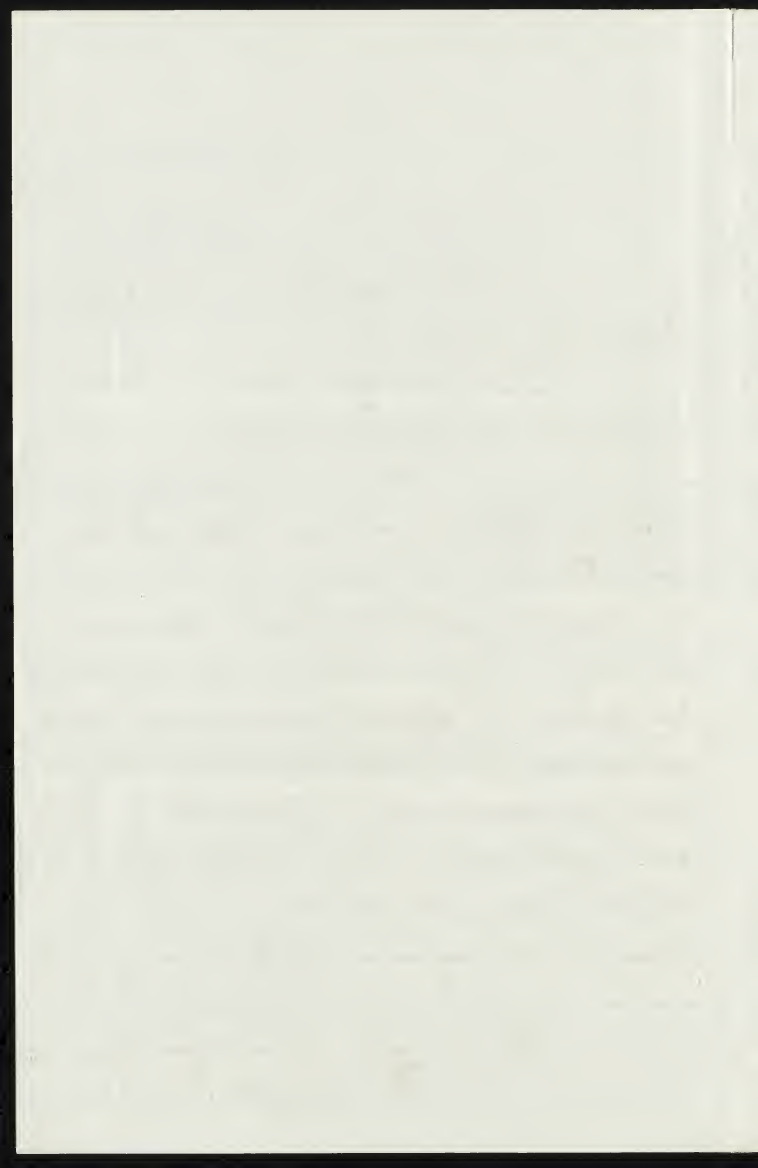


Roxbury, March 29, 1877.
