"I believe these bulbs to be the best stock leaving Bermuda this or any previous season, perfectly free from disease, no longiflorum mixed with them and worth 50 per cent. more to the grower than nine-tenths of the stock leaving the Colony this season."

The appearance of the bulbs seems to fully warrant the above strong statement, and we do not anticipate that there will be any cause for complaint this season.
