Such among us as are enabled to attend divine service in Thy church, we pray Thee to inspire with such warm devotion, and pious attention, that they may benefit by the prayers in which they join; and call down Thy pity upon those, who, from necessity are not at the same moment uniting their prayers and praises to Thy Divine Majesty. O Lord our God, have compassion upon such as are called upon to perform the duties due to the sick, or their own infirmities; or to the needful employments in which they are engaged, and grant that they may share in the devotions, which are publicly offered up in their behalf. We humbly beseech Thee, to ingraft into all our hearts, the most firm conviction and constant recollection, that we are always in Thy sight, and that Thou hast given us minds to think, and tongues to speak, to the glory and honour of Thy name. O Heavenly and Merciful Father, direct our thoughts, and guard our tongues from uttering the evil of our hearts, which perpetually

perpetually opposes the good resolutions we form; and may we use our best reason to withstand the wiles of the devil, and the vanities of the world. But vain are the efforts of our understanding, and vain is the help of man in all things, without the inspiration of Thy Holy Spirit, and Thy aiding grace to confirm His purposes. All power and dominion is solely in the Lord, who governs the world, and reigns over the kings of the earth; who maketh His angels spirits, and His ministers a flame of fire. Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever; a sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of Thy kingdom. O Lord our God, we know that Thou lovest righteousness and hatest iniquity; we pray Thee to keep us mindful of this great truth, that we may never relax in our earnest endeavours to please Thee, whose favour is better than this life and all its joys, for Thou givest life eternal to such as love Thee and keep Thy commandments. O grant us the healthful Spirit of Thy grace, that we may truly please Thee; and so walk in the light of Thy truth, that we may at length attain to the light of life immortal through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us all this day lay aside the cares of the world, and take into our thoughts the joys of heaven, and aspire to those mansions of peace and happiness, where our Saviour Jesus Christ will exalt His faithful servants for ever. SACRAMENT

SACRAMENT DAY MORNING.

SUPPLICATION.

BLESSED LORD, let it not be laid to my charge at the aweful day of judgment that I have entirely neglected to exhort my family to obey Thy holy ordinances, according to Thy Divine commands.

ADMONITION.

The Minister has given timely notice that he will on this day administer the holy sacrament to all such as are devoutly and religiously disposed, and I remind you of it, because throughout the Scriptures, Almighty God has made it the particular duty of parents and masters, to teach their household to keep the laws, and obey the will of the Lord their God. The fourth commandment contains an awful admonition to us all, respecting orders frequently given to rulers, and all who have children or servants, or a stranger within their gates. The Lord speaks by the mouth of the prophet Ezekiel, " Hallow my sabbaths, and they shall be a sign between me and " you, that ye may know that I am the Lord your God." The prophet Nehemiah reproves the people for bringing down the wrath of God on their nation. "What evil thing is this that ye do, and " profane the sabbath-day; did not your fathers thus, and did not "God bring this evil upon us, and upon this city? yet ye bring " more wrath upon Israel by profaning the sabbath." Our blessed Lord.

Lord, in tender mercy to our infirmities, abolished the severer rules of the Jewish church, which made the sabbath a weariness to man. Let us never be ungrateful for this indulgent mark of our Saviour's love to His Christian servants. We, of these kingdoms, are by legal authority, founded on the laws of the Gospel, restrained from many liberties which would tempt us to neglect the sacred duties instituted by Christ himself, and appointed by our established church. I beg of you to remember the instructions you have received by our daily readings in the Holy Scriptures, and that you will particularly call to mind our blessed Lord's last injunctions, when he ordained the Holy Sacrament. It has frequently been explained to you from the pulpit, whence we have been admonished to frequent the Lord's Table, in remembrance of His meritorious cross and passion, whereby alone we obtain remission of sins, and are made partakers of the kingdom of Heaven. To prepare ourselves for this holy communion, we are to repent of our sins, and firmly resolve to forsake them, to feel a Christian charity towards all our fellow creatures, and to have a stedfast faith in the merits and atonement of Christ our Saviour, that so we may take this Holy Sacrament to our own eternal comfort, and that we may have grace to do so, let us devoutly and earnestly pray.



SACRAMENT DAY MORNING PRAYER.

O LORD, our most gracious God, slow to anger and of great goodness, mercifully grant us true repentance, and heart-felt sorrow, for all the sins we have at any time committed against Thee. Forgive us all our iniquities for Christ's sake, and turn our hearts to Thee, the living God, while the day of life is spared to us when pardon may be sought, and an opportunity is afforded us to prove the sincerity of our repentance. On this return of a day so especially consecrated to the most solemn ordinances, give us grace, Almighty Father, to search out our hearts and examine our ways, and to reflect seriously, every one of us, on our own particular sins and general conduct. Blessed Lord, enable us all to do this with earnest attention, and pious resolutions, suited to our several wants and weaknesses, and the particular offences of our lives. O Lord our God, inspire with holy zeal and fervent devotion, all those who intend this day to approach Thy altar; that they may join in those sacred mysteries with true reverence, and so eat of that bread and drink of that cup, that they may be partakers of the most blessed body and blood of Christ our Saviour, and be preserved in body and soul, unto everlasting life. O Lord God of our salvation, hear us when we call upon Thee, and let not the enemy prevail against us. O may we serve Thee in this world in spirit spirit and in truth, in word and deed; for Thy Gospel, O Lord Christ, is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth, "and the Lord shall be King over all the earth, in that "day shall there be One Lord, and His name One." Grant, O Heavenly Father, that when we have finished our course, we may behold Thy eternal glory in heaven, and dwell in Thy glorious kingdom, where the wicked cease from troubling, and where the weary are at rest; where God shall be all in all, blessed for evermore. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. Amen.
