I hereby submit to you the report on the above subject. We shall be much obliged if we could have the honour of 1st Lt. Wilson's, chief of Public Welfare section, presence at the conference.

1. Purpose: In view of the various points of the existing circumstances, the repatriation relief is earnestly demanded to be strengthened and to be thoroughly understood. The first step for the repatriates to return to the general national life and to harmonize with it together with the good results of their regeneration expected to be realized is to make them recognize and understand the true peace and liberty together with the consultation and guidance on the general affairs of life thoroughly understood and strengthened. For the purpose of attaining more thorough-going understanding of general affairs concerning the repatriation relief on the side of the members of the public welfare committee fulfilling these important duties on the first line of life, and with an aim at making deliberation and conference on the urgent problems such as Child Welfare Law and the System of Public Welfare Committee, this consultative conference is to be held.

Consideration of Comparative Survey List of Ratio and Average payment for Needy person.

This investigation has been under way since April, 1949 based upon the guidance of the Kochi Civil Affairs Team.

1. Purport.

Investigation and report items based upon the Livelihood Protection Law are so many that the protection situation can be known. It is aimed at, however, that proper and adequate protection should be made in keeping with the actual situation of this prefecture by giving further into the details.

2. Effect and operation of investigation list.

What have not been inserted in other lists based upon the Livelihood Protection Law, for instance, the number of households enjoying incomes among those being given Public Assistance and their average incomes, can have the proper enforcement expected by being able to know the earning and laboring abilities and the laboring situation and by comparing the allowance standard sums in contrast with the average subsidy allowance sums per capita per month.

However, the data are those of only 5 months since April this year. So that, they cannot be said sufficient as such at present, but it is expected that the effect will be increased in due course of time. According to the situation of the protected made known by the data up to date, the following measures are being taken and the future policy will be worked out to fully enforce the protection.

(Investigation List No. 1, 2 and 3)

1. Numbers of households and their members receiving livelihood assistance and their ratio against the whole population.

According to the investigation 2, those whose livelihood has been assisted in, have been more or less increased in number, but the increased percentage is so small and its ratio against the whole population (the result of the 2nd national simultaneous survey) is not so high from the national stand-point, that it is thought rather proper.

However, the actual situation (mentioned below) of the vocational breakdown as of the end of August includes the 2nd and 3rd card caste. This seems rather inevitable in view of the present social situation so that it is hoped that some laws should be revised for proper welfare measures to be taken positively through the Protection Law for those 2nd and 3rd card classes. This prefecture has been trying hard for the guidance of civilian livelihood committees (Minseiin Committee) so that they may work out welfare steps for those 2nd and 3rd card.

classes. The increasing percentage of agricultural difficulties necessitates us to turn our attention towards the depression of agrarian communities and the attitudes of widows there.

Classified according to Cocations:

Farmers 15%, traders 3%, industrialists 1%, fishermen 3%, public office employees 2%, workers on crafts-men 3% day workers 25%, home craft industrists ("Kanai tekogyo") 13%, helpers to other houses 2%, company employees and others 6% and jobless 25%.
(Investigation No. (4) (5) (6) (7) (8))

2. Situation of difrayment of the life bounty ("Seikatsufujokin") and revenue of the needy. By investigation from No. 4 to 8, we can see the amount of the life bounty and revenue of the needy, but out of the households of those granted with the life bounty, those which have revenues show from 85% to 89%, according to the investigation sheets, which shows gradual increase, but this indicates we think, that number of unsuccessful households which had revenues is increasing, instead of that the households receiving life bounty are increasing their revenues (see gradual increase of average amounts of life bounty defrayed as shown in No. (5)), therefore we are exerting our best to make the most of the life bounty (in kind) positively for them.

3. Regarding the medical bounty ("Iryo-fujo")
(investigation sheets No.(9) (10) (11) (12) (13) (14) (15) and (16)).
By the investigation sheets from No.9 to (16) we can see the situation of the medical bounty defrayment, the number of those receiving medical bounty is increasing as shown in investigation No.9, and it can not be helped to some extent because it is a notional trend. As to the kinds of the disease, those blonging to the respiratory disease show 40% of the whole requiring increase of defrayment of medical expenses and long period of treatment. We, therefore, wish the Tuberculoses Prevention Law to be revised, and medical establishments to be set up in Kochi City and other main towns and villages as soon as possible, and we wish the revision of the Law especially.

As to the households receiving the life bounty, when No.2 of the investigation sheet is compared with No. 11 of the same, one to four or five has sick persons - a very high percentage - and as the needy lack their knowledge on saintation we are exerting to enlighten.

4. About the movenmet of the needy:

(Investigation sheets No.(17) (18) (19) (20) and (21))

Investigation sheets from No. 17 to 21 afford us good investigation in the movement of the needy, and regarding No. 17 and No. 18 which tell us the new cases of those which began to receive the life and medical bounties, we pay much attention, and we are leading the authorities of city, towns, and villages by examining and comparing with the cases to suspend or cancel the defrayment of the said bounties which are described in the investigation sheets No. 19 and 20.

Re: Correspondence about clothing for relief.

I beg to report to you as follows about the result of investigation concerning the above subject of Akaoka Machi under control of this district office, of which you inquired by telephone on 25th June.

While Mituzumi Minura (clerk) of the town office of those days was keeping in the storehouse of the town office the list of articles and quantities mentioned below, out of the clothes (women's drawers, georgette, two pieces, hemp working shirts, underwears, girls' clothes, and children pants etc.) for repatriates' relief this office rationed in about May 1947 and forwarded to Akaoka Machi in August the same year, he was demanded the clothes from families suffering from clothes repeatedly, and distributed the goods to a town people (Items and quantities are mentioned below) at his own and independent will without presenting a matter for consideration of welfare committee (name of those days) or without

approval of a town chief and a vice chief in authority over him.

In about October the same year, it was decided that the government building of the town office should be applied to the Akaoka Procurators' office, and it removed the office to the present location beside the primary school. The said store house was provided with the key so that the town office kept the goods in the store house and left the key in care of the Akaoka Procurators' office, but at the time of the removal, it lost papers relative to the goods being taken up with all sorts of work. While the goods were left as they were without any information to this district office, the clerk in charge was changed in January 1948, and it was decided Akio Minura (a present clerk in charge) was to take over the business. However, as far as the above stated goods were concerned, Akio Minura did not take over the business on the ground that a former Mituzaki Minura should be held responsible for the undisposed goods. Thus, while the goods were left as they were, a treasurer of the same town asked for the advance money of the said clothes to a town chief, so that for the first time a town chief could become aware of the existence of the undisposed clothes.

Therefore, the town office immediately transported the goods in the store house to the office and kept them in the night-duty room. (At that time, the total quantity was not confirmed excluding three points damaged by rats.)

After that, a townsman saw the above goods in the night-duty room, and owing to the spread of the unsavoury reputation among townspeople, the town office was compelled to dispose the goods as early as possible. In March this year, it distributed all the remaining quantity (This is mentioned on the following list) through the decision of the welfare committee conference, whereas as the result of the comparison with the allocation list of the prefecture and the district office, the lacking quantity became clear as per the separate sheet. It is very clear the above case happened owing to delay of business and neglect of duty. Besides, even some quantities, it is most regrettable that the relief goods to repatriates were distributed at an individual will of a clerk in charge through no decision of the welfare committee's council. A town chief, feeling keenly the responsibility of his negligence about the superintendence, submitted his resignation to a chairman of the town assembly the other day, and all employees concerned tendered their resignations to a town chief.

Further, the lacking quantities of the goods, are under investigation by the town autonomy police station carefully at present.

However, although it is stated in the correspondence that the town autonomy police station converted the goods into an illegal channel in collusion with the town office, it is considered there is no such fact as to the above police station.

INFORMATION ON REHABILITATION OF PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED PERSONS

Press Conference
24 June 1949
Welfare Division

The primary function of the Rehabilitation Section, Social Affairs Bureau, Ministry of Welfare is to utilize fully all resources available for an effort to assist physically handicapped persons in Japan to take their normal place in society, and to provide one or more of the rehabilitative services which may be necessary to render a disabled person fit for a remunerative occupation. Among the problems which confront the Ministry of Welfare in developing and carrying out this program to a successful conclusion is the problem of combating old ideas, prejudices, superstitions, and traditions on the part of the general public as they relate to the physically handicapped person. Another problem is in the attitude of many physically handicapped persons in which they feel that they cannot help themselves.

In the past there has been no methodical approach to solving this problem. In order for the Rehabilitation of the Physically Handicapped Program, offered by the Ministry of Welfare to be successful, and to enlist the support and cooperation of the public, to instill confidence and to obtain the cooperation of the physically handicapped persons themselves, the Japanese Government has taken the following steps:

1. Establishment of a Rehabilitation Section in the Social Affairs Bureau of the Ministry of Welfare to direct all public and coordinate these with private services in Japan.
2. Establishment of 12 Physical Rehabilitation Centers in nine prefectures in Japan with adequate facilities to accommodate 1,200 physically handicapped persons.
3. Developed legislation (National Physical Rehabilitation Center at Saga-mihara), in the last session of the Diet, providing for the establishment of a Rehabilitation of the Physically Handicapped Demonstration Center at the First

National Hospital at Sagami. All of the interested government agencies will work together to develop and put into practice a successful Physically Handicapped Rehabilitation Program which will then be introduced in the 12 Physical Rehabilitation Institutions already established by the Ministry of Welfare.

4. Amending Article 23 of Public Law No. 141, of 1947 "The Employment Security Law", which authorized the Ministry of Labor to set up, where desirable, Public Vocational Training Centers, in Ministry of Welfare Rehabilitation Centers. The Employment Security Law formerly did not provide for this specific service within a welfare institution.

5. Establishment of the National Council for the Rehabilitation of the Physically Handicapped. This Council is composed of prominent persons in the medical social and business fields, the heads of progressive public and private institutions, for the handicapped, and personnel of the Ministries of Welfare, Education, Labor and Transportation. This Council renders advice on the development of legislation concerning the physically handicapped, development of programs and coordinates the activities of various private physical rehabilitation agencies.

At the present time proposed rehabilitative legislation is being prepared by the National Council for the Rehabilitation of the Physically Handicapped in close cooperation with the Ministry of Welfare which will cover all types of physical handicap. The proposed law will permit the functioning of a comprehensive physical rehabilitation program fully utilizing, in close cooperation with other interested agencies both public and private, all existing facilities.

There is a great need, on the part of the public, for their understanding and encouragement of the physically handicapped who are making an effort to help themselves. This understanding and encouragement will be furthered by concrete examples of what the physically handicapped can do for themselves with a minimum amount of assistance from either public or private sources.

Record on Return of Contribution received
from Kyōjokai Kochi-ken Chapter

I. The Kochi-ken Chapter of the Kyōjokai
contributed ¥194,000 to the Governor of
Kochi Prefecture as part of construction costs
of the Kochi-ken Minseitōkan on January 10,
1948.

II. The Kochi-ken Chapter of the Kyōjokai was ordered to dissolve on February 1, 1948, according to the wireless to the Governor of the Prefecture from the Second Director of the Na'ijikyoku (Bureau of Home Affairs) of the Prime Minister's Office and the Director of the Bureau of Social Affairs of the Welfare Ministry on January 30, 1948, and the Notification from (Ordinance No. 4 of the Welfare Ministry on January 31, 1948) Sadakichi Hatanomatsu, Welfare Minister, of Ordinance No. 1 of the Prime Minister's Office and Welfare Ministry of 1948 (re Dissolution, etc. of the Kyōjokai, Foundational Juridical Person, Based on the Matter Concerning Orders Issued in Line with the Acceptance of the Potsdam Declaration by Imperial Ordinance No. 542 of 1945), and its whole fortune reverted to the State Treasury and was paid into the Foreign Trade Special Yen Capital Account (Gaiokoku Bōeki Tokubetsu EN Shi'kin Kōza).

III. ¥ 194,600 contributed to Kochi Prefecture by the Kochi-ken Chapter of the Kyōjokai, had to be collected and paid into the above Foreign Trade Special Yen Capital Account by

The Governor of the Prefecture, because disposition which organizations dissolved after August 15, 1945 made of their property became invalid under Article 2 of Government Ordinance No. 238, namely, "Government Ordinance concerning Administration and Disposition of Estates of Dissolved Organizations."

10. The Governor of the Prefecture demanded the supplementary budget for ¥194,600 to be returned at the regular Prefectural Assembly meeting in April. As it was passed, it was paid into the above account through the Kochi Branch of the Bank of Japan under the name of the Governor of the Prefecture on May 27, 1949.

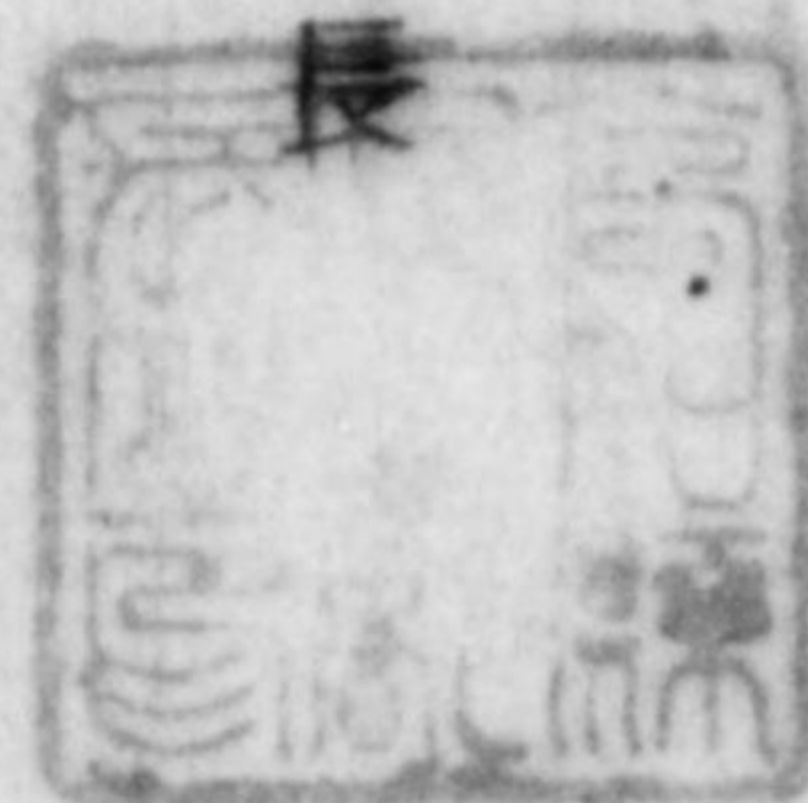

In view of the fact that the successful management of the current social works depends, mainly, on whether the persons engaged in the social works are suitably qualified for the very management or not, the authorities of the Ministry of Welfare have been holding short courses in the re-education of the persons engaged in the social works in ten odd places throughout the country for the purpose of giving them opportunities for the research and practice thru the teaching of theories of various curricula concerned, and elevating their character and ability together with good results of the works concerned expected to be produced. As for Shikoku District, the course is decided to be held in this Prefecture according to the program as shown in the attached paper.

Program of the short course in the social works

1. Name: Short course for the persons engaged in the social works
2. Purpose: The course is held with an aim at the teaching of theories of various curricula concerned with the social works for the purpose of elevating the character and ability of public and government officials now concerned with the social works, thru which opportunities are expected to be given them for the research and practice, and at the re-education of well-educated and leading persons engaged in the social works.
3. Sponsorship: The Ministry of Welfare and the Local Prefectural Authorities.
4. Sanction obtained: Foundation Nippon Shakai Jigyo Kyokai (Japan Social Works Society)
5. Term of the Course: For one week beginning on June 28, 1949
6. Place (a) and the Lodging house for the attendants (b)
 - (a) Labor Hall of Kochi Prefecture, 98, Obiya-machi, Kochi City.
 - (b) Kochi Dai-Kyokai of Tenri-Kyo, 39, Eikokuji-machi, Kochi City.
7. Qualification for the attendant:

The attendant at this Course is requested to fall under any of the following items and to be recommended by Governor of his Prefecture.

 - (1) A person who has been engaged in the social works administration for more than two years consecutively.
 - (2) A person who does not fall under the above item, but is approved to be suitable by Governor.

It is added that welfare committee-men and those connected with the social works facilities are given the opportunity to attend the Course if they desire.
