Dear Sirs,

We are contractors in this city and have many contracts of U.S.A.O.F. and other rehabilitation works not only in this prefecture but also in other prefectures, employing over 2,000 laborers at all times.

However, we have not quite sufficient machineries to fulfill some of the contracts within a definite period of time. One of which is the job for U.S.A.O.F. now working in James Town, Shioya district in this city, for repairs to buildings, erection of levee to reenforce damaged dykes, construction of roads etc. in the area 160 meters above sea level with narrow and bending roads leading to the spots, having gradients ranging from 25 to 30 degrees. Transportation of materials to the spots by charcoal burning trucks are very difficult and in most cases ascending is practically impossible. In such cases we had to push the work by using the small quantity of gasoline available. Moreover, the landslip caused by the flood in last year damaged many spots to a considerable extent that some places become steep cliffs. The work in these spots are indescribably hard and we are really in need of mechanical help to cope with them.

Transportation of lumbers and other materials from other prefecture by way of land is practically unavailable and are now relying it on sea transport.

Under the circumstances we hereby submit our application to purchase various machineries etc. as per list attached and sincerely hope it will meet with your approval.

In conclusion, we assure you that if we could procure the necessary machineries, all the bottlenecks now confronting us could be smoothed out and are able to render a great service to the U.S.A.O.F. jobs and other important rehabilitation works.
