

33. NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF THE ACHIEVEMENT PERFORMED OR SERVICE RENDERED. (If more space is necessary use additional sheets) Lt Cmdr Turner, a naval officer assigned to the Armed Forces Security Agency was detailed to duty with Army Security Agency Pacific. Working as the chief of the Analysis Section of the 330th Communication Reconnaissance Company in Korea, he devised methods and developed procedures for obtaining information of high intelligence value from a unique and highly specialized source. He so led and directed the work of the analysis section under his command that a large volume of information was made available to the United Nations Command. His great technical skill and capable leadership were largely responsible for obtaining information regarding the opposing North Korean forces which was not obtainable from any other source. His high devotion to duty and ceaseless efforts were an inspiration to the officers and men under him.

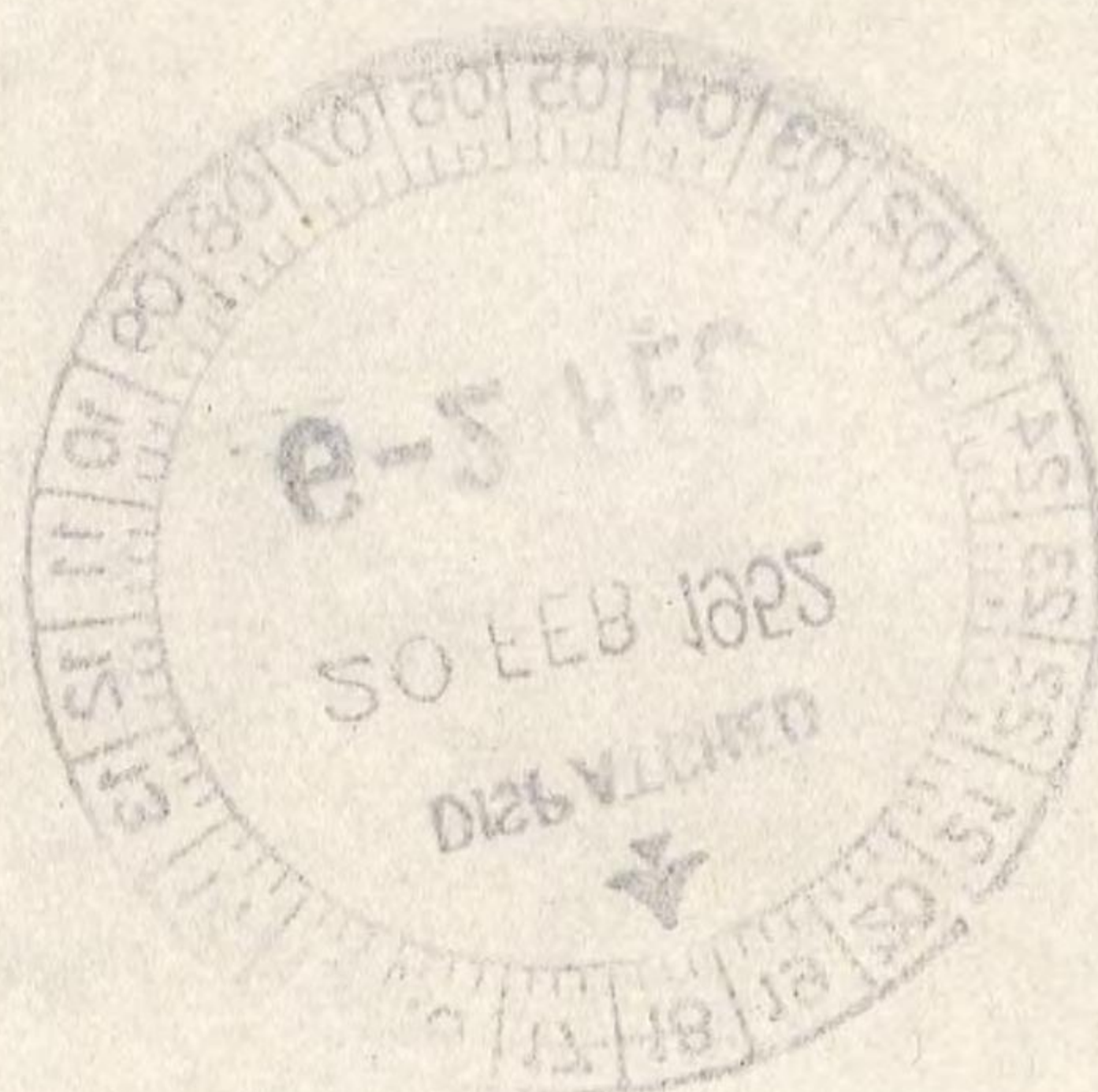

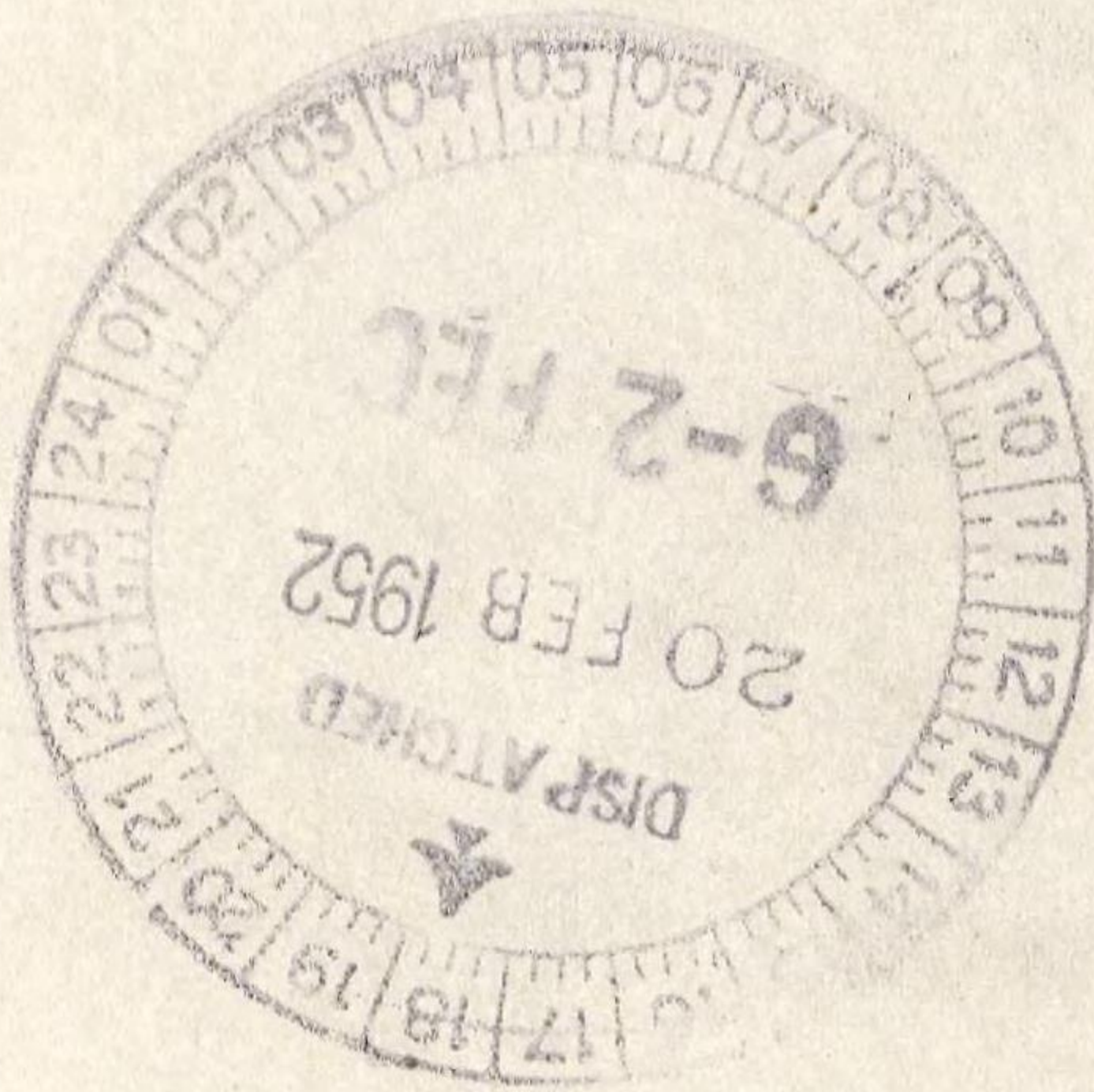
ROBERT WAYNE TURNER, Lieutenant Commander (then Lieutenant)



In addition, his voluntary efforts to assist in morale and recreational activities in the unit were of great value in maintaining the effectiveness of the unit.

His professional work was of a high order that compares with the best of others of like rank and experience in similar positions. His voluntary work in the realm of morale and recreational activities was beyond his responsibilities and contributed greatly in maintaining the unit at a peak of efficiency and effectiveness.

The information produced by Lt Erickson was of great value to the intelligence efforts of the United Nations Command. The high morale in the unit to which he was attached was due, in a large measure, to the efforts and enthusiasm of Lt Erickson.

Lieutenant Erickson, a naval officer assigned to the Armed Forces Security Agency was detailed to duty with Army Security Agency, Pacific. His skill and high devotion to duty were responsible for producing information of great intelligence value to the United Nations Forces. It was largely through his cheerful, untiring efforts that morale was maintained at a high level and the effectiveness of the company greatly enhanced.

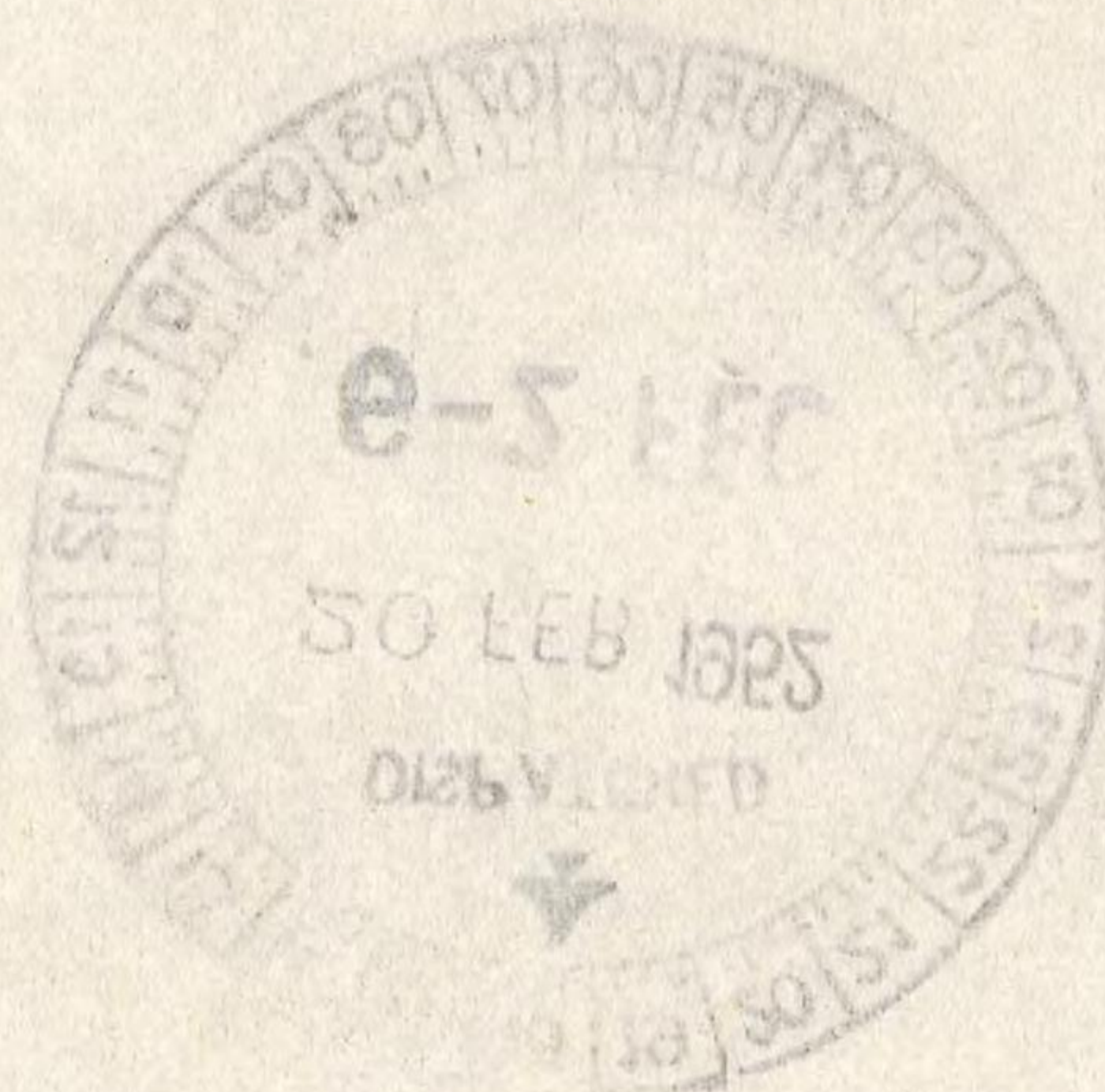

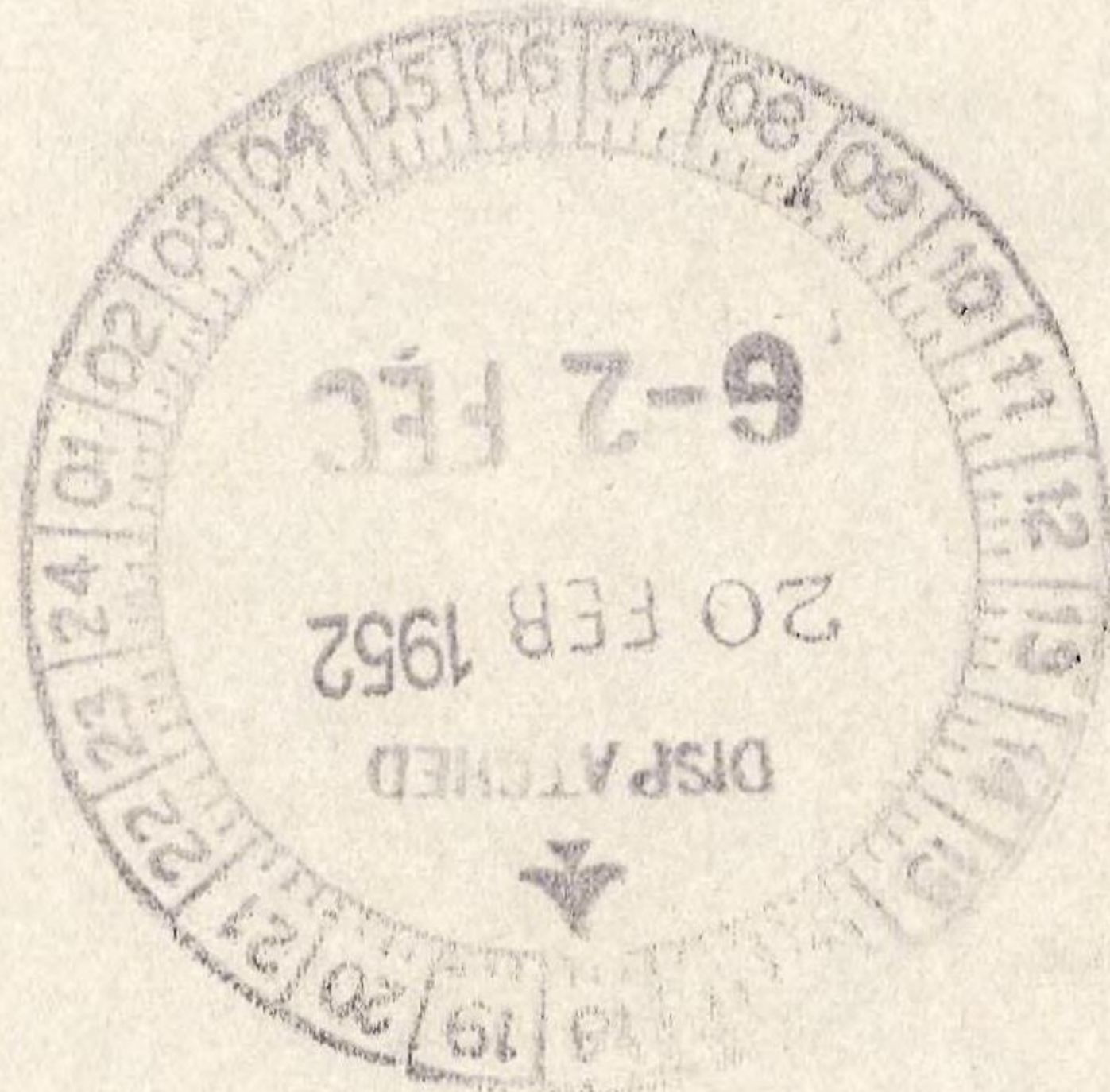

During this period Lt Col Carson performed outstanding and meritorious service while serving as Chief, Research and Analysis Group, Operations Branch, Intelligence Division, and later as Senior Editor of the Daily Intelligence Summary, G2, GHO, FEC. His display of outstanding ability, versatility, and the timely and efficient discharge of his varied duties, contributed materially to the success of this division in producing a voluminous amount of valuable intelligence information for use by the planning staffs of all echelons of command in support of the United Nations operations against the enemy in Korea.

31. WHY WAS THIS OUTSTANDING WHEN COMPARED TO OTHERS OF LIKE RANK AND EXPERIENCE IN SIMILAR POSITIONS?

Lt Col Carson consistently performed his duties in an outstandingly superior manner. His sincere and unceasing devotion to duty, his demonstration of outstanding and capable leadership, and his willingness to exceed the requirements of his assigned duties which he performed with marked success, are indicative of outstanding service and reflect highly desirable qualifications which are not often found.

32. EFFECT OF THIS ACHIEVEMENT OR SERVICE Because of his skillful and careful planning, the Research and Analysis Group was quickly and efficiently organized to produce timely intelligence for use of all echelons of command. In addition, his daily improvements in the production of the Daily Intelligence Summary were of paramount importance to the intelligence effort of this command, and materially assisted the efforts of the United Nations forces planning staffs in their operations against the enemy in Korea.

33. NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF THE ACHIEVEMENT PERFORMED OR SERVICE RENDERED. (If more space is necessary use additional sheets)

At the outbreak of hostilities in Korea, it became necessary to organize, and later expand, a Research and Analysis Section to meet the increased demands placed on this division. To meet this demand, Lt Col Carson was assigned the task of establishing such a group. In an appreciably short time, and through the meticulous efforts of Lt Col Carson, the volume of intelligence was established to meet the demanding needs of the Korean War. As Chief Editor of the Daily Intelligence Summary, Lt Col Carson again demonstrated exceptional skill in directing a staff of intelligence writers in the production of this media. He habitually displayed outstanding proficiency and a superior knowledge of intelligence procedures. Lt Col Carson's inspiring leadership, ability and devotion to duty contributed greatly to the successful intelligence efforts within this command, and resulted in a voluminous amount of valuable and timely intelligence information for dissemination to all echelons of command.

During the period 27 June 1950 to 20 January 1952, Lt Colonel James Marsh Carson performed meritorious and distinguished service while serving in the Intelligence Division, G2, General Headquarters, Far East Command.

WHAT DID THE INDIVIDUAL DO THAT MERITS THE AWARD? **As Commander of the 501st Communication Reconnaissance Group in Korea this officer performed his duties in such a manner as to provide intelligence information to the United Nations Forces in constantly increasing volume and quality. He organized a number of widely scattered radio intercept and direction finding units into an integrated organization which supplied the raw material for intelligence reports which were invaluable to the forces in the field.**

31. WHY WAS THIS OUTSTANDING WHEN COMPARED TO OTHERS OF LIKE RANK AND EXPERIENCE IN SIMILAR POSITIONS? **The conscientious leadership and high devotion to duty which marked this officer's command of his unit was of the highest order. By his example he inspired his officers and men to carry out their missions with energy and enthusiasm. His performance of duty was in a manner which compares with the highest of others of like rank and experience in a similar position.**

32. EFFECT OF THIS ACHIEVEMENT OR SERVICE **Through his actions he organized the expanding radio intercept and direction finding activities into a well-knit organization with central control in Korea. He directed the first front line radio intercept teams and expanded the security monitoring of United Nations Communications links to provide for more complete coverage in the interest of signal security.**

33. NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF THE ACHIEVEMENT PERFORMED OR SERVICE RENDERED. (If more space is necessary use additional sheets)
Lt Col S. G. Eddy assumed control of all Army Security Agency activities in Korea on 25 June 1951 and remained in this position until 10 Jan 1952. During this period he directed the radio intercept, direction finding, security monitoring, and processing of information obtained through communication reconnaissance. He controlled all ground force units in Korea, including those of the Republic of Korea, engaged in obtaining information from enemy signal communications. He also directed the security monitoring of United Nations ground force communications systems and directed the efforts to improve the security of those systems. During this period he expanded all activities to more than double their former size and provided for units in direct support of corps headquarters and in specific cases for support of front line units. His planning and direction of these activities resulted in a greatly increased volume of information of intelligence value to units of Eighth Army and the United Nations. His devotion to duty, conscientious leadership, and skillful direction of the activities which were his responsibility are in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Army.
