- **Hindi** - from the standard Hindi language. Most words are common to all Hindi dialects and most probably came to Fiji Hindi via the Eastern Hindi and Bihari dialects.
- **Urdu** - words which are used in the Urdu language and have Persian or Arabic origin,
- **Awadhi** - words from the Awadhi dialect of Hindi spoken in eastern Uttar Pradesh state.
- **Bhojpuri** - words from the Bhojpuri dialect of Hindi spoken in eastern Uttar Pradesh and western Bihar
- **Magahi** - words from the Magahi dialect Hindi spoken in south-eastern Bihar, now in Jharkhand state.
- **Chhattisgarhi** - words from the Chhattisgarhi Hindi spoken in eastern Madhya Pradesh, now Chhattisgarh.
- **Maithili** - words from the Maithili dialect of Hindi spoken in eastern Bihar.
- **English** - words from British English
- **Fijian** - words from the language spoken by the native Fijians.
