# Profits in Tulips This Year

**D**ON'T let increased prices deter you from growing tulips for your usual market this year. Remember, not a third of the number of tulips usually forced by florists of this country can be grown this winter. War has cut down the supply.

Bulbs may cost double the normal amount, but growing costs will be no greater, and final cost of your plants probably not over a quarter more than usual. The market will be three times as large. This should lift your selling price higher than your increased cost.

At the same time, remember that with a two-thirds reduction in supply of bulbous flowers next spring, there will be a substantially increased demand for other plants, and see that you have them to sell. You will find many suggestions in the pages that follow.

Oregon and Washington have again established minimum prices on narcissus bulbs, which maintains the same price level on top size northwestern grown stock, the only grade on which prices are quoted in this catalog. Bulbs from other sections may be offered at less, but not by us.

# A Proven Method of Selecting Double-Flowered Stocks in the Seedling Stage

Dr. S. L. Emsweller has recently proved he could select 95% double flowered stocks in the seedlings stage of growth. Every florist who grows stocks knows that the singles bring 50% less in price than the doubles, and in glut markets singles are practically worthless. The importance of Dr. Emsweller's work is obvious and a summary follows.

Last Fall Dr. Emsweller sent stock seedlings that were selections by his method to about 25 various greenhouse growers. Recent reports show that these seedlings ran 94 to 97% all double. Reports and the tests were sponsored by the S.A.F. to prove the method to skeptics, as there have been many claims of success before.

As is well known, there are two types of plants in stocks—double flowering and single flowering. The first is the one desired by the florist and home gardener, but since it sets no seed whatever, it is of no use to the seed grower. The single flowered plants seed profusely and, naturally, are of importance to the seedman. For some time plant geneticists have known that there are three types of single plants. One when self-pollinated produces no doubles, the second produces about 25% doubles; and the third from 54-56% doubles. The third type is called ever-sporting, and on this type only is it possible to distinguish seedling doubles from seedling singles. So far it has been impossible to get stocks from seed to come over 54-56% double. Higher percentage of doubleness have often been reported because of the natural tendency to transplant only the largest and strongest seedlings. No method of seed sorting by specific gravity, or by weak germinations has isolated singles from doubles.

The method used to select 94-97% double stocks in the seedling stage is as follows: When the most advance seedlings are about 1 to 3 inches in height, preferable 1 inch, run the growing temperature to 60° minimum for a period of one week. Then start selecting out the extra large seedlings, and in addition to size, a second characteristic, the type of leaf is very useful. It has been found plants that will produce double flowers show a wavy growth on the small new leaves, before this appears on single flowering seedlings. The difference between leaves of the single and double type are shown in the diagram. Eventually all the plants exhibit the same characteristic, but the double plants acquire it earlier in their development, especially at 60° or higher temperatures. By using a combination of these two characteristics—that is selecting large seedlings and those which have wavy center leaves—it has been possible to select plants, 94-97% of which were double. Since a flat of seeds

can have only 56% double plants do not select over this 56% out of it. Stopping after you have half of the plants selected out, will give you the best results.

You may control the height that your Stocks bloom as follows—If you want short plants grow at 60° until double seedlings are selected then drop temperature to 50° maximum. If you want tall plants hold temperature at 60° until plant gets 1 or 2 feet high, then drop temperature to 50° for one week. Buds usually set in three days at 50°, but to be conservative we say run a week at 50°, then the temperature may be raised again. By varying the time at which you give the plants the bud setting low temperature of 50° maximum you can make the plants grow to any desired height.

Soil, light and other growing factors have some effect, but experience with skillful use of this temperature information will soon show what consistent results one can obtain.

The earliness of bloom, and the economy of growing compared to plants started in the Greenhouse, makes the sowing of certain annuals in the Fall a good gamble for Florists who can use summer cut flowers. Larkspur is a particularly good item for this culture. This method avoids transplanting, which is often difficult with Larkspur. Early plants grow better due to cooler weather, and the early flowers do not shatter as easily as those blooming during the hot spells.

When you sow seeds of annuals in Fall, you imitate Nature's method. Practically all hardy annuals will produce stronger, sturdier plants with earlier bloom by this method. Do not be in too much of a hurry to sow. The ideal time is just before the ground freezes for winter. November 15th is early enough in normal seasons in the vicinity of Chicago and New York. If the ground has been prepared in advance, sowings can also be made during winter thaws. A cold frame makes a good place to grow.

A fine seed bed is desirable. No covering of any kind is needed unless there is danger of washing or from birds, in which case a light, loose covering can be used. Plant at half the depth used when sowing seed in Spring. Broadcast all small seed. South of the Mason-Dixon line, sowing should be delayed until the late February and early March thaws.

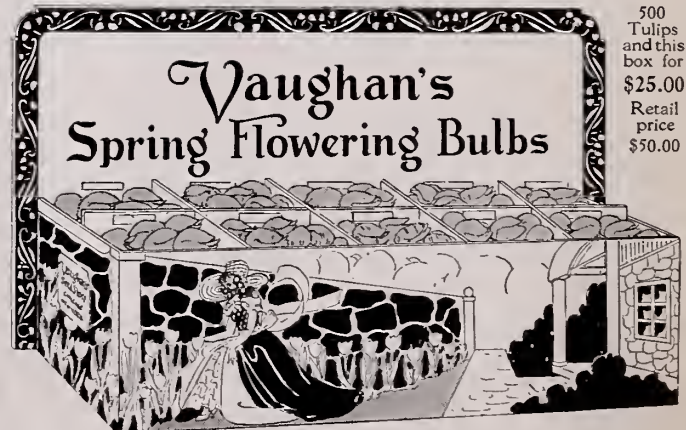

# Vaughan's Tulips For Forcing

## War Limits Supply-Make Sure of Your Share by Early Order

War conditions, it now appears, will prevent the importation into this country of flowering bulbs from Holland, of which we used more than 100,000,000 last year.

From the best data at hand, we estimate that approximately the following tulips suitable for forcing will be available to the florists of the United States and Canada, provided no Dutch bulbs are shipped:

English grown, 11½ to 12½ ctms., 2,000,000.

English grown, 10 to 11 ctms., 8,000,000 (non-forcing varieties not included).

American grown, 11½ to 12½ ctms., 2,000,000.

In addition, some Japanese bulbs will be imported, but in our opinion they cannot be profitably forced and are only suitable for late flowering. The forcing value of the 10-11 ctm. English bulbs, as enumerated above, is also doubtful.

Last fall about 30,000,000 tulips were used by the florists of the United States and Canada for forcing. With 4,000,000 reliable bulbs for forcing, as shown above, and 8,000,000 of doubtful value, it seems apparent that the available supply this year will be not more than one third of a normal supply.

We have been conducting large scale experiments in growing tulips in the Pacific Northwest for several years, and this year had the largest tulip plantings in this country. Many florists are familiar with the high quality of this stock.

The tulips offered below are either our own American grown stock or imported English bulbs.

Increased prices are inevitable owing to the short supply, and heavy costs. But remember, that the bulbs you grow will be sold on a market which normally absorbs three times as many plants as can be produced for next spring. Your costs other than bulbs will be the same, and prices should easily pay a larger than normal profit.
