For example, "Freight Quapode, Bandy, Baker, Bantam, Quonopsy, Brabast, Capture, Clabrate," means, "Send immediately by first freight ten bushels each Horticultural, Yellow Six Weeks and Low's Champion Dwarf Beans, also five pounds each Arlington Early Turnip Blood Beet, All Season's Cabbage, and early Half Long Scarlet Carentan Carrot." "Express Quapepsy, Brew," means, "Send immediately by express fifty pounds Breck's Mammoth Long Red Mangel Wurzel." 




