



#### Lamps Without Filaments

Through the invention of an electric light bulb that requires no filament, Conrad Schickerling of Newark, N. J., claims that municipal lighting bills may be cut in half. 'So rapid is the growth said to be." Professor Barker continued. "that two months' injection produces twelve months' growth at the ordinary rate. Thus two or three shearings each year are possible "-Tit-Bits.

#### Woman Fertile Inventor

Among the many interesting things on show at the Exhibition of Inventions held recently in London, few attracted more attention than an appaatus designed by a woman inventor, Miss Verena Holmes. It is a device enabling an important operation in the treatment of consumption to be carried out in the home, and it is regarded as a great boon by the medical profession. Miss Holmes, who is a qualified engineer, has a number of other inventions to her credit. One of the most promising is a new type of diving apparatus.

#### New Salvador Railway




