1. Information is available to G-4 that representative of the D/A will meet with representatives of CINCFE in MARBO in the near future to give on-the-ground disposition instructions for Army supplies now stored in MARBO which are or will be excess to the reduced Army and Air Force garrisons planned for Guam.
2. Since it is known here that there are quantities of unidentified, unclassified and unsegregated Army supplies stored in MARBO, appropriate action is to direct CG MARBO to take immediate action to reduce these quantities and give the reason.
3. By this action, the above is accomplished.
4. Initiated case. G-4 action complete.

1. The probability that current plans, not yet firmly established, will result in a major reduction in strength of Army troops stationed in the Marianas-Bonins Command indicate that accelerated action must be taken to identify, classify, inventory and segregate all unidentified, unclassified and unsegregated Army supplies within the Marianas-Bonins Command. This accelerated action must be attained in order that maximum quantities of usable Army supplies may be obtained for use elsewhere in the Far East Command, shipped to the Zone of the Interior, or placed in long term storage in Marianas-Bonins Command prior to a major reduction in personnel of your command which would endanger or make impossible the accomplishment of such an objective.

2. It is contemplated that representatives of the Department of Army and CINCFE will meet representatives of your command in Marianas-Bonins Command in sixty to ninety days to give on-the-ground disposition instructions for all Group A, B and C supplies. It is ^{expected} hoped that by that time the progress of identification, classification, segregation and storage of supplies will be such that the major problem of storage and disposal of supplies in Marianas-Bonins Command can be solved.

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3. To guide and assist you in the preliminary phases of this program it is visualized that property now in Marianas-Bonins Command will fall into four general categories:

a. Group D. Those supplies which because of their present classification, condition or type may be disposed of under present policies and directives.

b. The remainder which because of their classification, condition, type or life expectancy constitute a real asset to the Army and;

- (1) Are required for other areas of the Far East Command.
- (2) Are not required for other areas of the Far East Command but are economically transportable to the Zone of the Interior and required there for reserve stockage. This includes equipment economically repairable but which cannot be repaired within the facilities of the Far East Command.
- (3) Are not required for other areas of the Far East Command and not required for reserve stockage in the Zone of the Interior, but which because of their classification, condition, value and life expectancy warrant storage in Marianas-Bonins Command against long range or emergency requirements.

4. Based on the progress of identification, classification and segregation of property, the on-the-ground conference referred to in paragraph 2 above will be arranged at that time ^{when} ~~where~~ major decisions can be reached as to disposal.

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5. With respect to storage in the Marianas-Bonins Command area, the Commanding General, Far East Air Forces has advised that approximately 100 warehouses in the Marama area can be made available to you for your use. Your Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4 (Lt. Col. Van Dine) was made acquainted with this offer during his last visit to this headquarters.

6. It is visualized by this headquarters that the storage referred to above should be obtained as early as available and that as rapidly as practicable those supplies which cannot be adequately stored elsewhere in storage available to you should, as they are identified and classified, be moved into this storage where they may remain in long term storage or from where they may be shipped to other areas of the Far East Command or the Zone of the Interior.

7. To aid you in reducing to a minimum double handling of supplies, ^{list of} supplies by technical services which are desired for shipment to other areas of the Far East Command ^{will be furnished in the near future} ~~are listed in Inclosures 1 to~~ herewith. As amounts of these supplies become available for shipment, your requests for necessary shipping will be met by this headquarters.

8. It is requested that you advise this headquarters not later than 20 May 1949 when you estimate the conference referred to in paragraph 2 above can be held.



5. With respect to storage in the Uorbo area the CG Jap has advised that approximately 100 warehouses in the Morawa area can be made available to you for your use. Your Assistant Chief of Staff, G4 (Col. Van Dine) was made acquainted with this offer during his last visit to the headquarters.

6. It is realized by this headquarters that the storage referred to above should be obtained as early as available and that as rapidly as practicable those supplies which cannot be adequately stored elsewhere in storage available to you should as they are identified and classified be moved into this storage where they may remain in long term storage or from where they may be shipped to other areas of the Far East Command or the Zone of the Interior.

Paragraph 1 a, reference above, established Air Force ownership of Army Technical Service property appearing on accountable records of Air Force Installations as of 29 September 1948, and further establishes Air Force ownership of all property entered thereon subsequent to foregoing date. The allocations, as directed, will also establish specific equities in Army depot stocks and verified dues-in of major end items on effective date of allocation. However, depot storage and issue responsibilities remain unchanged at this time, except for controlling issues of Air Force credits of major end items.

3. In view of above, it becomes incumbent upon FEAF, subsequent to allocations, to control issues of FEAF credits established in all Technical Services Depots, Far East Command. To effect necessary control, it is proposed to assign editing functions of FEAF requisitions for major end items as a responsibility of the Commanding General, Far East Air Materiel Command.

4. To aid in the performance of above editing functions, it is further proposed to authorize the Commanding General, Far East Air Materiel Command direct communications with all Technical Services depots, Far East Command, to obtain following information:

a. Total FEAF equity in depot stocks and verified dues-in on effective date of allocation for each major end item.

b. Copy of shipping documents covering shipments of major end items for each Technical Service depot to FEAF installations.

c. Copy of shipping documents on incoming shipments received at Technical Services depots indicating FEAF credits of major end items.

Letter AG 400 SUP-~~4~~-Sp, to CONCFE, subj: "Supply Procedures Subsequent to Allocation of Major End Items".

d. Copy of shipping documents covering turn-ins of excess major end items by FEAF installations. Commanding General, Far East Air Materiel Command to effect redistribution as requirements exist, but subject to CINCFC approval for transfers between major operational commands.

e. Copy of approved Inventory Adjustment Reports effecting FEAF credits.

5. In view of the minor quantity and slow moving nature of the major end items involved, it is believed that the information requested above, can be provided with minimum interference to normal depot operations. Although an effective date is not announced in paragraph 4 of the attached letter, it is very likely 1 April 1949, since GHQ letter, subject, "Allocation of Stocks Between the Army and the Air Force in Overseas Commands," file AG 400 GD, dated 16 Nov 1948, directed that allocation be completed by 1 April 1949.

2. The information to be obtained by the Air Force as outlined in paragraph 4 indicates that the Air Force intends to establish a memorandum stock record for editing purposes. Paragraph 4 a covers data necessary to establish an initial record and paragraphs 4b, c, d, and e pertain to various stock accounting documents which, when posted, will reflect changes in the status of Air Force depot credits. Since the number

of major end items is small, no appreciable effort will be required to furnish these documents to the Air Force, except for the document referred to in paragraph 4 c. In Japan, it will be impossible to furnish this information promptly, since the Port does not use the Army Shipping Document as prescribed in Paragraph 10 a (4) TM 38-705. This practice on the part of the Port does not permit the Depot to reconcile promptly receipts with dues-in records. Under present procedure, the advanced copies of the incoming documents will indicate only the amount shipped by the zone of interior and not the amount received by the Depot from the Port. The current Port procedure of not using the Army Shipping Document as a document to ship to the Depot will cause a considerable delay in adjusting dues-in records and posting Air Force receipts as Air Force credits. yes

3. The value of an Air Force memorandum stock record maintained by the Air Force for Air Force editing purposes is questionable because it will be out of phase with the Depot record, since quantities ordered to be shipped by editors do not always agree with quantities shipped by the Depot, and inventory adjustments, both plus and minus as well as receipts from the zone of interior, will of necessity always be posted to the memorandum record subsequent to the posting to the Depot record. This will result in both over and under editing and may easily lead to the expenditure of considerable effort in connection with the reconciliation of the memorandum records with the Depot record.

4. The Quartermaster feels that where EAM is used the Air Force should use the same EAM listing as is used by the Depot in editing. In this way, the Air Force will be using the best information available when editing requisitions. Where EAM is not used, then Air Force editing should be accomplished by Air Force Liaison Personnel on duty at Army Depots. In this way all editing actions can be effectively coordinated, especially cut-off in editing as well as suspension in editing which will be necessary in connection with inventories and inventory adjustments.

5. The Quartermaster also feels that in order for Army Depots to maintain accurate and up-to-date records of Air Force credits, it will be necessary for the TC throughout the Far East Command to comply with the provisions of paragraph a (4), TM 38-705.

6. The effect of the proposed procedure on FY 1949 Army Funding Program is negligible. Budget estimates submitted in June 1948 took into

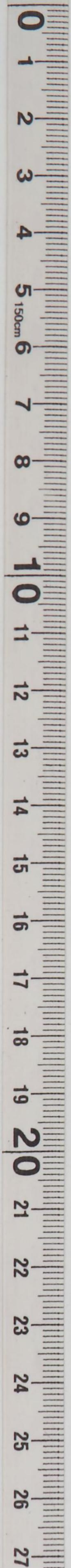

7. The FY 1951 Budget Directive which will go to the commands in March 1949 contains general instructions for including cost of such procedure in the FY 1950 and FY 1951 Budget estimates. Those commands which have IBM stock record accounting should experience very little interference with normal Depot operations. MARBO, which has manual stock record accounts, will experience more difficulty. This will make it necessary for them to study the proposed procedure more thoroughly in order to arrive at a reasonable estimate of added work load and funds "Attributable to Air."

1. A review of the contents of FEAF letter, subject, "Supply Procedures Subsequent to allocation of Major End Items," 5 Feb 49, has been made from the standpoint of Army Ordnance ability to comply with the proposed provisions therein.

2. It is believed that all information desired by FEAF, reference paragraph 4 inclosed letter, concerning serviceable Ordnance major end items can be furnished from existing or future depot records with the possible exception of certain shipping documents on incoming shipments, reference paragraph 4c. Delay or non-receipt of certain of these documents is the current experience at Ordnance Depots in FEC. Emphasis is made of serviceable major end items. No record is currently maintained of credits to Air Force on unserviceable items. 45

3. Preparation of budget forecasts for storage and maintenance of Ordnance items furnished the Air Force can be accomplished on a percentage basis for each depot. A breakdown of these expenditures are presently required from the major commands for preparation of Form 1080a Voucher for transfer between appropriations and/or funds.

4. It is recommended that if provisions of the attached letter are approved, that effective date of allocation be established as 1 April 1949, reference paragraph 1b Army Memo 700-10-19 and AF letter 67-12, 29 Sept 48.

5. It will be necessary for Ordnance, GHQ to receive a breakdown from the major commands of Air Force credits on allocated stocks in Army Ordnance Depots, if provisions of attached letter are approved in order that proper control of redistribution between commands can be effected.

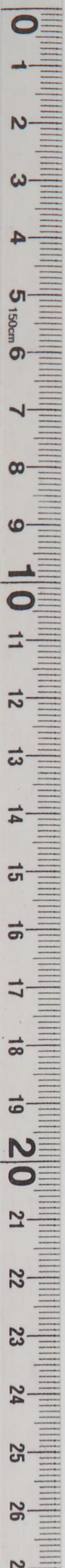
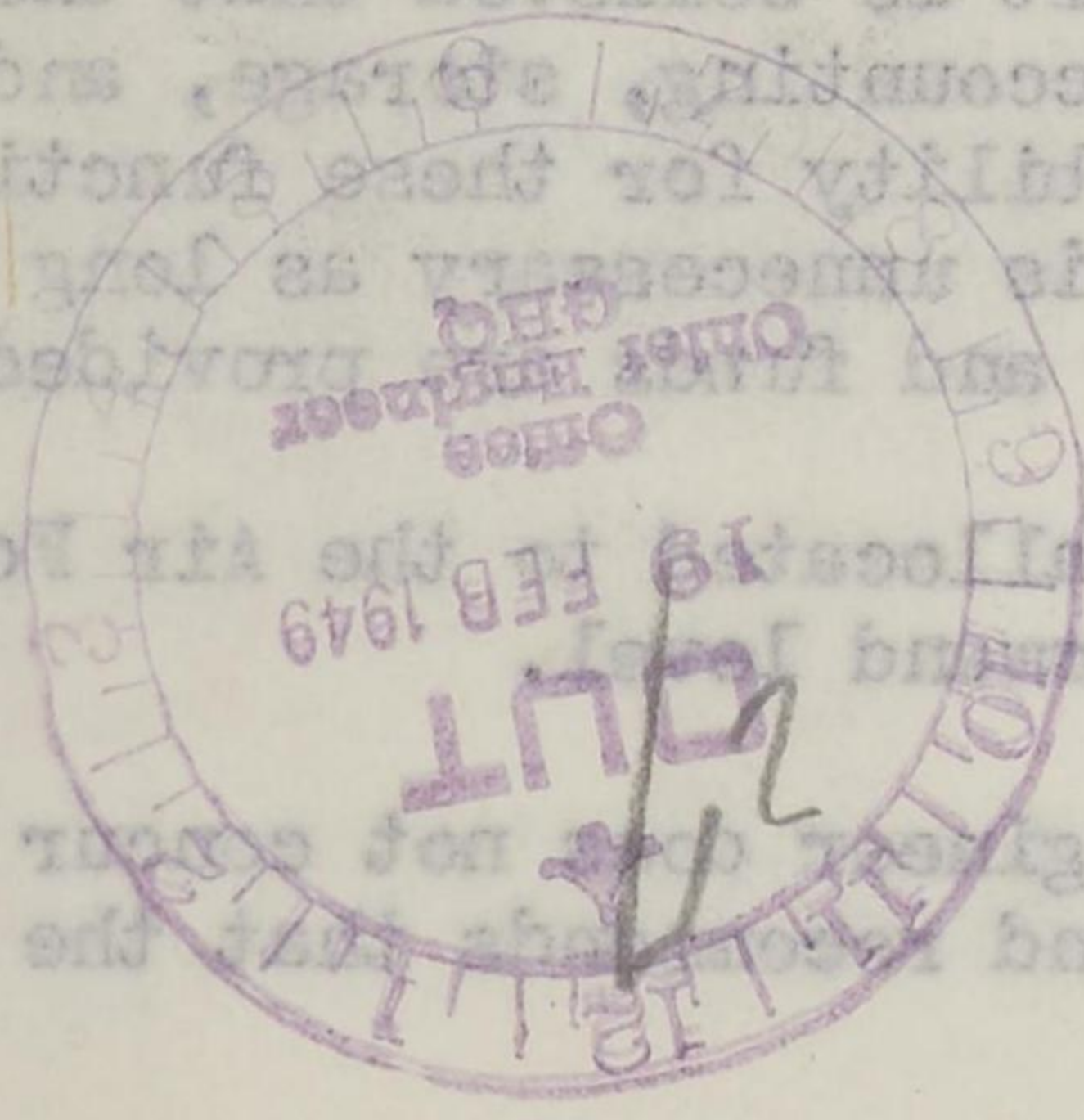

- a. It is the opinion of this office that the furnishing of the information outlined in paragraph 4 of Far East Air Forces letter will involve an additional work load and thereby will require increases in personnel.

1. G-4 Sup (Maj Fuller) report of staff visit to MARBO indicated that MARBO with present strength would not be able to fully comply with requirements of SERV PROJECT; receive, warehouse and provide in maintenance storage for retention level stocks; and to effect segregation and probable roll-up outshipments. Report recommended that 300 qualified personnel be sent to MARBO for 90 days TDY to aid in classification and inspection of large stocks on hand. Report referred to CINCFE rad C-67912, dated 17 Feb 49 to MARBO (from MARBO representative, Lt Col Dinsmore) which advised that General Maris desired General Hardy's personal comment or concurrence in a cut of 700 spaces to be prorated among all services except Engr with the understanding that depot operations would not be hampered thereby. This cut would make ceiling 8060. Present and projected continental strength less than 8060 make this purely a paper proposition.

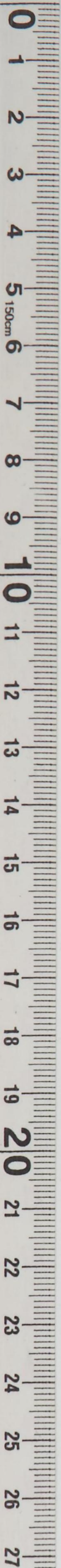
