- A In the efternoon.

- Q Was that moer a cathadral?
- A Lt the church: Manila Cathedral.
- Q Who ordered you to leave your house and go to the Manile Cathedral?
- A The Japanese.
- Q Did you go to the Manila Cethodrel as ordered by the Japanese?
- A Yos, sir.
- Q Ware you accompenied or alona?
- A We were many.
- Q Who were your companions?
- A We were many. My mother, my father, and my aunties.
- Q Did you have any brothers there?

- Q Did the Japanese tell you how to enter Santo Domingo?

- Q Did the Japanese tell you how many must compose a group?
- A Fo.
- Q Did the Japanese tell you only three of you would get into the Sente Domingo Church?
- A Fo, sir.
- Q Where is your mother now?

- A Sho was killed by the Japanese.
- Q Whore was your nother when she was killed?

- Q Inside or outside of the church?

- . Q Tow, you say that you have sustained 38 wounds.
 On what parts of your body were you wounded?
 - A In different parts of my body.
 - Q On your left arm did you sustain any wound?
 - A Yes, sir.
 - Q Will you please show to the Commission that left arm and tell the Commission how many wounds there are?
 - A (Exhibiting loft arm) Ton wounds.
 - Q And how about your right arm, did you sustain any wound at that time?
 - A Yos, sir.
 - Q Do you have any scars on that arm?
 - A Yos, sir.
 - Q How meny?
 - A Four.
 - Q Will you please show the Commission that right arm?
 (The witness exhibited her right arm.)
 - Q Word you wounded in the chest?
 - A Yes, sir.
 - Q Will you please show the Commission the scars on your chest?

 (The witness raised her dress and exhibited portions of her body.)
 - Q Did you count how many scars there are?
 - A I cernot remember new.
 - Q All right. On your abdomon did you suffer any wound?

(The witness exhibited scars on her abdom n.)

- Q As a result of that wound in your abdominal region, did your intestines protrude, or come out?
- A Yos, my intestine come out.
- Q Did you suffer any wound in your back?
- A Yes.
- Q How many wounds were there?
- A Only one, sir.

Q Will you planse show th Commission that wound in your back?

(The witness exhibited her back.)

- Q And your loss, how meny wounds did you sustain?
- A Tivo, sir.
- Q Before your mother died did she tell you enything?
- A Yos, sir.
- Q What did she tell you?
- A She cautioned me to be always cond.
- Q Did she tell you that she was dying then?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q Where did you slorp that night?
- A At Serto Domingo.
- ? By the side of your mother?
- A Beside my mother.
- Q Was she doed already then, when you slept with her?
- A Yos, sir.
- Q Fow, when did you got out from the Sente Domingo Church?
- A Alroady in the morning.
- Q While you were inside Santo Domingo Church and by the side of your mother, did you see any child tossed up in the air and received with the buyonet as it came down?
- A Yos, sir.
- Q Did you know who that boy or baby wes?
- A Yos, sir.
- Q What was the name of the baby?
- A Totoy.
- Q How old was the baby?
- A About three months, sir.
- Q Who tossed him up in the air?
- A Tho Japaneso.
- Q Who received him with the beyonet?
- A The Japanese also.
- Q The same Japanese who threw him up?
- A Yos, sir.
- Q Was the boy wounded?
- A Yos, sir.
