MOSCOW, (0111) A Pravda correspondent in Tokyo wrote today that seven Japanese women had reported to him the U.S. counterintelligence service arrested their husbands and sons on Dec 2 and since then has tortured them constantly. The report in the Communist party newspaper said three of the imprisoned men were named Iida, Nakayama and Okubo. It said they had been chained for period of 125 hours, had not been permitted to sleep, and were systematically beaten, subjected to conditions intended "to destroy their health entirely" and daily "threatened with death unless they confess to non-existent crimes".

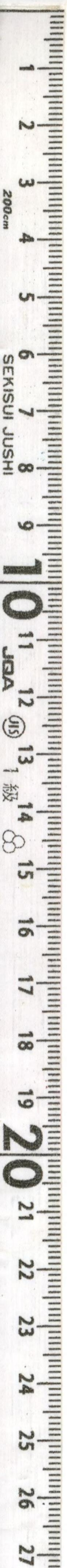
