ld Easel for bulletin board:

The easel is needed in order to be able to use the bulletin board in more than one place. As an instructional aid the bulletin board may be moved from one room to another. Also it can be used outdoors for posting maps and charts during instructional periods. Also the easel could be used without the bulletin board. For instance the company commander could use any available wooden, cardboard backing for mounting charts and maps.

li and ln Ruler, wooden 6" and Map Board

The 6" ruler and the mapboard is need for use of the student during classes in map reading. Excellent maps of Scale 1:50,000 are available of areas in the vicinity of each camp. The student with a map, map board, and ruler will thus be able to measure distances on the map fairly accurately. He will be able to compare distances marched to distances measured on the map. Two hundred of each are being ordered for each Battalion so that the items can be rotated among the companies of the Battalion. In the event wooden rulers are too expensive paper rulers would be acceptable. However it is recommended that three times as many paper rulers be ordered or 600 per Battalion.

MEMORANDUM TO: Chief, Operations Division

SUBJECT: Staff study regarding Graphic Training Aids for NPR

1. Problem. To determine the feasibility, cost and processes involved in remaking appropriate US Army GTA charts and Film Strips for the use of the NPR, using NPR enlistees as models, indigenous labor and reproduction services, and equipment actually issued to the NPR.

2. Discussion of problem. See Inclosure 1.

3. Conclusions.

a. That GTA's and Film Strips would be of considerable value in future training; in makeup training; and in the training of future replacements.

b. The use of Film Strips would be especially valuable in the training of instructors and in other types of unit schools which may be conducted indoors or near buildings.

c. (1) The cost of preparation of one set of GTA's for "First Aid" (reduced to 25 pages) would be approximately as follows:

(2) It is estimated that the initial set of these charts can be ready for distribution 30 days after approval of project.

4. Recommendations.

a. That a project be approved for the procurement of indigenous services and materials to print 200 sets of a modified U.S.GTA on "First Aid", size 28" x 40" (with instructions on back), and if satisfactory results are indicated, that additional sets covering all appropriate subjects in the training programs be initiated. (See Incl 3)

b. That a review board consisting of one member of the Training Branch, one Japanese translator, and one member of the technical service branch concerned, and a Japanese NPR representative be directed to review each project undertaken within a. above, both in draft form and in final form before distribution. This action is essential in order to eliminate discrepancies in logic and in translation. The Surgeon concurs in this action for "aids" with which he is concerned.

c. Film Strips. In order to avoid delay of submission of this study concerning GTA's, the study concerning Film Strips to be continued and submitted separately at a later date.

DISCUSSION

1. General. Pursuant to verbal instructions received concerning the project, the following considerations have been given:

a. Assumptions:

- (1) That all photographs and or drawings must depict Japanese personnel.
- (2) All equipment shown must be that actually available for issue to NPR.
- (3) Combat conditions must not be shown. Emphasis must be placed upon police type activity.
- (4) All photographic and printing work must be done by Japanese contractors.
- (5) Unessential charts and unessential pictures on other charts should be eliminated in the interest of economy and clarity.

2. Feasibility and Necessity.

a. The issuance of some type visual aids to supplement the current series of training instructions being issued to the NPR is considered of utmost urgency. The need for adequate graphical presentation to supplement the verbal instruction in appropriate subject matter is generally accepted in our own instructional procedures. The same procedures will go far toward the alleviation of the language barrier which is an obstacle of great magnitude in conveying instruction based upon translations from English into Japanese. It is axiomatic that any picture, chart, or diagram is worth many words, regardless of the elocution of the instructor.

b. In exploring the feasibility of accomplishing the GTA project within the assumptions noted in Paragraph 1. above, conferences have been held with the following individuals:

- (1) Major Greer, Procurement Officer Logistics Division for advice and recommendations as to possible Japanese contractors.

- (2) Mr Murakashi, Japanese representative of the Hosakawa Printing Co., Ltd, who is prepared to provide all Photographic and Printing work required for the Project.
- (3) Lt. Col. Mott, CO of Camp McKnight who is prepared to furnish NPR Personnel as Models and such equipment as he has on hand as subjects for the Photographs.
- (4) Sgt. Blake, NCO in charge of CAS Annex Drafting Office, who is prepared to furnish the necessary assistance.
- (5) Col., Shellenberger, Chief of Medical Branch, Logistics Division, regarding procedures for review for technical aspects.

3. Procedure. Under the present structure of the CAS the following procedure may be used to produce a GTA:

a. An Officer of Training Branch will Modify and re-compose each page of a proposed GTA including the rewording of the instructions to conform to policy restrictions, noting the necessary revision of composition and photography, and will then have all necessary language translated into Japanese including the instructions appearing on the backs of the charts.

b. Officer preparing revised GTA will present plans for same to a board of review composed of himself, a representative of the technical branch concerned, a member of NPR, and a translator. This board will check the material for the following factors.

- (1) Technical Service Officer: For correctness of material to be shown, for logic and for conformity with current issues of material. (Example: - Revised chart should not show injured man using sulfadiazine tablets if Japanese kits will not include same).
- (2) Japanese NPR member. For usefulness to the instructor and understandability to the Japanese policeman.
- (3) Translator. Will assist in resolving any discrepancies of translation.
- (4) Training Branch Officer. Will record and make necessary changes on proposed copy as a result of actions taken during (1) (2) and (3) above.

c. Photographs will be made by Japanese photographer and prints furnished this office for paste-up of final composition and the application of the required language notes. The drafting section will assist in this action. This final paste up will not be less than 1/3 the size of the finished poster.

d. Review board will again check.

e. A duplicate of each page of the paste-up mentioned in c. above will be prepared on letter size paper and submitted to the Chief of CAS for approval before submission to the printer for final action.

f. Finished sets will be returned to CAS for distribution and stock.

4. Cost vs size and composition.

a. Consideration has been given to the following adaptations of the GTA pictures:

- (1) Reproduce photographically as ours are presently shown and approximately the same size.
- (2) Reduce size in order to make as economical as possible.
- (3) Have artist draw all pictures in line drawing in order to reduce cost of printing as much as possible.
- (4) Omit Instructions from back of page.
- (5) Print a separate chart on each side of each page.
- (6) Reduce the number of pages now shown.
- (7) Make all pages in single color.

b. Of all the above considerations, only the following were found to be significant as to effect on cost.

- (1) Size - Due to the dimensions of the standard papers available, the only choice appears to be either full size (same as US GTA's) or 1/2 size, since any intermediate sizes would have to use the larger sheets of paper cut down thereby creating considerable waste. Careful consideration has been given to the half-size chart; however, it is not recommended, because it is not considered large enough to be clear to a company sized group.
- (2) Color - Material saving can be had by omitting or modifying to Monochrome all charts now printed in color.
- (3) Number of pages can be reduced.
- (4) All other modifications were discussed with the printer, but found to be uneconomical when weighed against the shortcomings of the finished product.

5. Cost. For cost estimates submitted by the Hosokawa Printing Company, See Inclosure 2. The figures shown represent the cost per page in quantities of 200 copies. If contract is let for a large number of different GTA's these figures will be reduced somewhat due to his ability to buy the large paper in bulk quantities.

6. Time. About 15 working days will be required to complete the processing of the plates and the printing.

7. Film Strips. In order to avoid delay of submission of this study concerning GTA's, the study concerning Film Strips will be continued and submitted separately at a later date.

1. It is desired to make CIE 16 mm films and suitable Japanese pictures available to members of National Police Reserves in the Tohoku Region as a medium of Reorientation.
2. There are five camps in Miyagi which have approximately 13,000 reservists and one camp each in Aomori and Yamagata Prefectures which together have another 3,000 men.
3. The lack of projectors and screens to make loans of equipment to each camp is hindering this project.
4. Present demands for projectors received by the A-V Librarians excludes the furnishing of this equipment at prefectural levels.
5. This information is submitted to justify request herewith for seven more sets of equipment, one set to be placed in each of the seven camps, thus eliminating costs of transportation except for that of films.
