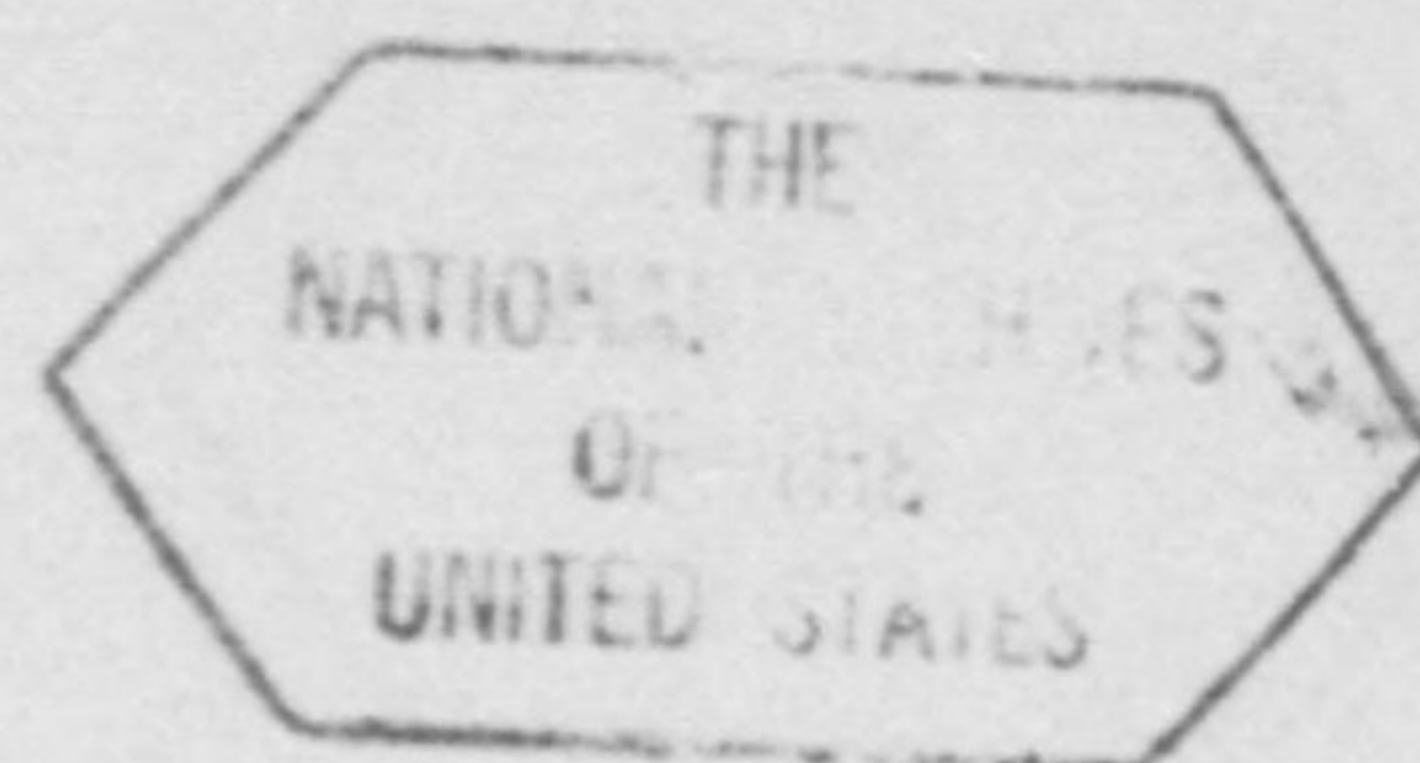

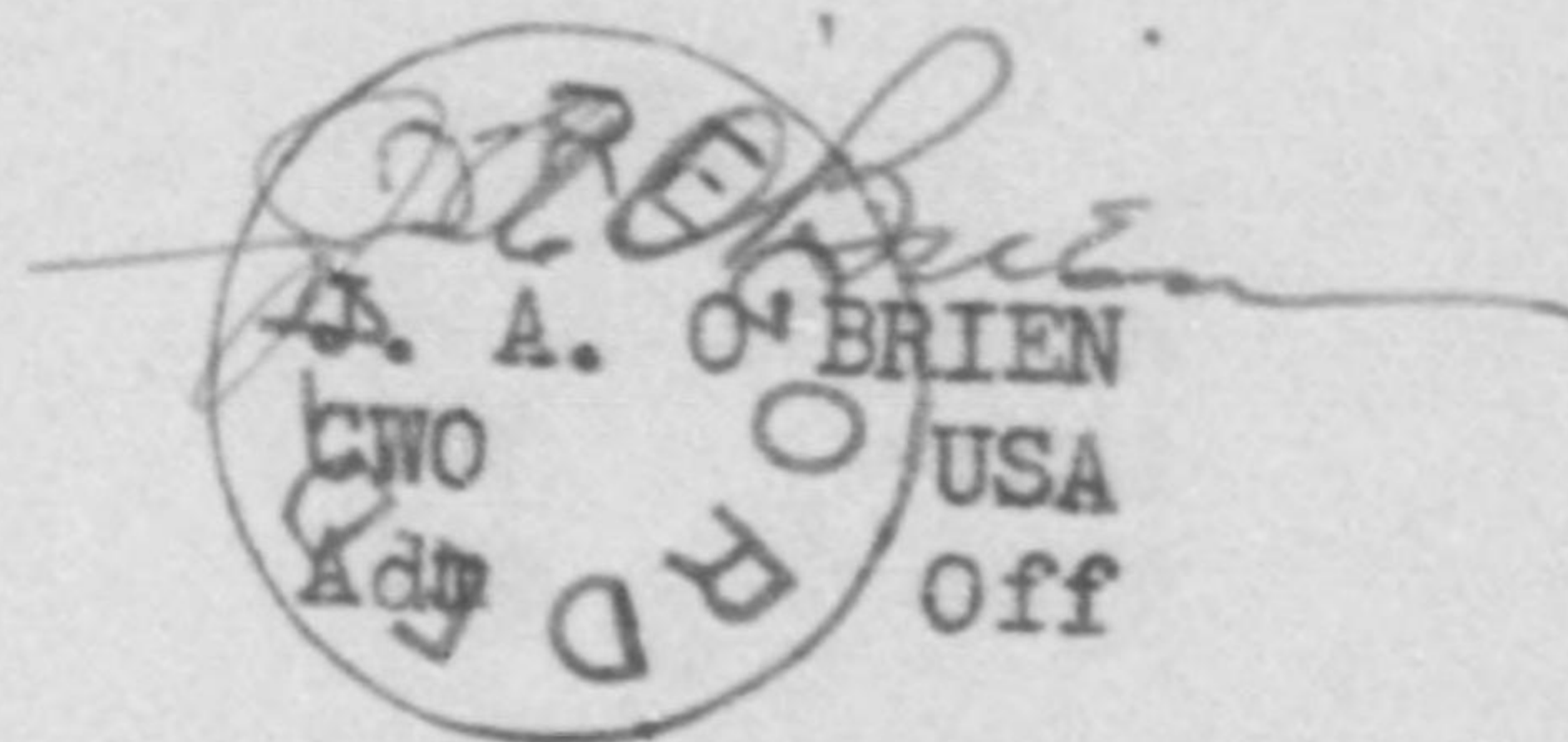

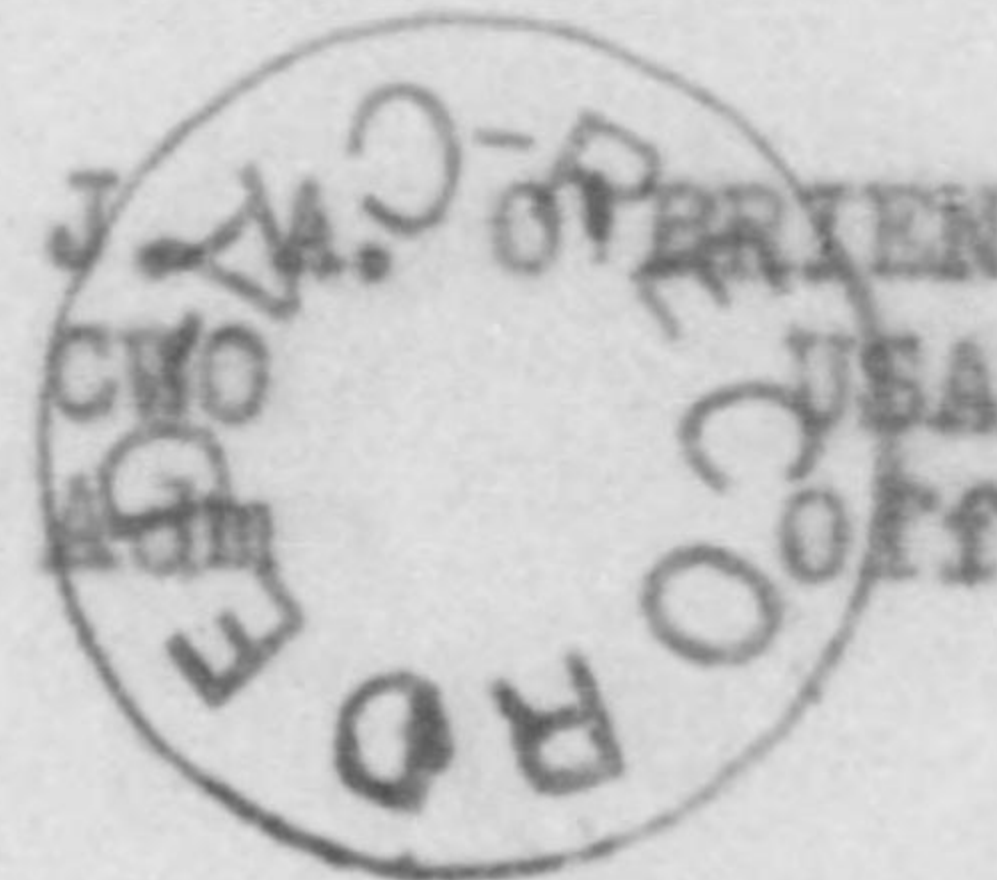

1. It is requested that Commander, United States Naval Forces, Far East, exercise surveillance over implementation of the inclosed memorandum for Reparations Agency, Japanese Government, which establishes new policy for processing of applications for funds for maintenance, consolidation, and repair of buildings at reparations plants.
2. Funds available in the reparations budget for fiscal year 1950 are \$108,718,000 for consolidation, maintenance of machinery, and repair of buildings. Inasmuch as funds are extremely limited, it is urgently requested that caution be exercised in approving applications for funds and that approval be based on a detailed physical inspection of required work.
3. Applications for funds to move reparations equipment from buildings in order that the buildings may be used by the Occupation Forces, will not be approved. Such movement of equipment must be accomplished at no expense to the Japanese Government reparations budget.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Reparations Agency, Japanese Government

SUBJECT: Expenditure of Funds for Maintenance, Centralization of
Machines, and Repair of Buildings in Reparations Plants

1. Reference is made to memorandum for Reparations Agency, Japanese Government, 387.6 (2 Jun 50)CPC/RP, 2 June 1950, subject, "Reduction of Custodial Personnel at Reparations Plants."
2. It is anticipated that as a result of the typhoon of 3 September 1950, the Japanese Government will be receiving numerous applications for funds to repair typhoon damages at reparations plants. In order to expedite approval for encumbrance of necessary funds, applications for funds to repair typhoon damage, and applications for funds for maintenance, centralization of machines and repair of buildings directed by Civil Affairs Teams, will be submitted by the local Japanese Government agencies concerned to the appropriate Civil Affairs Team for approval.
3. Funds available for maintenance, consolidation and repair of buildings in the 1950 fiscal year budget for reparations are limited; therefore, expenditure of these funds will be accomplished with the guidance of the following:
 - a. Maintenance work will be accomplished only on machines whose preservation has served its maximum usefulness and will be accomplished only upon the direction of a Civil Affairs Team.
 - b. Consolidation of equipment within plants will be effected primarily with a view toward reduction in the number of guards; however, consolidation will be accomplished in preference to repair of damaged buildings housing idle machines when considered more economical. Plant-to-plant consolidation will be effected only between government-owned arsenals and laboratories, privately-owned plants owned by the same company, or between privately-owned plants under separate ownership at the consent of the owners.
 - c. Repair of buildings will be accomplished only on those buildings housing dead storage equipment. The extent of repair will be limited to the minimum.
 - d. Funds will not be allocated to plants using 30% or more of reparations equipment. Such plants are responsible for necessary maintenance of idle machines and repair of buildings. Plants using less than 30% of reparations equipment must share in the cost for necessary maintenance and repair of buildings in direct proportion to the amount of equipment used less than 30%. This proportion will be the same as the

proportion used in determining the number of guards paid for by plants using less than 30% of reparations equipment as directed in paragraph 7c of memorandum referred to in paragraph 1, above.

e. In order to economize, the various ministries concerned will appoint personnel now on reparations payrolls to supervise local labor on maintenance, consolidation, and repair projects, and will utilize all available materials which were purchased with reparations funds. Applications which include cost for purchase of materials will bear a statement that these materials are not available from reparations stocks.

4. Local Finance, International Trade and Industry, Education, and Transportation Bureaus will be responsible for preparation of applications for maintenance, consolidation, and repair of buildings in reparations plants under their jurisdiction. Each application will include a detailed description of the project to be accomplished and a breakdown estimate of the cost involved. These applications will be submitted to the Chief of the Civil Affairs Team concerned for approval prior to their implementation. Chiefs of the local Ministry Bureaus will be held directly responsible for the contents of each application and they must, therefore, ascertain that such applications submitted to the Civil Affairs Teams are correct and represent a valid request for funds to accomplish necessary work.
