**The M62 Motorway and the A1(M) Motorway (Holmfild Interchange)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - 27th November 2014

Coming into force - 7th December 2014

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A1(M) Motorway, the M62 Motorway and connecting roads, in the District of Wakefield, in the County of West Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on some of those connecting roads should be prohibited because patching, joint repairs and general maintenance works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M62 Motorway and the A1(M) Motorway (Holmfild Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 7th December 2014.

2. Subject as mentioned in article 3 of this Order, no person shall, during a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 8th December 2014 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the link roads connecting the M62 Motorway eastbound carriageway to the A1(M) Motorway southbound and northbound carriageways at Holmfild Interchange (M62 Motorway Junction 32A and A1(M) Motorway Junction 41).

3. The provisions of article 2 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
