SUBJECT: Annual General Inspection of G-2/CIC Confidential Funds and Property

1. References:

- b. Far East Command Confidential Supply Plan with Annex A, dated 30 August 1948.
- c. SR 36-10-5, dated 14 September 1949.

2. In a recent action within the Far East Command the question of inspection of G-2/CIC Confidential Funds arose during an annual general inspection by a local Inspector General. Recommendation concerning this matter was referred to the Chief of Staff, Far East Command for decision with the following result:

a. CIC Confidential Funds in the Far East Command are exempted from annual and special general inspections by Inspectors General unless specifically requested by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, General Headquarters, Far East Command.

b. The scope of the annual and special general inspections by Inspectors General concerning the activities of CIC units will be limited to supply and administrative matters, qualifications or sufficiency of personnel, and working conditions.

3. The normal audit of confidential fund and supply accounts of field agencies of G-2 within the Far East Command will continue to be made in accordance with paragraphs 6 and 7 of Annex A to reference 1b, as authorized under the provisions of paragraph 5e, reference 1a.

4. The scope of annual and special general inspections of CIC property and supply accounts as referred to in paragraph 2b above will not include SIOIE property and supplies. Audit of such property and supplies will be performed semi-annually and at such other times as deemed appropriate by special auditors appointed locally in accordance with reference 1c.

5. It is desired that this information be disseminated to all subordinate agencies utilizing Confidential Funds and/or SIOIE property and supplies.



TO : Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Eighth Army, APO 343.

1. Answers to questions outlined in paragraphs e, f, g, and h of Memorandum for the Inspector General, U. S. Army from Director of Intelligence, Department of Army, dated 22 December 1948, subject: "Annual General Inspections FY '49 of Major Commands" (Incl 1) are as follows:

a. Paragraph e - CIC coverage is adequate within the area represented. The distribution of field detachments covers every major political sub-division of Japan.

b. Paragraph f - CIC personnel are utilized in accordance with policies set forth in paragraph 87b (5) TM 30-215. Authority contained in paragraph 32b, TM 30-215 is utilized to relieve undesirable personnel from CIC duty. Transfer of personnel for cause is accomplished without prior approval of Chief, CIC at CIC Center, Camp Holabird, Maryland. Transfer of personnel without cause is accomplished only after approval of Chief, CIC at CIC Center, Camp Holabird, Maryland. In the case of transfer of personnel, CIC follows paragraph 32, TM 30-215 and indicates the reason for transfer on the Monthly Change and Strength Report.

c. Paragraph g - The transfer of CIC functions from Department of Army to Air Force is progressing satisfactorily.

d. Paragraph h - The equipment and supplies authorized CIC detachments are utilized solely by CIC.

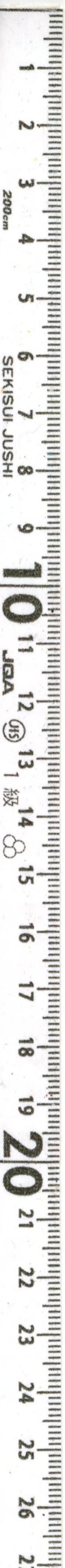
