But the number in India during the year was in rea-lisy 80,000, the Home authorities insisting on burden-ing the exchequer with 7,000 men, costing three-fourths of a million more than they themselves fixed as the maximum strength and cost. This interference of England with the Indian purse as well as detailed ad-ministration, is the growing evil the country has to fear, and the constitution must sconer or later provide against. When we state that the military expenditure of 1859-60, a year of peace and a full year after the campaigns of 1858, was 17,750,000%, the extent of Colonal Balfour's services will be appreciated. And although India has been burdened with 7,000 Europeans more, there was every probability that the next Budget would abew the original estimates had not been ex-eeded. At the close of the year, the hearts of the semise that took Delhi and Lucknow were gladdenied by the amouncement that the Prize-mioney at the rate of not less than Rs. 80 a share for the former and 17 for the latter, would be immediately distributed. Are-thusis, and Octavia-was contracted for by the firms of Maudday, Sons, and Field, who completed to produce each a pair of engines, without limit to cost of manufac-ture or of design, that should be as far as they could produce them, economical in their working, each to be of 500-horse power, nominal. The Octavia's engines have been designed, and their principle patented, by Mr. Sells, chief draughtsman to Messrs.
