Boston, August 18, 1840.

Dear bro. George:

5-5 - I am most happy to give you the assurance, over my own "sign manual," that my journeyings abroad have come to an end, and that I am once more safely restored to the bosom of my family, and to a choice circle of near and dear friends. A fortnight ago, this day, I was in Liverpool! Our trip across the Atlantic, in the new steam-ship Acadia, occupied only about 12 days - which is altogether unprecedented in the annals of navigation. Ask dear bro. James what he thinks of it. By the way, my heart is gladdened to hear how contented he has been in Brooklyn, and that his health is much better. How happy I am to get back again, it is impossible for me to find words to say. My heart is almost as full of delight as the Atlantic is of water. Give me the land of my nativity above all other lands! And yet England, Scotland, and Ireland, are all beautiful - very beautiful. I have been received, in each of those kingdoms, in the most flattering manner, and could not have desired a warmer reception. To-day, the Lord willing, I mean to see you and all the dear ones, face to face, on Friday afternoon. Helen and the babe will accompany me; and probably friend Johnson. We shall remain with you until Monday. All are well at home. I long to see dear little Georgie, as well as your own dear children. My brotherly regards to Mary, Sarah, and Catharine, and affectionate remembrances to friends here, Scarborough, &c.
