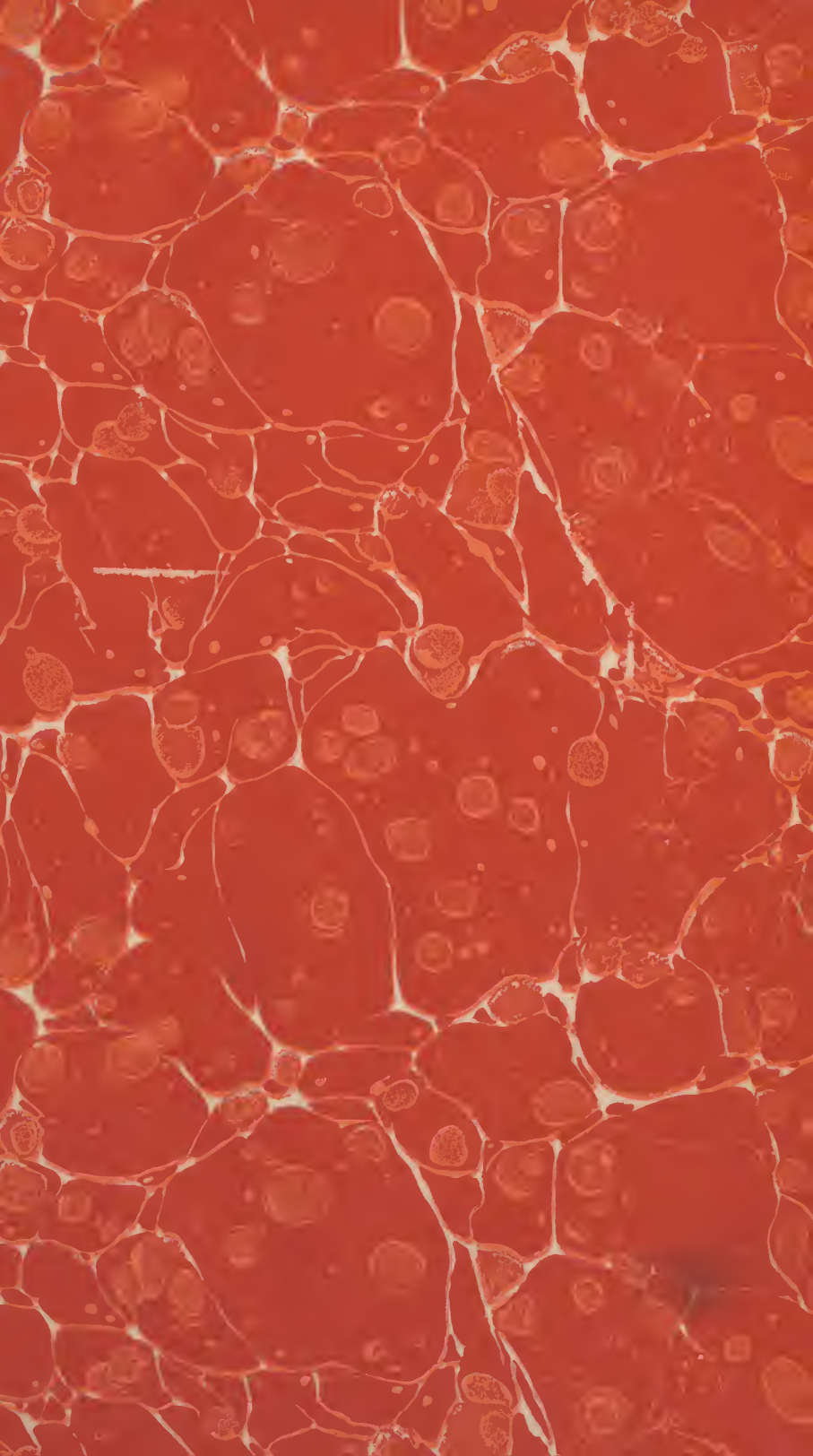

This was printed while I was a clerk in a bookstore, and less than twenty years of age. I went along North and South Market streets one day and procured one hundred and fifty subscribers for a semi-monthly paper at 37½ cents a quarter; purchased a small font of types, prepared the copy and set up the types in the store, at leisure moments; worked off the paper at night on a Ramage press, with balls; and the next morning delivered it at the doors of my subscribers. On the morning of the 12th Feb., I announced the death of DeWitt Clinton, at the same hour with the daily papers. I retired from this enterprise at the end of the quarter to take a situation on a daily newspaper as compositor, and did not go into business until

5,000 copies. This work was issued under peculiar disadvantages. The paper delivered for it was wretched, and the engravings were worse. But the author could not bear delay, so the work proceeded. The agents got their books just as an extraordinary money panic came on, and could not collect any thing for them; hence their sureties were sued, and full six years elapsed before the business was closed up.
