchandise is ready for inspection at least 20 days prior to any requirement for delivery hereunder. Upon receipt of such advice, Government's inspector shall inspect the merchandise without delay, and will promptly and immediately issue a certificate of approval or disapproval of the merchandise, or any part thereof. Any such disapproval shall be based upon accepted trade practices, and shall be for reasonable causes stated in the certificate of disapproval.

In the event the inspector disapproves any merchandise, Contractor may tender additional quantities for inspection and approval in lieu of the merchandise disapproved, if such tender is made in due time to permit inspection and delivery in accordance with the terms of the contract.

In the event the Government fails to appoint an inspector as provided above, or in the event the Government's inspector fails to inspect the merchandise within 20 days after being advised that merchandise is ready for inspection, then in either of such events, Contractor shall inspect the merchandise at Contractor's expense, and issue the certificate as above provided.

If rejection is made at a point other than contractor's premises, contractor shall promptly, upon request, remove at his expense rejected articles or services, and shall be liable to the Government for any cost of removal, correction or replacement resulting from failure to do so as required.

6. PAINING AND PROTECTIVE COATING: (If the type of equipment furnished requires it).

Bright surfaces, and surfaces machined to insure precision fit, finished appearance, or smoothness, shall not be painted but shall be protected against corrosive action by a suitable protective coating. All other metal surfaces which are not normally painted shall be protected in the same manner. Protective coating materials shall be of types and formulae which will insure adequate protection to the surfaces in transit to the final destination. All other equipment parts shall receive one coat of high quality paint before assembly and a second coat after assembly. Parts not accessible for painting after final assembly shall receive two coats of paint prior to assembly. No painting shall be performed prior to inspection unless specifically approved.

7. PACKING:

All materials furnished under this contract shall be packed for export. Such packing must be sufficient to secure safe arrival at destination, fully covering such overseas shipping hazards as rough handling and possible corrosion due to exposure to salt atmosphere, salt spray, or open storage. The bidder is requested to indicate on separate sheet attached to this bid, a detailed description of the packing he proposes to use, in-

cluding such items as the type of outer and inner containers, barriers; corrosion resistance, etc. where applicable. These packing provisions, if approved, will form a part of the contract. Before any charges are incurred for packing requirements, they must be justified by the inspector and approved by the Contracting Officer. If approved an amendment to the contract will be issued.

8. IDENTIFICATION:

All parts, if shipped unattached or separately from the basic equipment, also all spare parts, must be identified legibly by tags, labels, or inscription in indelible ink, strictly in accordance with the reference marks or part numbers of the basic equipment or on the assembly drawings, if such are required to be furnished.

9. MARKINGS:

On wood, plywood, and veneer cases, barrels or kegs, all marks shall be applied by stencil with waterproof inks or oil paints, and these marks protected against weathering by clear water-resistant varnish. On metal or metal containers, marks shall be applied with waterproof oil paints. Characters shall be legible and not less than 1" high, unless restricted by size of package. Packages shall be marked on top and at least two sides. When metal tags are used, they must be rustproof. Tin or terne-coated tags and uncoated steel tags are not considered rustproof and must not be used. When paper tags are used, they must be free of rope stock with a minimum thickness of 0.020 inches. After marks have been applied to the tag, they shall be coated by clear varnish. All tags must be "double-eyelet" tags and fastened at each end.

Markings shall consist of the following information, in sequence listed, in frame commensurate with size of containers:

1. Office of Supply, Republic of Korea.
2. ECA
3. Port of Entry.
4. Contract Number, Item Number where practicable, Package Numbers in sequence, and quantity of each package.
5. Nonenclature in detail.
6. Purchase Request Number.
7. Net and Gross Weights, Cubic measurement.

Caution marks should be shown when applicable.

The shipping containers should be stamped, branded, stenciled or labeled as follows:

ECA	KOREA
(Procurement Authorization No.)	(Participating Country)
(Shipper's Marks)	

The Procurement Authorization number and name of the participating country (Korea) shall be in characters at least equal in height to the Shipper's marks. The package number is to be assigned by the Contractor to designate the number of package and total number of the packages comprising one lot of equipment, for example: 1/5, 2/5, 3/5, 4/5, 5/5, the upper figure designating the number assigned to a package and the lower figure the total number of packages in the lot.

All shipments, except unpackaged or bulk, under ECA program must bear the ECA emblem in accordance with the sample supplied. The lettering of the ECA emblem shall be at least twice the size of the lettering of the other marks. Emblem should be applied in the manner considered to give the best results, i.e., decalcomanias or flat hard surfaces, labels or tags, as appropriate, or stencils when the above cannot be applied satisfactorily. Stencils may be in black or white.

In addition to the foregoing markings, such other export marks as may be required shall be applied as provided by contract, or directed by the Contracting Officer at no additional cost to the Government.

10. SHIPPING:

The ocean transportation, shipping or shipping line which is to be utilized in transporting the commodities described in this contract must be approved in advance by the Government. Any change in shipping arrangements requires the approval of the Contracting Officer in writing, as an amendment to this contract.

11. PACKING LIST:

Contents of each shipping package shall be itemized on a detailed packing list showing exact weight, extreme outside dimensions (length, width, and height) of each piece or container. If all pieces or containers are uniform in size or weight, show the dimensions and weight of the one only. One copy of the detailed packing list shall be enclosed in each package delivered. There shall also be enclosed in one package a master packing list summarizing and identifying each individual package which is a part of the shipment. The box number in which the master packing list is contained should be shown on each packing list.

On barrels, bags, drums or kegs where it is not feasible to place packing list inside the container, all pertinent information is to be stenciled on the outside and will constitute a packing list.

12. DELIVERY:

In the event either of the following alternates is used, Contractor shall notify by cable the Supply Representative, General Services Administration, Federal Supply Service, AMIK, Seoul, Korea, of the name of the vessel, ETD (including port) ETA Korean port, contract number, number of packages, gross weight, whether it is partial or complete shipment.
CABLE ADDRESS: AMIKGSAPSS.

The following documents in a sealed envelope will be placed on board the vessel by the Contractor in care of the Master marked: Consignee's Mail, Office of Supply, Republic of Korea, ECA:

1. Original and copy of clean on board Bill of Lading or Charter Party.
2. Two copies of contractor's detailed invoice.
3. Two copies of Inspection and/or weight certificates.
4. Two copies of Master Packing List if applicable.

Simultaneously with the placing of the above documents aboard the vessel, two copies of each of the above listed documents will be airmailed to the Controller, ECA-AMIK, Seoul, Korea. Failure to notify the Government as above provided shall entitle the Government to reimbursement for any damages sustained, but the Contractor shall not be responsible for estimates made in good faith as to the estimated time of departure or arrival of ocean vessels.

Alternate 1:

Delivery shall be effected upon presentation of clean on board ocean vessel or charter party bills-of-lading, freight prepaid, evidencing shipment to Korean port specified herein on or before the delivery date indicated herein. Partial deliveries permitted.

Alternate 2:

Delivery shall be effected upon presentation of clean on board ocean vessel or charter party bills-of-lading, freight prepaid, and cargo receipt evidencing delivery and acceptance at Korean port specified herein, on or before the delivery date indicated herein. Partial deliveries permitted.

13. DRAWINGS AND MANUFACTURES' INSTRUCTIONS:

Within eight (8) weeks from date of the award, the Contractor shall forward by Air Mail to Controller, ECA-AMIK, Seoul, Korea four (4) copies of each of the following, with contract number indicated on each copy, so far as they apply to the contract equipment:

1. General Arrangement drawings.
2. Assembly and sub-assembly drawings.
3. Installation drawings showing weights and dimensions of the heaviest parts.

14. PAYMENT:

A. For purchase of commodities, source Japan. Payment shall be made from United States Government appropriated funds within ten(10) days from the date of receipt and acceptance of the documentation specified in paragraph 14-B. The payment shall be by check or draft and shall be made payable in United States Dollars to the duly authorized foreign exchange bank designated by the Contractor, for the account of the Con-

tractor. The foreign exchange bank shall credit the dollar proceeds thereof to an appropriate Foreign Exchange Control Board account and pay the corresponding yen equivalent at prevailing exchange rate for U. S. Dollars to the Contractor.

B. The Contractor shall present to the General Services Administration, Federal Supply Service, Room 402, Hattori Building, Tokyo, Japan the following documentation accompanied by a letter authorizing the bank to receive payment on his behalf.

- (1) Original and 7 copies of Contractor's detailed invoice showing quantity, description, unit price, gross sales price, net sales price (after deducting all discounts and purchasing agent's commissions applicable) and basis of delivery (for example, C&F) of the commodity or services. Invoice shall also show shipper's marks including Procurement Authorization Number, Contract Number, and Purchase Requisition Number. The following certification shall appear on the face of the original and all copies of the invoice: "I certify that the above bill is correct and just and that payment therefor has not been received." The invoice certificate shall be manually signed (original and 4 copies) by the Contractor or his duly authorized representative and the name of the firm must be identical to that shown on the contract. When the invoice consists of more than one page, the certification shall appear on the page that shows the total amount of the invoice.
- (2) Original and 3 copies of supplier's certificate (ECA Form 280) with invoice and contract abstract on reverse side covering the following:
 - (a) The cost of commodity, including ocean freight and statement relating to agent's commissions to be executed by the supplier of the commodity.
 - (b) The cost of ocean freight to be executed by the carrier.
- (3) Three (3) originals and one (1) copy of clean on board ocean or charter part bill of lading marked "Freight Prepaid" to port of destination to the order of the Office of Supply, Government of the Republic of Korea. The bills of lading shall indicate thereon, in addition to standard requirements, net invoice value, and brief description of the commodity. The following statement shall appear on the face of the bill of lading: "The liability of the carrier shall be equal to the invoice value per package or, if the shipment is in bulk, the invoice value per ton.
- (4) Original and three (3) copies of Inspection and/or Weight Certificates.

- (5) Original and three (3) copies of Packing List when applicable.
- (6) Cargo Receipts when applicable.

C. For purchases other than Japan, the contractor shall present the aforementioned documentation directly to the Contracting Officer for preparation of a Public Voucher to be presented to the Disbursing Officer, Department of State, who will draw a check in favour of the contractor in the amount stipulated in the Public Voucher. When presenting the documentation, Contractor shall stipulate the address of a prime bank to which the check is to be mailed.

15. DEFAULTS:

If Contractor refuses or fails to make deliveries of articles or services conforming to specifications within time specified, or any extension thereof, or to perform faithfully any contract condition, contracting officer, without prejudice to other rights of the Government, resulting from breach of contract conditions, may by written notice terminate the right of Contractor to proceed with any or all remaining deliveries. In event of any such termination, the Government may, without prejudice to its other rights resulting from breach of contract conditions, obtain similar articles or services elsewhere and Contractor and his sureties, if any, shall be liable to the Government thereby (1) when failure of Contractor in making suitable deliveries is due to causes beyond his control which could not reasonably have been anticipated and were without his fault or negligence, including, but not restricted to, acts of God or public enemy, acts of the Government whether as contractor or sovereign; fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather, and delays and failures of a sub-contractor due to any cause unless contracting officer shall determine that articles or services to be furnished under the sub-contract are procurable in open market, and (2) if contractor shall notify contracting officer in writing of cause of such failure within 10 days from beginning thereof or within such further period as contracting officer may grant prior to date of final settlement of contract. Contracting Officer shall decide the facts and extent of failure and his decision shall be final and conclusive upon the parties hereto subject to appeals as provided in Terms 16 hereof, entitled "DISPUTES".

16. DISPUTES:

Unless otherwise provided herein, disputes involving questions of facts arising under this contract, which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be decided by the Contracting Officer. Upon written request by Contractor within 10 days from the time of decision by Contracting Officer, the decision of Contracting Officer shall be reduced to writing and a copy thereof mailed, or otherwise furnished, to Contractor. Within 30 days from mailing or furnishing such copy, Contractor may appeal in writing to the Administrator of General Services, 7th and D Streets, Southwest, Washington, D.C., whose decision or that of his duly authorized representative on such questions of fact shall be final and con-

Government the right to terminate the right of Contractor to proceed with any or all further deliveries under the contract.

22. AUTHORITY:

This contract has been entered into pursuant to authority of Title 1 of the Third Deficiency Appropriation Act, 1949, Assistance to the Republic of Korea, approved October 10, 1949 (Public Law 343-81st Congress).

23. PRICE CONTROL:

Contractor certifies that the price stated does not exceed his regular domestic price as adjusted by the export differential, and that such price is not higher than that charged other buyers similarly situated. Violation of this clause will entitle Government to rescind this contract or be entitled to a refund for the excessive price paid.

24. MANUFACTURING COMPANY:

Bid must be accompanied by letter signed by the named manufacturing company stating the quantity of this commodity that can be furnished within the specified delivery period. The name of the manufacturing company specified by the bidder will be inserted in the resultant contract and any change to another manufacturing company must be approved in writing by the contracting officer as an amendment to this contract.

Subject: Use of J.N. Technical Experts in the field.

1. Major Freeman, Economics Division, CAS/SCAP called this date to verify a rumor that we were using J.N. Technicians in the field "on their own" rather than accompanying a DAC. Stated that we did send Japanese Nationals which we felt were fully qualified (College graduate engineers with the section for years) into plants by themselves where they made routine inspections, filled in a check sheet (see attached) and reported back.....giving no instructions, nor advice, nor guidance. I considered this "gathering of information".. but evidently it didn't satisfy CAS because Colonel Papen called about 30 minutes later.

2. Colonel Papen had stated in the past, most definitely, that no J.N. Technicians could be used in the field except to accompany a DAC...then J.N. could work other side of same shop, etc...conferring with his DAC before plant inspection was checked over with the plant custodians, etc BUT since Colonel Hollingshead had approved their use we had continued to use Japanese "on their own"...otherwise complete coverage of plants in Kanto Region cannot be made each quarter. Colonel Papen feels that, since Civil Affairs is a limited coverage section under the new set-up, that it is more important NOT to use Japanese Nationals than it is to make complete coverage.

3. Shall we continue to operate as we have in the past, again being reminded that this is contrary to instructions given all Economics Chiefs at several conferences by CAS, AND make better coverage, or shall we operate as they state and do the best we can?

Actually, Colonel, with so many CPC inspectors covering our Region, and the fact that the Japanese plants are pretty well in line with instructions, believe the best course to follow is to stay within CAS expressed desires!

check sheets:a. Plant Code #39-14 (a/c) Hikko Industrial Co. Tachikawa Kojo (Rep Insp
C/S Incl #1 Plant Layout Incl #2)

- (1) Subject plant is presently engaged in manufacturing small 3 to 4 HP Kerosene engines for use on farms and civil engineering works.
- (2) Major portion of plant area is heavily war-damaged. All buildings in released area are damaged beyond repairs. Roughly 255,236 tsubo of land has been sold as farm land.

b. Plant Code #39-152 (a/c) Haneda Sangyo K.K. (Rep Insp C/S Incl #3)

This is a non-operating plant. No discrepancies were noted.

c. Plant Code #19-91 (mun) Nihon Kogaku K.K. Totsuka Kojo (Rep Insp C/S
Incl #4)

- (1) Released portion of plant including land and buildings were sold to Kanagawa Prefecture's Education Board. Buildings have been converted into classrooms and are now occupied by the Totsuka Girls High and Totsuka Boys High.
- (2) The 32 authorized use items are being operated by a non-reparations plant, Keen Kogyo K.K., sub-contracting for Nihon Kogaku Oil Plant, occupying 3 buildings within plant area; building nos. 5, 6, 7.
- (3) Remaining 336 inventoried items are presently stored in 3 buildings. These can be easily consolidated into building No.1. However since Japanese Government is paying for only 2 guards no consolidation is recommended. Copy of plant layout was unavailable at the time of this inspection.

d. Plant Code #19-49 (mun) Nihon Kako K.K. (Rep Insp C/S Incl #5 Plant
Layout Incl #6)

- (1) All feasibly removable reparations machines have been consolidated into one building. 90% of the machines and equipment used to manufacture safety matches authorized for production are "EX" items.
- (2) 19 buildings have been released since the plant was originally designated for reparations custody. Of which 16 buildings have been dismantled and sold. Of the remaining 3 buildings, 2 are empty and one is used as warehouse by the plant.

e. Plant Code #34-51 (mun) Niigata Tokko Urawa Plant (Rep Insp C/S Incl #7)

- (1) Plant has temporarily closed shop as of 9 Aug 50 due to labor trouble. Management does not know when they will be able to resume production again.
- (2) Approximately 5,000 tsubo of land and 2 buildings have been released. Buildings have been sold to the Urawa City and are now used as Tokiwa High School.
- (3) During the course of inspection, it was found that inventory numbers on some of the machines have faded; apparently rubbed out in the course of maintenance during a period of months. The plant will repaint the numbers.

f. Plant Code #34-64 (mun) Nihon Kagaku K.K. Omiya Plant (Rep Insp C/S Incl #8 Plant Layout Incl #9)

- (1) Reparations designated Nihon Kagaku K.K. Omiya Plant is a non-operating plant but since designation, entire plant area with the exception of 4 buildings have been released and it presently occupied by 13 independent commercial firms.
- (2) The 12 items in authorized use which include boilers, pumps, and electrical equipment are used by Nihon Seibutsu Kagaku Kenkyusho, a private plant manufacturing penicillin. Authority: for operation and authorized use: ESS letter dated 24 June 1950.
- (3) In as much as the plant does not receive custodial fee from the reparations fund, it is not considered economical to consolidate the remaining non-operating machines.

g. Plant Code #39-99 (mun) Hikari Seiki K.K. Honsah Kojo (Rep Insp C/S Incl #10, Scrap List Incl #11)

- (1) Plant ceased all operations as of 14 Jun 50. Recommend transfer of authorized use items to available section of evaluation report.
- (2) Since the plant was originally designated for reparations, 1,655 tsubo of land and 11 buildings has been released. Released area is now occupied by Nisshin Shokuryo K.K. and Shinbo Kogyo K.K.

Following are building numbers which have been released:
 Building Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 13, and 19. Copy of plant layout
