July Fluid Milk Market More Stable

Reports received by the Bureau indicate that there were fewer changes in milk prices during July than had occurred previous months. Average prices paid producers show a small increase over June, but this amounted to but 14¢ per 100 lbs. compared with the July 1920 average of \$3.33, however, the reduction is 78¢. There is still more or less of a surplus production in most parts of the country, although hot and dry weather have caused poorer pasture conditions and have cut down production so that the surplus has been materially decreased, and in some sections no price reductions for surplus milk were to be made during the month. The outlook for August points to supply and demand being more nearly equal. It is reported that in a few cities very successful milk campaigns have been carried on, whereby a greater interest in the consumption has been stimulated. Butter markets are firm and have been all month, and cheese markets are now very firm following heavy export buying the past two weeks.
