1. We received the oral instruction from your staff on Dec. 28, 1950 to submit the list of machineries under custody of the four ridges, Nos. 165, 473, 474 & 475, the 3rd Naval explosives depot (22-25) due to their transference.
2. For this purpose, our representatives have immediately investigated the spot in Maizuru.
3. On that day (Dec. 29, 1950), however, Colonel, J.L.C. Cosper was giving the spot explanation of their improvement construction for Military Use.
