SUBJECT: Restitution of United Nations National's Property

1. References:

a. Operational Directive Number 6, Headquarters Eighth Army, 10 January 1947.

b. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 386.3 (6 May 1946) CPC, SCAPIN 926, 6 May 1946, subject: "Procedure for returning property in Japan to Nationals of United Nations", General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

c. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 386.3 (22 November 1946) CPC/TF, SCAPIN 1354, 22 November 1946, subject: "Restitution of United Nations Nationals' Property Wrongfully Transferred", General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Mr. William Van West, a citizen of the Netherlands, residing at Karasaki, Sakamoto-mura Shiga Ken has made inquiry at this headquarters as to the present and future status of certain property described in inclosure 1. This property during the late war was seized by the Japanese navy and used as a part of the Shiga Koku-tai commonly known as the Shiga Naval Air Training School. At the time of allied occupation of Japan this property was released verbally to Mr. Van West by the Sumimoto Trust Company in Osaka.

3. a. However on 3 October 1945 when allied troops seized the Shiga Koku-tai as a military target (8252-11-S 710 1087.5-13382) a certain portion of Mr. Van West's land was taken over by the 136th Infantry Regiment. On this land there was located a pump house, containing two water pumps, which installation had been made by the Japanese navy during its occupancy.

b. On 5 October 1945 Ralph C. Bing, Colonel Infantry, Procurement Officer of the Sixth U.S. Army directed the Japanese Central Liaison Office in Kyoto to retain all water supply installations then in operation at the Shiga Naval Air Training Base for use of the 136th Regimental Combat Team and that his letter be added to P.S. form 6A - 26 and made a part of the original request.

c. Since the departure of the 136th Infantry Regiment the pump house and pumps have been removed from this land and underneath it has been placed an inlet pipe to the Otsu Hydroponic Farm, an Eighth Army installation.

4. Mr. Van West is particularly concerned with the fact that there may be a cloud on his title due to the fact that an improvement was made on the property and part of such improvement is now being used by the occupation forces and may at some later date revert to Japanese Government control.

a. Mr. Van West states that he has not received a written accounting of his property although his title papers to this land have been returned. Property records of Otsu Local Court house show that on 28 May 1945 the subject land went into custody of the Sumitomo Trust Company Ltd, 5 Chome Kitahama, Higashiku, Osaka by order of the Finance Ministry. From Mr. Van West's statement it is understood that he submitted through the Netherlands Military Mission a Demand for Return of Property as contemplated by SCAPIN 926.

b. Recommend that if a directive requiring restitution is presented to the Imperial government that it include such legal protective phraseology as will insure Mr. Van West's rights in the future.

SUBJECT : Sale of bricks belonging to German Consulate in Kobe

PURPOSE : To ascertain who is responsible for the disposal of some 80,000 bricks belonging to and formerly stored on the premises of the German Consulate.

CASE SUMMARY: This report was requested by the Chief of the Axis Property Branch, CPC. Bricks from the remains of the burned out German Consulate were reported to be disappearing. It was desired to know who was taking them and on what authority.

Investigation Report

1. On 15 December 1946, Mr. KARL A. BALSER, former German Consul-General was questioned at his residence at 96-131 OBANAYAMA, ROEKO, NADAKU, KOBE. Mr. BALSER declared that he knew nothing of the bricks at the Consulate being sold on 16 December 1946. He submitted a letter to the Hyogo Prefecture Military Government Team, CPC Section, confirming this statement. (See Exhibit "A").
2. At the German Consulate at 115 HIGASHI MACHI, IKUTA-KU, KOBE, Mr. K. KIMBARA, a director of the TACHIBANA Repatriate Protection Society, located at 177 MINATOYAMA-CHO, HYOGO-KU, KOBE, was found directing the removal of cartloads of bricks from the Consulate. Asked for his authority, Mr. KIMBARA stated that he and his partner, NAKAMURA, HIDEICHI had purchased the bricks from YAMAGUCHI, YOSHIMATSU of 475 KO-WAKAE, FUSE, OSAKA Prefecture on 28 September 1946 for ¥18,500.00. (Copy of the translation of the contract is enclosed as Exhibit "B").
3. Mr. YAMAGUCHI was questioned and revealed that he had purchased the bricks through a building broker in KOPS who had introduced him to SASAKI, MASAJI, a former employee of the German Consulate.
4. SASAKI, who resides at 1301-1 NAKANO CHO, MAIKO, TARUMI-KU, KOBE was questioned, and he revealed that he had received permission to take the bricks from Mr. K. A. BALSER. He stated that he had sold them to Mr. YAMAGUCHI for ¥15,000.00. He said he did not know how many bricks had been taken away to date. Mr. SASAKI said that he would obtain from BALSER a statement concerning his right to the bricks.

Incl 13

5. Subsequently a letter signed by BALSER, Exhibit "C" of this report, was delivered to this office by BALSER. In it he reveals that he authorized SASAKI in June, 1945 to take from the ruins of the Consulate, as many bricks as he needed.

6. There were about 150,000 good quality bricks in the Consulate originally. It is conservatively estimated that 80,000 have been removed. In the KOBE area current market price for such bricks is ¥ 1.00 each. Thus some ¥80,000.00 worth of bricks have been carried off by KIMBARA and NAKAMURA, the only ones who have taken any bricks according to YAMAGUCHI and SASAKI. These bricks are now where?

7. Property not posted to prevent looting and no information as to the appointment of a custodian since the wars end could be obtained from either the Bank of Japan or the Kobe office of the Finance Ministry.

Conclusions

1. BALSER claims to have given SASAKI the right to take the property in question prior to the occupation.

Recommendations

1. It be checked to determine whether or not BALSER is subject to prosecution for illegal disposal of German Assets.
2. Restitution of assets or value be enforced.
3. Measures should be taken to prevent further dissipation.
4. Recommend expansion of investigation to determine what other assets, including insurance, existed and what has become of them.
