

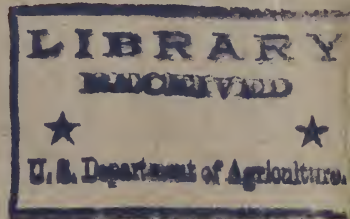

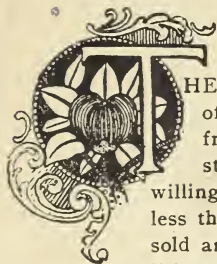

We handle absolutely nothing that has not been carefully grown from the choicest stock seed, especially for seed purposes.

We have made the lowest prices possible consistent with first-class quality, but we cannot in the matter of price compete with rubbish, sure to disappoint the planter and result in losses far exceeding the total cost of good seeds.



HERE is on the market at present an enormous supply of seeds of questionable quality, grown by careless or unskilled growers from very doubtful stock to begin with, as well as large bankrupt stocks largely of dubious pedigree and age, which, had we been willing to handle them, we could have bought for a song—very much less than the first cost of producing such goods as we have always sold and now offer our customers. Our prices are for delivery f. o. b. cars, Detroit, Mich., and do not include the cost of containers. When seamless cotton grain bags, boxes, or barrels are necessary for safe transportation, such packages will be charged at value, and are not returnable.

Proportionately higher prices will be charged for quantities less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  lb. or  $\frac{1}{4}$  bu. Where two qualities of any variety are quoted, the best will always be sent, unless specially otherwise ordered.

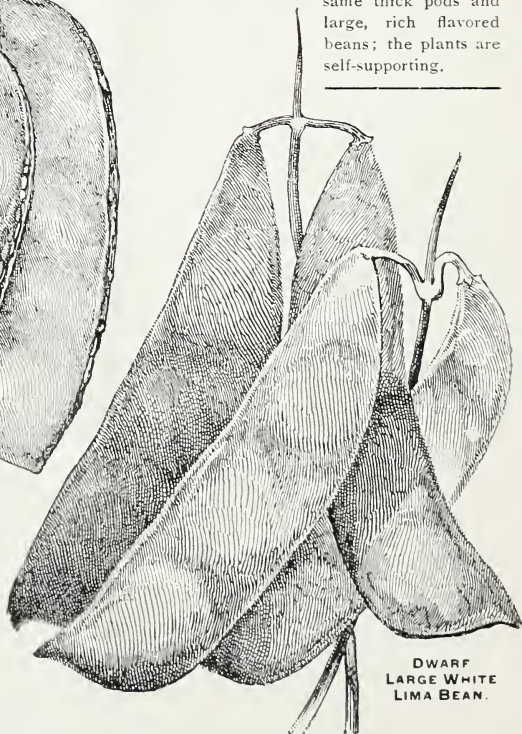

“Express Recanter Broome, Burke, Carlton.” Means “Send by first express Two Pounds each of Early Jersey Wakefield (true American), Early Winnigstadt and D. M. Ferry & Co.’s Premium Late Flat Dutch Cabbage.”
