

# New-England Bank Note List,

## AND COUNTERFEIT BILL DETECTOR.

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**Money Market.** The demand for money during the past fortnight has perhaps been greater than for some months back. There has been, however, no material change in the rates; operations to a limited extent are made in the street daily on prime paper, at 6 to 8 per cent. per annum—but there is another class of paper less known, but perhaps equally as good, which sells at higher rates, say 9 to 12 per cent per annum; and this should not be lost sight of in getting at the condition of the Money Market. The Banks have been preparing for the semi-annual dividends, which have been declared by 23 out of the 25 City Banks, payable on the 5th inst. The Market Bank and the City Bank pay nothing. The whole amount to be paid is near half a million, being within a fraction of 2½ per cent, or 5¼ per cent per annum on \$17,600,000, which is the entire banking capital of our city. This fact is perhaps a better indication of their condition than any that could be given. We believe they are without an exception, doing a safe and profitable business; indeed this remark will probably hold good if applied to all the sound and respectable banks in New England. It is true that several of them have been of late transferred to the hands of dishonest and irresponsible persons from abroad, and extensive frauds on the public have been by this means concocted, and in some cases successfully carried out; and the vigilance of the Bank Commissioners has prevented others perhaps of more extensive character from being bro't to light. Notwithstanding this, it is undeniable that the association of allied Banks, as it was originally termed, or more properly the Suffolk Bank system, has given to New England a better and more uniform currency, than any country of like extent, on this or the other side of the ocean has ever enjoyed. This is saying much, but it is said truly; and it is really a matter of no little wonder, that the hills of between three and four hundred Banks scattered as ours necessarily are over so much territory and in six different States, should bear a uniform specie value, not only at a common centre, but at any and every point that can be named. We believe there is something radically wrong in our Banking System, for we have at least ten banks where, if sound policy ruled, we should not have more than one, and that in the hands of real capitalists, instead of money borrowers. But while the system exists, we maintain that the present arrangement as carried out by the Suffolk Bank, is as perfect as human sagacity and foresight could make it. No bank should be entitled to credit, unless its bills are redeemed by the Suffolk.—In New-York, as in some of the other States, the free Banking Law has been productive of almost incalculable mischief. Not less than 15 or 20 of these self-created concerns, have blown up in New York within a month, and as a natural consequence, discredit now attaches to them all. In Pennsylvania and further south, the derangement is almost beyond precedent. In Philadelphia the Banks are powerless, and at the mercy of the Legislature, which is tardy in its movements, and completely in the dark as to what course of policy the true interests of the State demands. The U. S. Bank was so closely connected with the other City Banks, that a serious shock was felt by them in its fall. If, however, the Legislature should pursue a lenient course towards them, they will soon place themselves on better ground, although we are convinced that the present amount of active banking capital, which is not over about six millions, is totally inadequate to give the useful facilities to the immense trade of that city. The finances of Pennsylvania are in a sad condition; her public debt is hard upon Forty Millions, and she is without a system of any sort for paying the half yearly interest as it becomes due. \$900,000 of the principal and nearly as much more for interest, falls due in the coming three months, and as yet no provision has been made to meet it. Her legislature is still in session, and the subject is under consideration; but independence and energy are wanted to adopt and carry into effect some effectual plan of helping them out of trouble. Her public works, it is true, are gigantic, and when completed, will do much toward paying the interest; but at present they are generally unproductive. It is obvious that the citizens of Pennsylvania do not themselves realize the responsibility of their position in this connection. If the Legislature should adjourn without adopting measures to protect the faith of the State, the worst consequences will inevitably follow.—Many of the Western States are howed down under their immense public debt, and the example of such a state as Pennsylvania will be sufficient to induce some of them at least to rid themselves of the burden by repudiating the debt, or neglecting to provide the means to pay the interest which would in effect produce the same result. It may easily be foreseen, that such a course would stigmatize the whole country, and produce inconceivable confusion and distress. An energetic resort to the only legitimate method of revenue as adopted by all other countries, would effectually and at once relieve them of their embarrassment, and place them on independent ground. A system of direct taxation appears to be absolutely unavoidable; but for some cause it has become so odious with the people at large, that no political party has dared to hazard its prospects by recommending such a measure. The time has however come, when the highest interests of the States must be paramount to the temporary expediency of this or that political party. The aggregate public debt of the several States exceeds Two Hundred Millions. This vast sum has been mainly expended in works of internal improvements, a very considerable proportion of which are unfinished, unproductive, and consequently nominal in value; while others which are completed, are absolutely a charge to the States for repairs and management. These matters cannot be dodged, nor can the interests be paid by proclamation. A resort, therefore, to direct taxation is the

only plausible plan that is suggested, unless the aid of the General Government is effectually invoked. It may be stated further in this connection, that the sum of near \$100,000,000 millions has been expended within six to ten years past, by individuals, in constructing Rail Roads. This property is however mostly productive; over 3,300 miles of road being completed and in successful operation.

The citizens of Bond County, Illinois, have memorialized the Legislature of that State to repudiate her public debt, which is not far from 13 millions. The ground assumed is, in the first place, that they cannot pay either principal or interest, for want of the ability to do so; and secondly, that they are not constitutionally bound to pay, the Legislature having acted rashly and without authority in creating the debt.

The bad debts due to the Bank of the State of Alabama and its branches, are officially reported by a committee of the Legislature to amount to the very enormous sum of \$5,610,761 59! This bank belongs to the State, and has been governed by officers elected by the legislature, because of their devotion to that party. The loss will, of course, be suffered by the State.
