## BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

**WARD 1.** Commencing at a point at Andrew Parker's wharf, running north to Main street, thence through the centre of Main street easterly through Bass avenue to the sea, including all that portion of the city now known as East Gloucester, together with all the islands in the harbor.

**WARD 2.** Commencing at a point at the head of Vincent's Cove, through the centre of Vincent, Spring, Marchant and Mt. Vernon streets to a point near the Mt. Vernon school-house, thence north twenty-three degrees east to the line of the Eastern Railroad, thence by said railroad easterly to the Rockport line, thence by the Rockport line to the sea, thence by the seashore and centre of Bass avenue to the northerly bound of Ward One, thence by the sea to the place of beginning.

**WARD 3.** Commencing at a point at the head of Vincent's Cove, through the centre of Vincent, Spring, Marchant, and Mt. Vernon streets to a point near the Mt. Vernon school-house, thence north twenty-three degrees east to the line of the Eastern Railroad, thence by said railroad westerly to its junction with Park street, thence through the centre of Park, Pleasant, and Duncan streets, and by the eastern side of the Gas Company's wharf to the harbor, thence by the shore line to the place of beginning.

**WARD 4.** Commencing at a point at the Town Landing, running northerly through the centre of Washington to its junction with Prospect street, thence through the centre of Prospect and School streets to the line of the Eastern Railroad, thence by said railroad easterly to its junction with Park street, thence through the centre of Park, Pleasant, and Duncan streets to the sea, thence by the shore line to the place of beginning.

**WARD 5.** Commencing at a point at the Town Landing, running northerly through the centre of Washington street to its junction with High street, thence through the centre of Prospect and School streets to the line of the Eastern Railroad, thence westerly by said railroad to the channel of Annisquam River, thence by said river and canal to the sea, then following the shore line to the place of beginning.

**WARD 6.** Commencing at a point on the Rockport line due east from the north end of Lobster Cove bridge, running westerly by said line and bridge to the channel of Lobster Cove, thence easterly by said channel to a point at the head of said cove, thence running north twenty-two degrees west to the sea, thence by the shore and the channel of Annisquam River to the line of the Eastern Railroad, thence by said railroad easterly to the Rockport line, thence by said Rockport line to the place of beginning.

**WARD 7.** Commencing at a point due east from the south end of Lobster Cove bridge, running westerly by said line and bridge to the channel of Lobster Cove, thence easterly by said channel to a point at the head of said Cove, thence running north twenty-two degrees west to the sea, thence by the shore easterly to the Rockport line at Folly Cove, thence southerly by said line to the place of beginning.

**WARD 8.** All that portion lying west of the canal and the channel of Annisquam River, including the islands in said river.

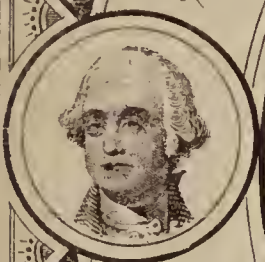

The District of Gloucester, including the towns of Rockport, Manchester, and Essex, is credited with producing during the year 1879, 189,383,026 pounds of fish, of a value of \$3,155,071. The capital invested is placed at \$4,326,568.

Number of vessel fishermen, 4,505; boat fishermen, 748; engaged in curing and packing fish, etc., 632; in factories, 321; total number of men employed, 6,206. Number of vessels, 424, of a tonnage of 23,884.95, valued at \$1,168,114; value of gear, exclusive of boats and nets, \$89,500; value of outfits, \$689,800; total, \$1,947,414. Number of boats employed in vessel fisheries, 1,783; in shore fisheries, 467; total, 2,250, of a value of \$85,861, the shore boats requiring gear to the value of \$12,200, and outfits valued at \$14,900. Number of gill nets used in vessels, 222; in boat fisheries, 370; purse seines, 190; total, 782, of a value of \$102,144. Number of weirs, 14, valued at \$6,500. Number of lobster and eel pots, 2,549, valued at \$1 each. Cash capital required in the business, \$1,062,000; value of wharves, store-houses, and fixtures, \$882,000; of factory buildings and apparatus, \$211,000.
