ALGIE JOLLY KILLS SELF

Man's Attentions Had Been Rejected.

Condition at Miss Ruby Shaw, 21, C. & O. station agent at Menton, Ky., was reported improved Tuesday at Spicers Hospital. Miss Shaw was shot twice by Algie Jolly, 28, superintendent of Menton Baptist Sunday school, who lived at Silver Grove. Jolly then shot himself thru the head, being instantly killed.

The tragedy took place before the Menton station at 2 a. m. Monday, just as Miss Shaw was leaving the office for the day.

Walter B. Hughes, Campbellsville, was investigating the case. He told the attempted murder and suicide was the result of unrequited love. Jolly, it is said, was an unwelcome suitor for Miss Shaw's affections.

No one was near at the time of the tragedy and Miss Shaw's condition does not permit her to recount what she had seen previous to the shooting, except that he commanded her to get down on her knees and pray, as she had been doing to Miss Shaw.

Paralyzed with fright the young woman fled to her room, where she took charge of Jolly's body and hastened to call the coroner to the office. Dr. C. W. Shaw, Alexandria, who later ordered her removed to the hospital, was called.

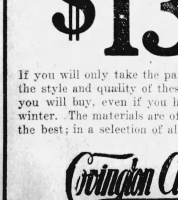
