

I lost night of the object as it come derictly overhead. I lost it in the glasses, due I think, to its being faither west and I could no longer absence the reflection of the seen. as my letter stated, unother object appeared to have it, at a 95 degree angle, leaving a faint snoke and grinning speed very slowly. The original object left no trace of ex haust at any time. The fact that, even with the oil of benoculars, the cine of the object warn't appreciably larger, leads me to believe it was entremely high. Hervever, the bin verlars used were not a too goverful met. The second sighting of this object was practically identical with the first, and the course grantically the same. However, no binocular were used and no object was seen to leave it. This second nighting about 21/2 weeks later, and somewhat shakes my belief that it can't be explained as identifiable object.

Subject: Sighting of Unknown Object

Dear Sirs:

On the evening of Aug. 8, 1952, at approximately 19:55 hrs., while standing in the front yard of Mr. in North Downey, California, we sighted a very small object, flying very high, on a course of nearly 360°.

At first, both was and myself figured it was a weather balloon, but after I located the object in the field glasses, I realized it was travelling much too high and too fast. So we came to the conclusion it was an extremely high flying aircraft, although I couldn't make out any shape that resembled aircraft, as the object appeared round.

I kept the object in the glasses for a period of approximately five minutes, when it was practically direct overhead, when, from this object another object emerged, gaining speed slowly at 90 degrees to the original object (approx. 270 degrees) and leaving a thinly distinguishable trail, the color of which resembled the original object and the one that left it. The object that left the original object was about one quarter the size of the original. The colors of these objects, in the glasses, appeared slightly golden, yet, when seen with the naked eye, appeared to have the color of the first stars to appear in the evening, which, by the way, is what we thought it was until we assured ourselves it was moving.


If there was an aircraft (military) that was flying extremely high and released a rocket powered aircraft, as I have read about in magazines, then that is what I saw, and, because of the extreme height the sun was still shining on it, and explains the color.

If there were no flights of this kind, then I (we) have sighted something for your records. Either way, I would appreciate an answer to this letter, as I am quite a fan of your organization, and this is the first sighting in nearly two years of intermittent observation, that I have seen anything I couldn't explain to myself.

Please be advised that I have been a pilot (civilian) since 1930, put in three years instructing R.A.F. Cadets during the last World War, and haven't flown for over two years, as pilot. I am 40 years of age, and have lived in and around this area for 37 years.


