1. Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, Lieutenant Colonel John S. Wise, O-231087, General Staff Corps, U. S. Army, is recommended for the award of the Legion of Merit.

2. Lieutenant Colonel Wise distinguished himself by exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services as a member of the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, during the period 19 May 1944 to 14 September 1945.





1. Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, Colonel Charles W. McCarthy, O-16667, General Staff Corps (Inf.), U.S. Army, is recommended for the award of the Legion of Merit.

2. Colonel McCarthy distinguished himself by exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services as a member of the Office of the Assistant Secretary of War during the period 1 January 1945 to 22 October 1945.

3. Colonel McCarthy served as Assistant Secretary of the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee during the period 1 January 1945 - 16 March 1945; as Secretary of the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee from 17 March to 22 October 1945; and as Secretary of the Informal Policy Committee on Germany from 15 April to 30 August 1945. In these capacities Colonel McCarthy was responsible for initially organizing and for the subsequent proper functioning of the Secretariat for these high departmental committees which coordinated on a departmental level, politico-military problems of the Government arising in Europe, the Near East, the Middle East, and the Far East. 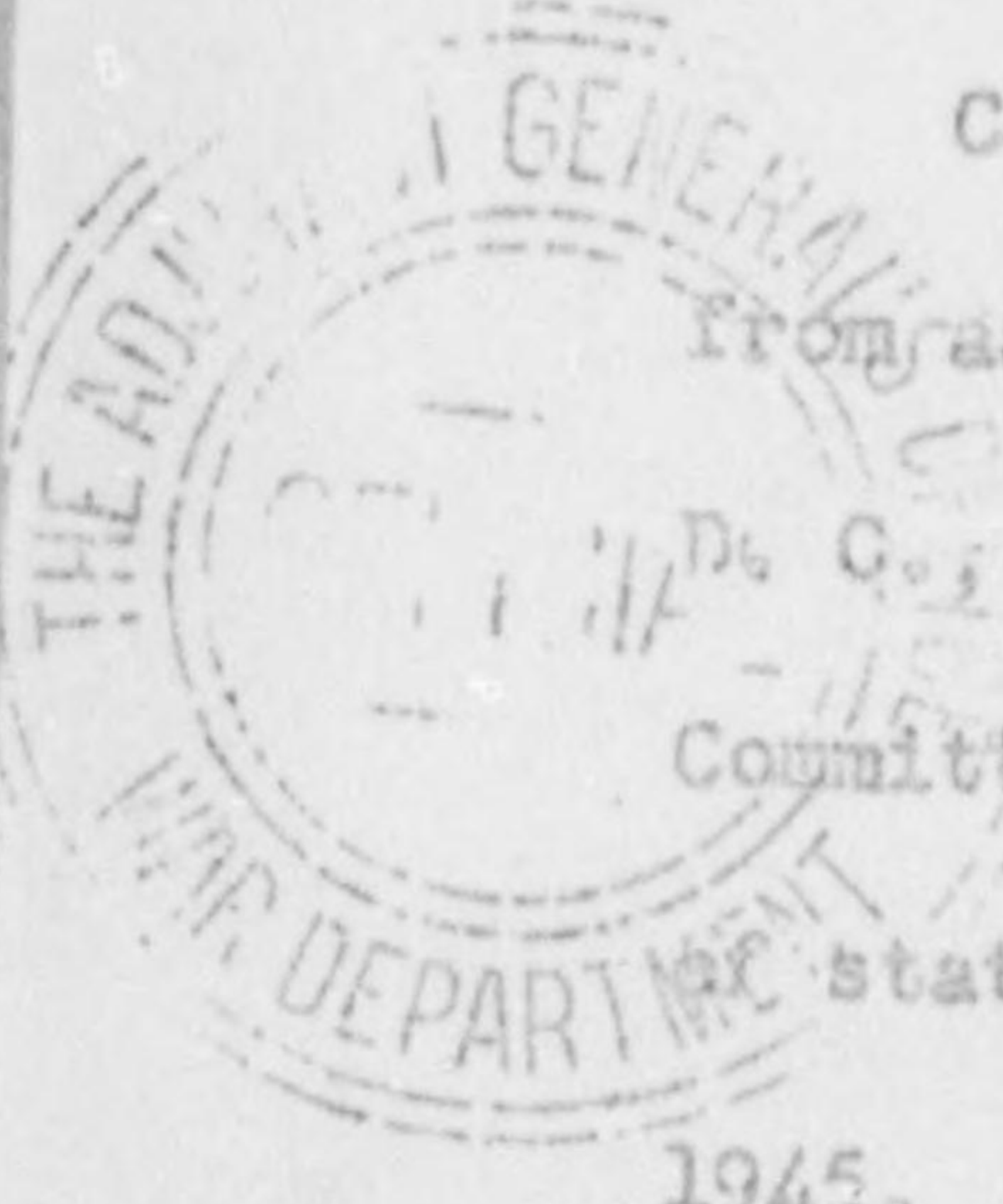

MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

1. On 7 August 1945 the files of Hunter College, New York City, New York, revealed that WEINER attended the term ending January 1933. She took Elementary Spanish and was absent over twenty per cent of the time. She previously attended New York Training School from 1924 to 1927 to receive a diploma; attended New York University in 1928 and 1929; and in September 1932 registered at New York University for a B.S. Degree.

2. On 2 August 1945, files of the Board of Education, 110 Livingston Street, Brooklyn, New York, revealed that THELMA FRANKEL WEINER was born 6 January 1907; attended Washington Irving High School and Hunter College. She received a probationary appointment on 6 September 1929 at Public School 105. On 6 September 1932 she received a permanent appointment. She taught at Public School 63 and 61 in 1940 and 1941. She left for military duty with the W.A.C. on 23 February 1943. On 7 October 1944 she was married to C. M. Weiner. Her residence prior to her entry into the Army was 218 East 15th Street, New York City. Her record was excellent.

3. On 3 August 1945, the Marriage License Bureau, New York City, was checked and revealed that Thelma R. Frankel, 218 East 15th Street, New York City, born 6 January 1910, occupation, AUS, was married to Clarence W. Weiner, 1417 N Street, Washington, D. C., born 20 February 1913, New York City, occupation - economist. They were married on 7 October 1944 by Judge Jonah Goldstein.

4. On 3 August 1945, Douglas Mayo, superintendent at 218 East 15th Street, New York City, was interviewed. He stated that SUBJECT's family lived at this address for over thirty years. WEINER's father is a doctor and her brother is also a doctor and is in the Army. SUBJECT has been in the W.A.C. for over two years. Informant has known WEINER personally for nine years and found her to be honest and loyal. He considers her family to be very fine people and knows nothing derogatory concerning WEINER or her family.

5. On 10 September 1945, Mrs. M. Blake, a teacher at Public School 61, New York City, was interviewed. She stated that she has known WEINER since 1942, when WEINER taught first grade at the school. She came

on sabbatical leave from another school and left to join the W.A.C. She was a member of the Teachers Union and of the Jewish Teachers Union. She was married while in the W.A.C. Informant further stated that she considered WEINER to be of good character and knew of no reason to doubt her loyalty or trustworthiness. She was well liked and gave no evidence of being a Communist or a Fascist.

6. On 11 September 1945, Sophie Manheim, 201 West 85th Street, New York City, was interviewed. She stated that she is a retired principal of Public School 61. WEINER taught at that school for about a year and a half, until she joined the W.A.C. She was a good teacher and informant liked her. She came from a good family, both her father and brother being doctors. She did not evince any radical sympathies while at the school but seemed to be completely loyal to the United States. Informant recommends her for a position of trust in the Army.

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8. On 10 September 1945, Miss May Wilson, principal of Public School 15, New York City, was interviewed. She stated that she has known WEINER for ten years, and that WEINER taught the third grade. Informant was principal at Public School 105 while SUBJECT taught there for over five years. She did not like WEINER for she was "pink", and active in the Teachers Union. Informant stated that she was an instigator and organizer and associated only with the radicals in the school. She had very few friends in the school except those who were radical. Informant further stated that she could not depend upon WEINER; that she shirked her work. Informant further stated that WEINER was single and that her father and brother were doctors. She would not recommend SUBJECT for confidential work in the Army because she considered her too "pink."

13. A check of the files of Security and Intelligence Division, Headquarters, Second Service Command, on the Kindergarten 6B Teachers Association, in which SUBJECT lists membership, reveals the following information:

TIMES article dated 10 May 1954 entitled OATH FOR TEACHERS IN USE SINCE WAR --

Ralph W. Haller, president of the High School Teachers Association, said his organization saw no objection to teachers taking an oath of allegiance, "but I cannot see why teachers should be singled out." Mrs. Johanna Lindlof, president of the Kindergarten-6B Teachers Association, called the bill "discriminatory legislation and absolutely unnecessary." She said she felt that loyalty to the Constitution should be required of "all citizens."

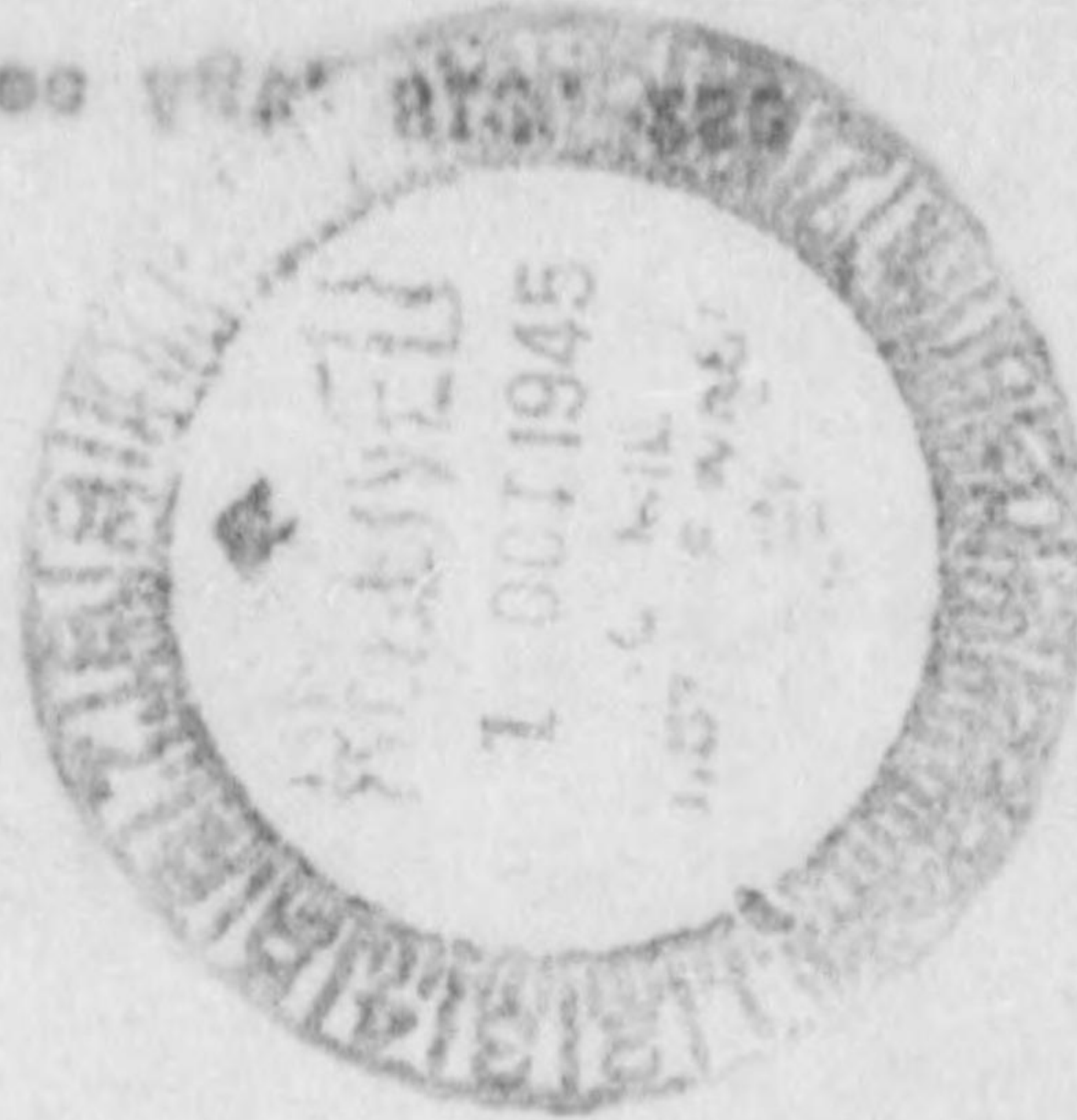

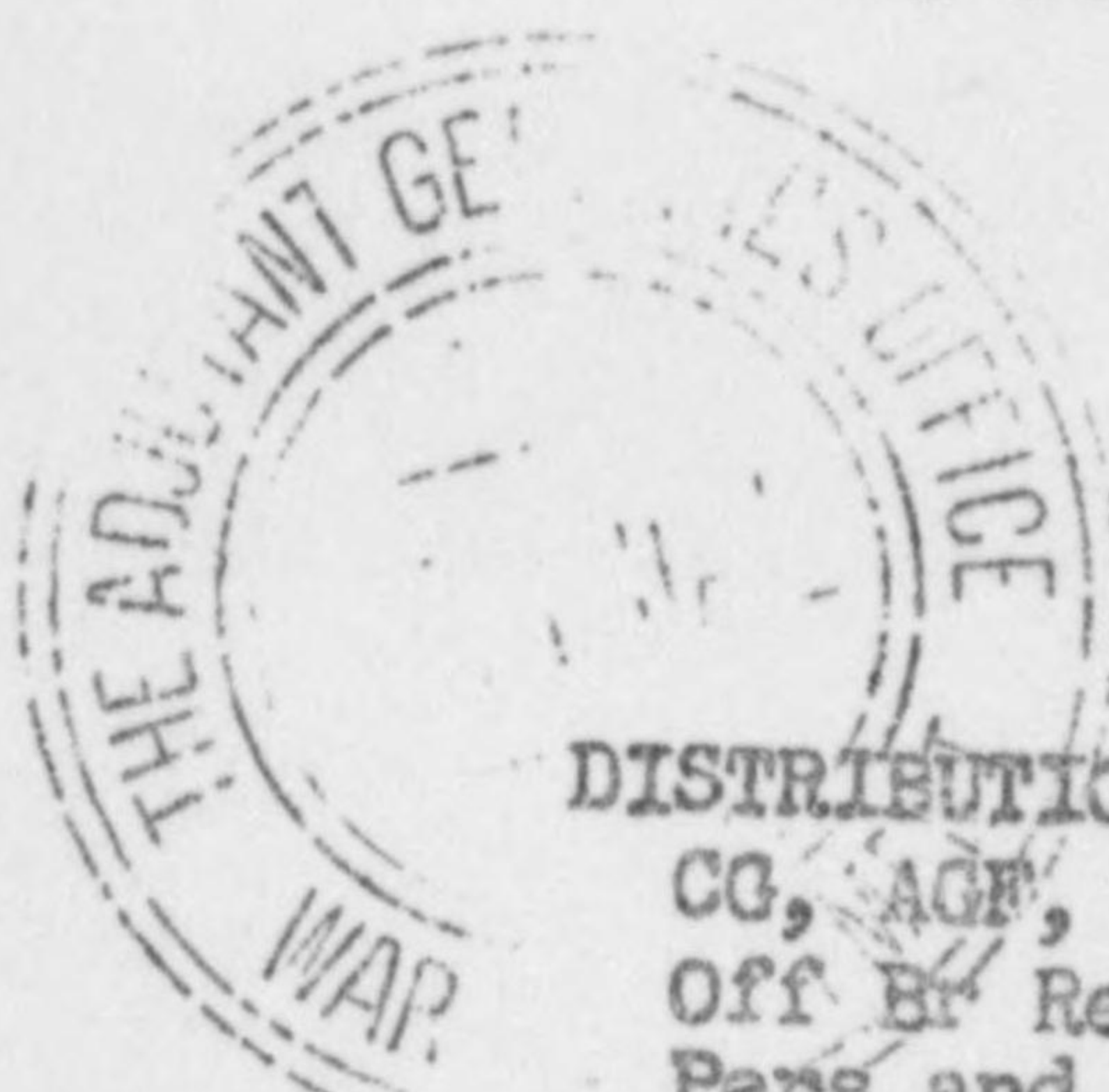

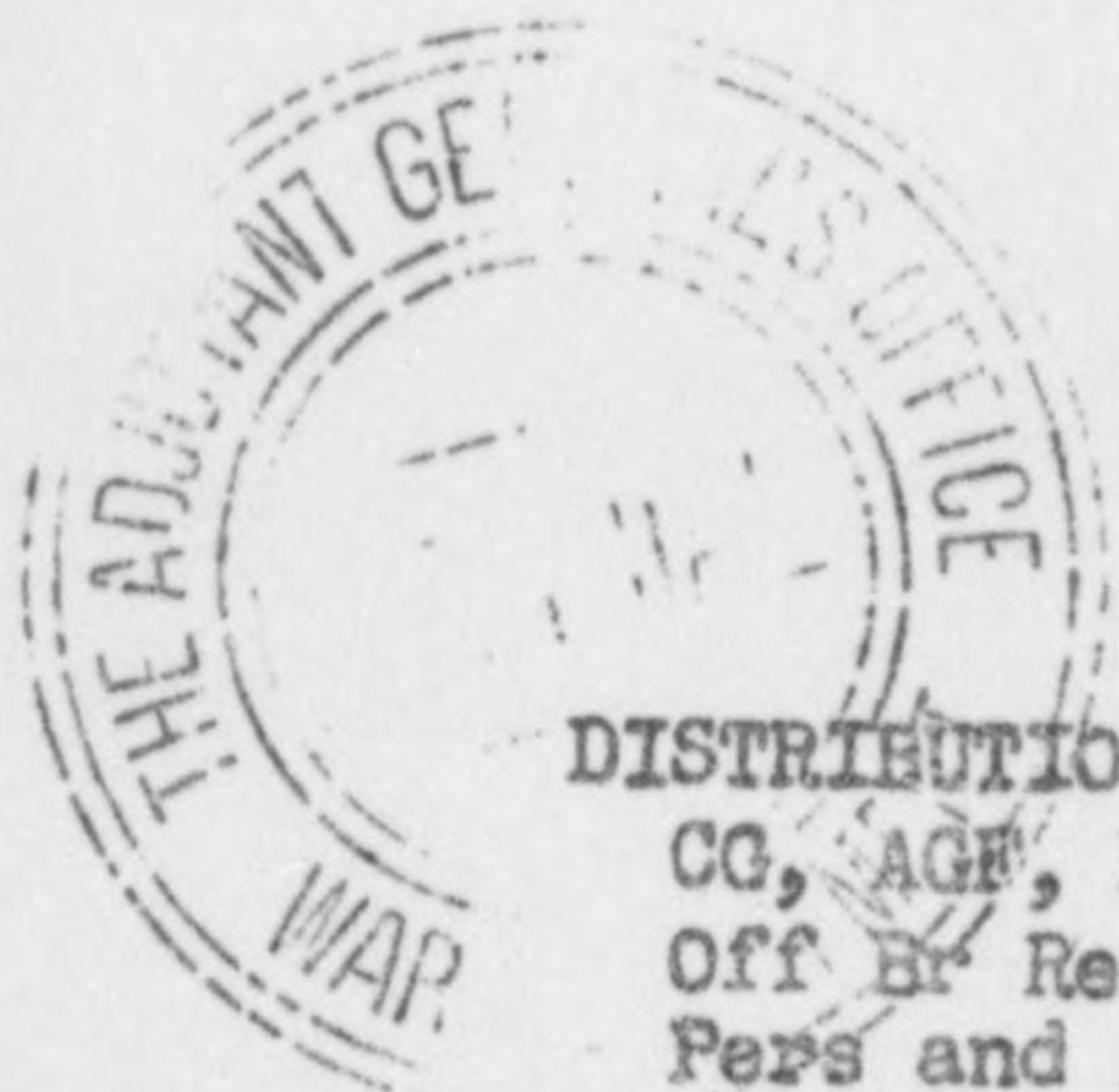

Other personnel records as indicated on the records check list will be assembled in the original records jacket for transportation therein. The preparation of a new records jacket each time an individual is transferred is wasteful and contrary to the intent of these regulations.

II. CAMPAIGN MEDAL. Paragraph 2, WD Circular 62, 1944, is changed and paragraph 4c(4) added as follows:

2. AUTHORIZATION. a. The European-African-Middle Eastern, and Asiatic-Pacific Campaign medals are authorized for award to members of the land and naval forces of the United States, including the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps, who, during any period from 7 December 1941, inclusive, and a date 6 months subsequent to the termination of the present war, shall have served outside the continental limits of the United States in either of the respective areas indicated in figure 1 and described in paragraph 5. See Executive Order 9265 (sec. 1, WD Bul. 56, 1942).

b. The American campaign medal is authorized for award to members of the land and naval forces of the United States, including the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps, who, during any period from 7 December 1941, inclusive, and a date 6 months subsequent to the termination of the present war, served outside the continental limits of the United States in the respective area indicated in figure 1 and described in paragraph 5, or served honorably on active duty in the continental United States for an accumulative period of 1 year.

4c(4) Honorable active duty service in the continental limits of the United States for an accumulative period of 1 year, including temporary and permanent duty.

III. EXAMINATION. Paragraph 6a, WD Memo W600-45, 1 June 1945, is changed as follows:

6a. Those applicants designated by the Department of State, after examination of the application blanks submitted by members of the armed forces, will be so notified through War Department channels, and will be ordered to such places at home and abroad as may be designated

as sites for the written examination. The official letter of notification from the War Department, when presented by the individual, on the date indicated therein, will constitute authority for the appropriate local commander to issue temporary duty orders authorizing the individual to report for the written examination at the nearest place at which it is to be given. All expenses in traveling thereto and return to proper station as well as necessary maintenance expenses while there will be borne from private funds of the individual and will not be at Government expense.

IV. REAL ESTATE. Paragraph 4, WD Circular 89, 1945, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

4. **CLASSIFICATION OF CORRESPONDENCE.** All communications concerning changes in status of command installations will be classified as restricted, and no announcement will be made to the press or public or to any individual outside the military or naval establishments until the information is released by the War Department General Staff.

VI. RETURN AND REASSIGNMENT. 1. Numerous requests have been received in the War Department from officers who were granted rotational leaves prior to 1 July 1945 and who now ask that such leave be converted to temporary duty for recuperation, rehabilitation, and recovery.

2. Temporary duty for recuperation, rehabilitation, and recovery was originally based upon authority contained in the annual Appropriation Act effective 1 July 1944 for military personnel returning to oversea assignment. This was enlarged upon, effective 1 July 1945, to include military personnel being assigned within the United States after oversea service. There exists, however, no authority for converting leave already granted and availed of to temporary duty except in those cases defined in letter AG 383.6 (17 Aug 45) OB-S-A-SPGAM-M, 17 August 1945, Procedure For Processing, Return and Reassignment of Recovered Personnel (Short Title: POW) Second Edition.

3. Accordingly all concerned are advised that, except as set forth in paragraph 2 above, leave granted and availed of prior to 1 July 1945 is properly chargeable as leave and will not be converted to temporary duty. Any request for such action received in the War Department will be returned to the originator without action.

VII. TURKEY MEAL. 1. Each officer, enlisted person, or

civilian employee regularly subsisting in a military mess within the continental United States may have as guests, immediate members of his or her family and not to exceed one friend, for subsistence with military messes for the turkey meal on Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. This authorization is subject to such limitation as may be imposed by the commanding officer of the post, camp, or station, based on availability of local mess facilities.

2. Persons regularly subsisting in a military mess are defined as those eating in a military mess five or more meals per week. No additional charge over the regular rate will be charged these persons for the turkey meal. Guests, and military and civilian employees who are not subsisted regularly in military messes, will be charged 75 cents for each of these meals served in field ration messes, and a minimum of 75 cents in other types of messes.

3. Property turn-in slips covering reimbursement for meals furnished under the field ration system, as provided in paragraph 63, TM 10-215, 1 November 1944, will show as a separate entry the number of turkey meals so furnished at the rate of 75 cents per meal.

4. The substitution of turkey in lieu of the meat component in the menu for the dinner meal as prescribed in TM 10-206, June 1945, is authorized for supply to all troop train movements occurring on Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. The excess cost of the turkey component over the meat component is authorized over and above the regular 75 cent limitation on the cost of the troop train ration. Either canned or fresh turkey may be used. If fresh turkey is used it will be pre-cooked when practicable prior to entraining due to the inadequate facilities on troop trains. If canned turkey is used, the issue will be on the basis of 5 ounces per ration.
(AG 430.1 (4 Oct 45))

VIII. WORLD WAR II VICTORY MEDAL. AUTHORITY. Congress

has enacted legislation establishing a service medal for World War II, act 6 July 1945 Public Law 135--79th Cong. (sec. V, WD Bul. 12, 1945).

2. OFFICIAL DESIGNATION. This medal has been designated the World War II Victory Medal.

3. DESIGN OF MEDAL. The design and method of applying for the medal will be announced at a later date.

4. DESCRIPTION OF RIBBON. A red center ribbon with narrow white borders, flanked by narrow double rainbows in juxtaposition. This design is based on the Victory Medal service ribbon for World War I.

5. ELIGIBILITY. The World War II Victory Medal may be awarded to all members of the armed forces of the United States or of the Government of the Philippine Islands who served honorably on active duty at any time between 7 December 1941 and the date of the termination of hostilities in the present war. This latter date means the date of termination hereafter proclaimed by the President or specified in concurrent resolution of the Houses of Congress, whichever is earlier.

6. POSTHUMOUS AWARDS. This medal may be awarded posthumously, and when so awarded it shall be presented to the first of the following representatives: widow (provided she has not remarried), eldest son, eldest daughter, father, mother, eldest brother, eldest sister, eldest grandchild.

7. WEARING OF RIBBON. The service ribbon will be worn immediately after the campaign ribbons for World War II.

8. SUPPLY. Pending manufacture of the medal, service ribbons will be furnished eligible personnel as soon as they become available. It is anticipated that the ribbons in limited quantities will be available for distribution on or about 1 December 1945. Subsequent to

15 November 1945, requisitions may be submitted by stations in the United States to the regional depot, and by oversea theaters to the appropriate port of supply. First priority in supply will be given to stations at which personnel are separated from the service, such as separation centers, separation points, and separating medical installations.

9. RECORD. Authority to wear the World War II Victory Medal service ribbon will be noted in service records and officers qualification cards as provided for in TM 12-230 and TM 12-425.

Relief of Naval Officers from Military Government Duty in Army Forces, Pacific Area Command 20 October 1945

SUMMARY

On 19 October 1945, the Secretary of the Navy, Mr. Forrestal called the Secretary of War on the telephone and advised him that several Naval officers now performing military government duties with the Army in the Pacific Area of Command, have written to Commodore James K. Yardsman, Jr. requesting his assistance in obtaining release from their present assignment. The Secretary of Navy asked for the War Department views on the subject.

The Secretary of War called the Director, Civil Affairs Division and asked that a letter be prepared containing the War Department's views on the subject raised by the Secretary of Navy.

The attached letter has been prepared to advise the Secretary of Navy of the War Department's views on this subject. It is recommended that upon approval, the Secretary of War sign the attached letter for dispatch to the Secretary of Navy.

Dear Mr. Secretary:

This is with reference to your inquiry concerning Naval officers serving with Military Government in Japan.

I have inquired into this matter and find that the Navy originally agreed to furnish 350 officers for military government duty in Japan to the Army. This number was later reduced to 250 because of the shortage of Navy personnel during the combat phase of operations. Of these 250 officers, 190 went through the six weeks' course at the School of Military Government, Charlottesville, Virginia; 183 of these officers subsequently were enrolled at one of the Civil Affairs training schools conducted at Stanford University, Michigan University, Harvard University or the University of Chicago. In addition to these 183, 59 Naval officers enrolled in the Stanford University Civil Affairs training school. A total of 249 Naval officers received some military government training at one of the Army schools with the majority completing the entire course. It is thus evident that considerable investment has been made by our government in training these officers for military government duty.

The majority of the Naval officers trained for military government volunteered for that service and the balance were detailed by the Navy because they were considered best qualified for such duties.

These officers, during the training period and while being staged at the joint Army and Navy Civil Affairs Holding and Staging Area, Presidio of Monterey, California, have lived and worked over a prolonged period with the Army. In view of this, it would seem that they should not be adverse to serve with, nor feel misplaced in, an Army operation such as military government in Japan.

Since these officers have been especially trained and there is a critical shortage of officers for military government duty, it would not, in my opinion, be to the best interest of the government to release them at this time.

It is to be noted, however, that recent Navy regulations as published in ALNAV 252-45 and ALNAV 306-45 provide that Naval military government officers are eligible for release from active duty under the same provisions as other Naval officers and the War Department has been advised that Naval officers who are released under the Naval point system from military government will not be replaced by the Navy. General MacArthur is acquainted with this arrangement.

I hope that the above information satisfactorily answers your inquiry.

MEMORANDUM TO: Office Transportation Officers

Subject: Use of Official Buses

1. In view of War Department shift to 40-hour week, with relatively few employees in Washington working on Saturdays, scheduled official bus service between buildings will not be operated on Saturdays after 20 October 1945.
2. No change in inter-building bus service on weekdays, Monday through Friday, is being made at this time.
3. An increase in the number of requests for cars has been noted recently, which has resulted in the reduced number of cars and drivers assigned to the War Department Motor Center building or rented. Records of recent requests have been reviewed, and in many instances there appears to have been but little justification for requesting special passenger car service, since 15-minute bus service is operated between major War Department buildings, and there is adequate service between all buildings.
4. Attention of Office Transportation Officers is again invited to their responsibility for coordination and supervision of transportation requests of their personnel so as to conserve military transportation and use it in the most efficient manner possible. Attention is also invited to existing regulations, which state that special passenger car service will not be requested by Office Transportation Officers when other transportation can be used, and that special car service is available only for official requirements which cannot be met by regular scheduled bus service.
5. Pads of trip tickets for use on official War Department inter-building buses are available to Office Transportation Officers upon request to this office, Room 5-B-660, The Pentagon, Extension 73857.
6. Special passenger car service will continue to be available at all times, including Saturdays and Sundays, but existing regulations regarding its use will be strictly enforced. The active cooperation of all Office Transportation Officers is desired in order that the utmost efficiency in use of available official transportation may be obtained.
