61794 Extremely fine, barely touched by circulation, nearly in proof condition ; one of the finest cents of this date known.
$7 \quad 1794$ Extremely fine, in quality approaching a proof; large planchet, resembles a 1793 ; excessively rare.
81794 Another beautiful cent, quite as fine as the last; rare.
91794 Uncirculated, partly red, thick planchet, of the highest rarity. A cent of this rare type is hardly ever found in this condition.
101795 Thick die, uncirculated, barely misses being a proof; "One cent" high up in the wreath ; of excessive rarity.
111795 "One cent" low down in the wreath; red and umcirculated, almost a proof and equal to the last; a gem coin.
121795 Thick planchet, uncirculated, a perfect cent; excessively rare.
131795 Thin planchet, nearly proof, and unexcelled. "One cent" high in the wreath ; about equal to No. 10.
141795 Thin planchet, "One cent" low in the wreath; an extremely fine piece.
151796 Fillet head variety, with 'Liherty'; fine but little circulated. This is one of the hoard brought home by Mr. Nichols to his daughters, he being a member of the old Continental Congress. These cents when re cent were offered me for a triflc, and I was afterward glad to buy them for many dollars each; they have been for many years highly prized by collectors; rare.
161796 Liberty cap, like the head of ' 93 , rarer than the fillet head ; extremely fine, barely circulated.
161797 Uncirculated, brilliant, nearly red, scarcely less than proof; one of the famous hoard, and one of the best of the lot, scarcely one equal to this at present exists.
181798 Almost red, barely touched by circulation; extremely fine and rare.
191798 Of dark color, but an exceedingly fine cent.
201799 This has every part perfectly distinct, the hair is untouched or nearly so, the bottom of the 9's are perfect, and the cent is as good a one as is known, being equal to the Abbey cent, and is withont exception the finest that has been offered for many years; excessively rare.

211799 The cheek only just blemished but hardly so; sarcely inferior to the last. Two cents like these offered can hardly at this day be produced in any American collection. The rarity of the 1799 cent is well known and can sarcely be over estimated. Of the highest rarity.
221800 Overstruck, almost without a blemish, a beautiful cent.
