- They were guarded at the embarkation port by the Jap. Army in order to avoid escaping.
- I do not know for sure, but according to what I have heard there were great number of Chinese attempted to escape, so I guess it could be said that there were very few Chinese who were willing to accept the job to be sent over to Japan.
- The Contract which was exchanged were dealt on Laborer and it was signed by NCLE Ass'n, and Civil Eng. Construction Contractors. I do not about (Chinese + NCLE Ass'n) whether they did have the contract or not.

Some of the laborers in China were, ~~labor~~ ill, undernourished, too young or too old to meet the standards and specifications laid down in the plan by the Jap Govt but nothing could be done about it as there was such a shortage of manpower and the need for labor was so great, so we had to take whatever we could get.

The laborers who were interned into Emb. Camp had to wait there for month or longer in order to get a transportation furnished. Though, at that time the arrangements were very difficult to have a shipment and had a difficult time in acquiring food, as great many of laborers became ill and undernourished.

A. The Agreement between NCLC Asin and Japanese Govt.

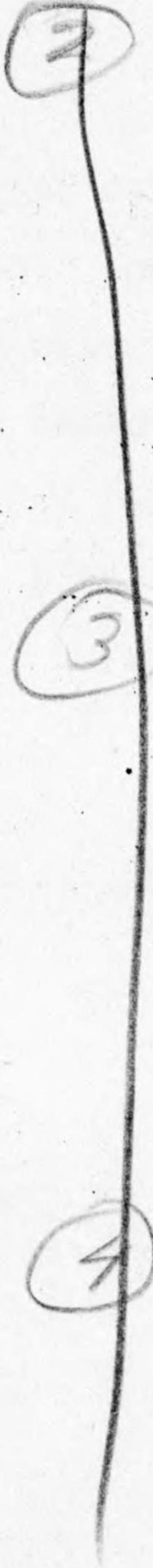
