INTERNATIONAL JURY REPORT Wiki Loves Earth is a photo contest of natural monuments, where participants picture protected areas and upload their photos to Wikimedia Commons. The goal of the project is, on the one hand, to picture as many natural monuments and protected areas as possible under a free license. On the other hand, it is to contribute to nature protection by raising public awareness.

After years of successful organization of Wiki Loves Monuments, there was an idea of a similar contest for natural monuments. The idea of Wiki Loves Earth was born in April 2012 during a discussion at Wikimedia Conference. The idea was realized for the first time in Ukraine, where the contest was held from 15 April to 15 May 2013. Wiki Loves Earth became international in 2014 with 16 participating countries from four continents and expanded its geography further in the following years.

In 2023, 50 countries and territories worldwide organized local contests. This is a record number of participating countries during the whole existence of the contest.

Wiki Loves Earth lasted from May 1 to August 31. We received more than 60,000 submissions from over 3,000 uploaders.

This year, the contest has two categories — landscapes and macro/close-up photography. It's already the third year WLE has had this division, and the experience of its introduction in 2021 showed high interest and impact.

HOWTHE JURY WORKS

As usual, the international organizing team selected the jury team, which this year consisted of 13 members, who determined the final winners. The jury team was formed to be as diverse as possible: representatives from 13 countries and various continents. International jury members are experienced Wikimedians and professional photographers.

492 nominations were submitted to the international organizing team by the national juries of the participating countries. Each country was allowed to submit up to 15 images, not more than 10 from each category.

The nominations were collected in a judging tool managed by non-voting jury moderators.

After pre-filtering ineligible files, all photos were submitted to the jury.

In the first stage, all jurors rated all images with stars from 1 (poor) to 10 (very good). 69 images with ratings higher than 6 were selected as candidates for the final round.

In the final stage, jury members rated (from 1 to 20) and commented on each of the 69 images. Comments were visible to other jury members, while rankings were not. These rankings were added together, and a combined jury ranking was produced. In the case of equality of points in the final round, points from the first round were used as a tiebreaker. Photos were also checked for relevancy, copyright, and if they depicted a protected area or species are identified.

INTRODUCING THE JURY

OSAMA SILWADI, PALESTINE

Osama Silwadi is a Palestinian photojournalist, visual storyteller, archivist, and folklorist. He started his professional career in 1991. During the first Palestinian Intifada, he faced difficulties and challenges and was in danger as he worked in the conflict areas. In October 2006, Osama was seriously injured by a stray bullet during a march in the center of Ramallah, which resulted in paralysis of the lower limbs. Silwadi has won titles inspired by his work in documenting the Palestinian heritage, including "The Eye of Palestine" and the "Palestinian Heritage Documenter". Osama was the international jury member of the previous WLE editions in 2020, 2021, and 2022 and was glad to continue contributing to the contest this year.

CARLOS FIGUEROA, CHILE

Carlos Figueroa is a Chilean dentist and active Wikipedian since 2005 and has contributed to Wikimedia Commons since then. As a part of the Wikimedia Chile board since 2017 and chair since 2020, he has been in charge of the "Chile in images" project, which portrays the main cultural events in the country. Also, Carlos was a member of the national jury of the 2018 and 2019 editions of Wiki Loves Earth and a jury for other photographic contests, such as "6 months that changed Chile" and "Revealing Sites". Carlos was the international jury member of the previous WLE editions in 2020, 2021, and 2022 and was glad to continue contributing to the contest this year.

SHANI EVENSTEIN SIGALOV, ISRAEL

Shani Evenstein Sigalov is an Israeli educator, researcher, and Free Knowledge advocate, focusing on bridging gender, language, and social gaps. She teaches at Tel Aviv University, where explores the intersection hetween she technology, education, and Openness, and is currently pursuing her Ph.D. at the School of Education, focusing on learning via the Semantic Web, more specifically, using Wikidata as a learning platform. Shani joined the Wikimedia Movement in 2011 and has been heavily involved in Outreach efforts. While serving on the Board of Wikimedia Israel, Shani has been involved in setting up Wiki Loves Monuments, both in creating partnerships for the competition as well as serving as a judge in the competition. As an amateur photographer (and married to a professional photographer), she has a deep appreciation of Art and photography and enjoys adding free-licensed media files WikiCommons. She especially enjoys adding portraits (or videos) of notable people she encounters, places she travels to, or dishes she cooks or bakes. She even participated in the #100WikiCommonsDays Challenge. Though she failed the challenge miserably, she believes every Wikimedian should take on the challenge and looks forward to a time when she can take it up again. As of 2019, she serves on the Board of Trustees of the Wikimedia Foundation and is currently the Vice Chair of the Board. Shani was the international jury member of the previous WLE editions in 2020 and 2022 and was glad to continue contributing to the contest this year.

SUSANNA ANAS, FINLAND

Susanna Ånäs is a coordinator by practice and an artist, photographer, and documentarist at heart. Having joined the Wikimedia movement in 2012, she now runs the AvoinGLAM group in Helsinki, Finland, promoting open access to cultural heritage. The group likes to interpret GLAM as Global Languages, Art, and Memory instead of the institutional Galleries, Libraries, and Museums. The focus of the work is on urgent and important issues and bringing people together from across domain boundaries to work and learn together on them in case studies, experiments, or events like the co-creation "hackathon" Hack4OpenGLAM. Susanna has organized Wiki Loves Monuments in Finland three times. She wishes to explore and promote ways in which open culture advocates can make a positive impact on vulnerable and threatened cultural heritage or secure environmental sustainability. Susanna was the international jury member of the previous WLE edition in 2022 and was glad to continue contributing to the contest this year.

GATETE PACIFIQUE, RWANDA

Gatete Pacifique is a Rwandan photographer and a Wikimedia volunteer since 2019. In the Wikimedia movement, he has participated in most of the photograph and writing contests within Rwanda. He managed to be a winning contributor in Loves Folklore 2021, Wikipedia pages wanting photos 2021, WikiGap 2021, and 2022. He has organizing Wikiindaba 2022 in Rwanda.

ANANYA MONDAL, INDIA

Mondal is a veteran Wikimedian, Ananya hobbyist, nature photographer, and conservationist from India. She is also fond of Forest Survey, Rock Climbing, and Himalayan Trekking. In photography, her special love is shooting Butterflies and that's why she started and still has been operating successfully a scientifically-based WMF-granted project on species and subspecies level detailed documentation of butterflies of West Bengal and North-East India entitled Wiki Loves Butterfly (WLB) for the past 6 years with a group of Wikipedians, enthusiast lepidopterists, naturalists, researchers, scientific organizations, etc. hailing from different parts of India. She is also known as Butterfly Wikimedian and received the Wikimedian of the Year 2021 Rich Media Award. Ananya is one of the members of the Organizing team of Wiki Loves Monuments (WLM) in India and Wiki Loves Food (WLF) in India. Ananya was the international jury member of the previous WLE editions in 2018, 2022 and was glad to continue contributing to the contest this year.

GHEORGHE IORDACHI, MOLDOVA

Gheorghe Iordachi is a Wikimedian from Moldova, administrator on Romanian Wikipedia and active on Wikidata. A 'Wiki Loves X' enthusiast – he often makes detours to visit protected areas and cultural heritage monuments.

Evelin Heidel is a Wikimedian based in Uruguay. She's currently leading the work of Wikimedistas de Uruguay, and one of her main areas of interest is climate change & sustainability topics, so much so that she's pursuing a Master's on the topic of Economics and the law of Climate Change! 
Magdalena Sobolewska-Bereza: I like it! The focus is on its wings, maybe should be wider. An interesting photo of birds behavior.





SPECIAL NOMINATION "HUMAN RIGHTS AND ENVIRONMENT"

In 2023, the Wiki Loves Earth international photo contest again supports the initiative Wiki4HumanRights, which partners with the Wikimedia Foundation (WMF) and the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR).

Its goal is to raise awareness of nature protection and human impacts on nature.

For this special nomination, we are looking for images that capture:

- Humans engaging in activities that rely on a healthy environment or a protected environment (such as livelihoods engaged in sustainable agriculture or fishing practices, sustainable construction, exercise in or enjoyment of natural spaces, etc);
- The human activity that restores or helps an ecosystem or environment recover from previous damage (i.e. tree planting, waste collection, sustainable management of the land, removing invasive species, etc);
- The negative effects of global environmental issues, such as climate change, biodiversity loss, or pollution on maintaining environmental and human health (i.e. natural disasters like flooding, landslides, and wildfires, impacts of pollution, and waste accumulation);

- How human activity infringes on the natural systems
 we rely on for human and environmental health
 through extractive industries (such as forestry,
 mining, and destructive agriculture), construction of
 destructive infrastructure (i.e. dams and roads), or
 other activities;
- Where fragmenting or disappearing landscapes highlight ecological damage or loss that affects human well-being (i.e. invasive species, damaged waterways, soil loss, etc);
- People advocating for, protecting, or educating others about how a healthy environment is important for our collective well-being and the wellbeing of future generations.

After the review by the team of 6 jurors, who are biologists, ecologists, researchers, photographers, experts in the human rights field, and Wikimedians, we selected the final top 10 of the best images for this nomination from different countries.

INTRODUCING THE JURY

JOÃO POMPEU, BRASIL

As a biologist and ecological researcher, photography first came into his life as a working tool, but it soon assumed a more important role as art. As an independent documentary photographer, Joao portrays the environmental processes related to his research areas, including great natural phenomena, marine and terrestrial ecosystems, and their relationships with all the spheres of the Earth System.

VALENTINA VERA-QUIROZ, COLOMBIA

A human rights activist and lawyer from Harvard Law School. As a fellow at the Wikimedia Foundation, she provides legal and advocacy advice on human rights, disinformation, and policy. Nicky is a former climate activist with Fridays for Future Vienna, especially interested in climate disinformation, socioecological transformation, and the intersection between environmental and digital rights.


