

#### A. CUYP

6 LARGE VIEW OF THE TOWN OF BATAVIA (Dutch East Indies). To the left are seen Barend Pieterssen Grootebrouck and his wife Catharina Paets; he is pointing with his rotan cane in the direction of the fleet on which he returned in 1641 and which is seen anchored in the harbour.

Grootebrouck came originally from the town of Hoorn and went in 1619 to the Indies. In 1625 he was merchant in chief ("opperkoopman") and one of the governors of the cost of Coromandel, settled at Mazuli-Patnam. In 1634 he was first director of Suratte. The fleet mentioned above left Batavia on December 1st 1640 and comprised the following ships: Banda, Frederik Hendrik, Zutphen, Middelburg, Salamander, Leeuwarden.
