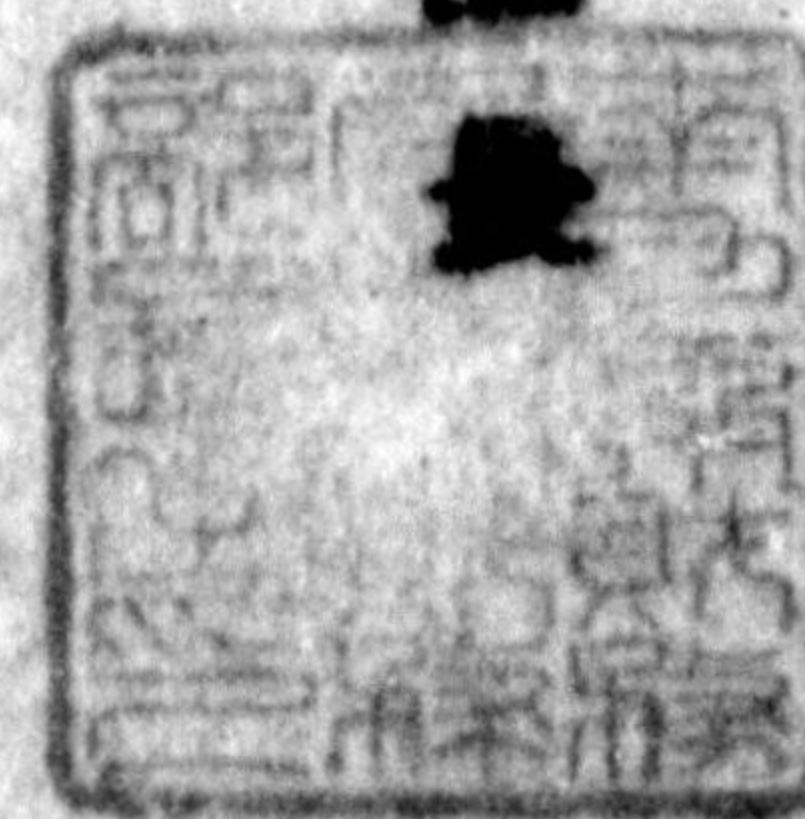

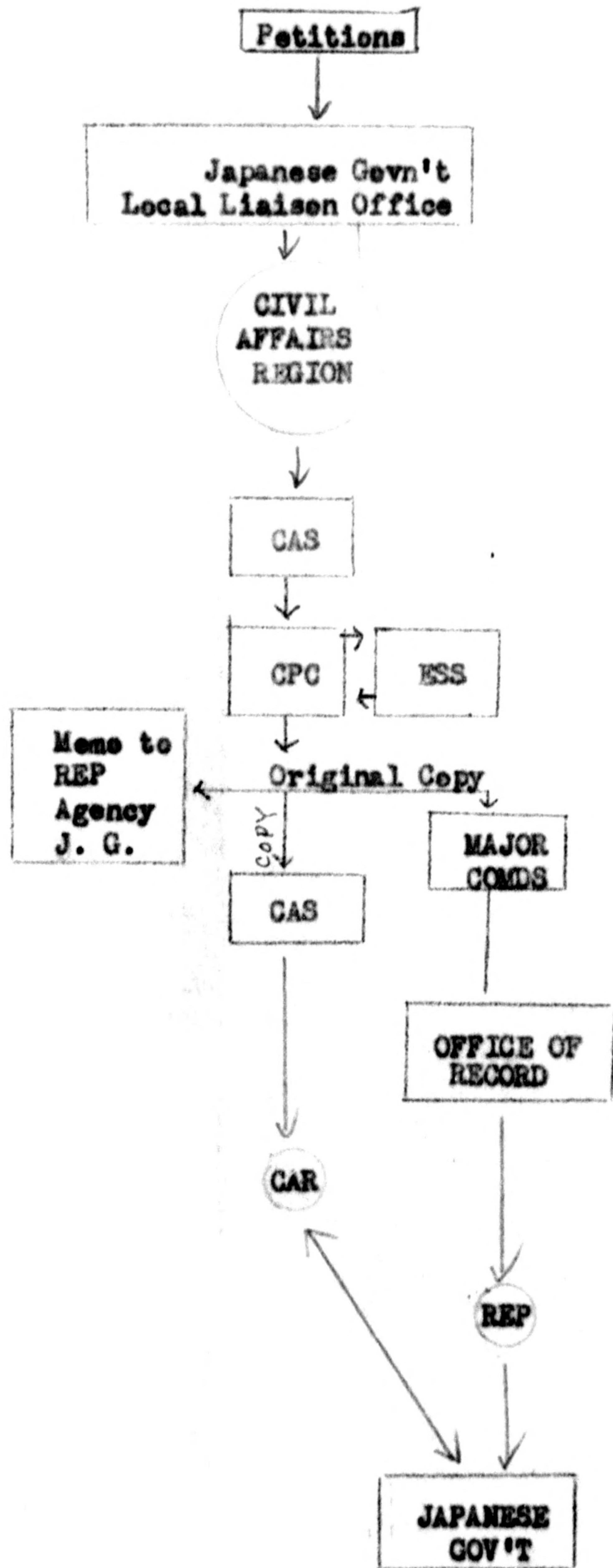

These items can be further released from the category of Former Military Supplies in accordance with the provisions of Operational Instructions No. 5, GHQ, SCAP, dated 10 April 1950.

The tactical forces are responsible for releasing subject items to the JG and accounting to this headquarters thru the Japan Logistical Command of such tonnage so released.

CAR will conduct surveillance over the JG to ensure the carrying out of their responsibilities in rendering the items unserviceable.

The Japanese Government is responsible for the disabling of reparation items.

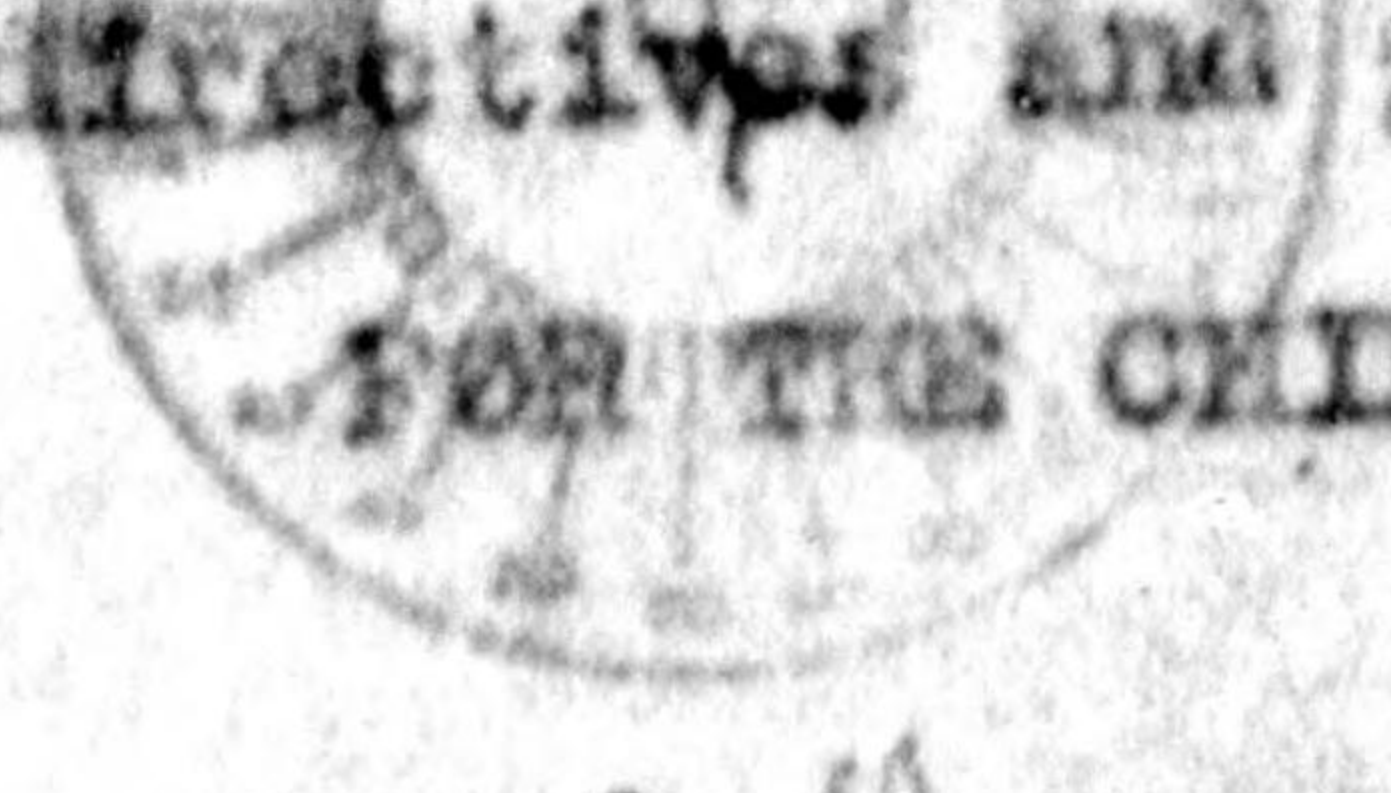

SUBJECT: Petition on Reclamation Land

There was the branch of Tokyo No. 2 Army Arsenal in Ozai-mura, Kita-Kaibe-gun, Oita Prefecture. The Koyuri Aiji In, orphanage, operated by Solari Carumela in Boppu had a plan to establish branch using a part of the arsenal. We, farmers, met the officials of the orphanage in August 1949 explaining the condition of the village, asked them to postpone the plan and we understood that they accepted the request.

Later on, the arsenal was transferred to the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry for reclamation by kind consideration of the Occupation Forces. The Agricultural Land Commission of the village drew up the plan to divide the land among the farmers. It was approved by the agricultural land commission of the prefecture. We completed the payment of the land to the government and we reclaimed the land with sweat, thanking to the Occupation Forces and are now increasing the production.

The village have very small farming area. The average area for each farmer is about 3 tan. When the branch arsenal was established about 105 cho of the farm land was taken for it's site and the management of agriculture of the village became very difficult.

Now, we farmers, are suprised to hear that the orphanage will use 45,000 tsubo of the land for it's branch as they had planned. It was great sorrow for us, farmers, to lose the land, we love just like our children, during war time. Now we have to lose the same land, we recovered after the war. Have we give up the land, we have already paid for, to the orphanage? We have to replan our agricultural management with the same difficulty as in time of the war.

We have to change the plan or dividing the land. To affect the payment of the land to the government and we fear that it will put the village, which is trying to recover from the war peacefully, into confusion.

We beg your kind consideration to the petition. However, we have no objection to the establishment of the orphanage in the village. We are rather willing to assist it.


