ACA-2 report (Cont'd)

2 PBJ's searched straits between Korea, Kyushu and Honshu, one of which included search of south tip of Korea.

One of 3 small ships, apparently Sugar Dogs, fired one parachute flare at PBJ and meager, inaccurate AA at PBJ on investigation run at 1442Z, location 34-20N, 130-20E. A second small craft approximately 100 feet long, unidentified type, fired 2 parachute flares at PBJ which burst 100 yds. to rear and slightly above PBJ, illuminating same for 3 minutes, time 1535Z, 33450N, 129-25E.

Second PBJ received light and medium, meager, inaccurate AA fired from small ships, less than 100 feet, types unidentified at 1500Z, 34-40N, 130-45E, and at 1520Z, 34-40N, 129-50E.

No targets suitable for attack were encountered.
