Edinburgh Festival Fringe

Das **Edinburgh Festival Fringe** (auch *Edinburgh Fringe* oder nur *The Fringe*) ist das weltweit größte Kulturfestival und findet jährlich im August in [Edinburgh](#) statt. 2015 bot es über eine Dauer von 25 Tagen 50.459 Aufführungen von 3.314 Shows.

Das Fringe wurde 1947 begründet, als acht Theatergruppen die große Zahl der erwarteten Besucher des ebenfalls in diesem Jahr erstmals ausgetragenen [Edinburgh Festival](#) nutzen wollten, indem sie eigene „inoffizielle“ Auftritte organisierten. Seitdem hat das Fringe das offizielle Festival überflügelt, hat eine eigene Organisation und eigenes Personal und verkauft mehr als eine Million Karten pro Jahr.

Das Fringe ist fast ausschließlich auf die darstellenden Künste, besonders Theater und Comedy, ausgerichtet; die Bandbreite reicht von Shakespeare bis zu Experimentellem. Einige Fringe-Schauplätze sind reguläre Theater und verkaufen regelmäßig hunderte Karten zu einer Aufführung, andere sind umgewandelte Kirchen oder sogar Wohnzimmer und ziehen einstelliges Publikum an. Zunächst gab es Animositäten zwischen Fringe und offiziellem Festival, inzwischen sind diese aber verschwunden.

Das Edinburgh Fringe hat einen weltweiten Kreis von Festivals in kanadischen, amerikanischen, australischen und europäischen Städten inspiriert. Fringe Festivals zeichnen sich durch ihr Auswahlverfahren ohne Jury sowie die Vielzahl und inhaltliche Breite der Veranstaltungen aus.

Die prestigeträchtigen [Perrier Comedy Awards](#) werden beim Festival Fringe verliehen.

Im Jahr 2007 kam es anlässlich der Aufführung des Stücks *Dschihad - das Musical* zu Protesten.

El **Fringe** es un festival alternativo de artes escénicas que se celebra de forma paralela al Festival de Edimburgo,¹ dentro del conjunto de certámenes culturales que se realizan en verano en la capital de Escocia.²

El Fringe incluye todas las formas del espectáculo y la suma total de géneros de teatro desde los clásicos de la [Grecia antigua](#) o [Shakespeare](#) al [teatro de calle](#), pasando por [Samuel Beckett](#). Edition item properties [edit]

These properties are for the item that represents the edition of a book (FRBR expression/manifestation level). They are mainly for **editions of books used as sources**.

Note that each edition of a book should have a separate Wikidata item. If the content (foreword, afterword, illustration), pagination (page number), publisher, or publication place changes, a new item should be created for that edition. If a book is an identical reprint of a previous edition (no change in the mentioned properties), it does not need a new item.

Editions should be instances of version, edition, or translation (Q3331189) or one of its subclasses.



INTRODUCTION Wikidata, a knowledge base for structured linked data, provides an open platform for curating scholarly communication data. Because all elements in a Wikidata entry are linked to defining elements and metadata, other web systems can harvest and display the data in meaningful ways. Thus, Wikidata has the capacity to serve as the data source for faculty profiles. Scholia is an example of how third-party tools can leverage the power of Wikidata to provide faculty profiles and bibliographic, data-driven visualizations.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM In this article, we share our methods for contributing to Wikidata and displaying the data with Scholia. We deployed these methods as part of a pilot project in which we contributed data about a small but unique school on the Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) campus, the IU Lilly Family School of Philanthropy. **NEXT STEPS** Following the completion of our pilot project, we aim to find additional methods for contributing large data collections to Wikidata. Specifically, we seek to contribute scholarly communication data that the library already maintains in other systems. We are also facilitating Wikidata edit-a-thons to increase the library's familiarity with the knowledge base and our capacity to contribute to the site.






