1. An investigation of the property on O'shima Island now being utilized by the U.S. Coast Guard as a Loran Transmitting Station reveals that this property was occupied by a Japanese Naval Detachment from 3 May 1944 to 15 October 1945 and was known as No. 2 Watch Tower of Yokosuka Naval Guard, O'shima District, and as such is considered captured enemy property under custody of Naval Forces Far East.

2. In view of the above, it is considered that no Procurement Demand is necessary or required, and it is therefore requested that the referenced Procurement Demand be cancelled and all Procurement Funds be returned.
