



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

Preface.

In conformity with the plan for the publication of the Worcester Town Records, the details of which are given in the preface to the preceding volume, the following petition was presented to the City Council on the 2d of June, 1890:

PETITION.

To the Honorable the Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Council of the City of Worcester.

Your petitioners respectfully represent, that the Worcester Proprietary and Town Records and the Record of Deaths, covering a period of more than one hundred years, are now preserved in print; that there remain to be printed to complete the history of the Town organization only the Records from 1801 to 1848 and the Births and Marriages; and that The Worcester Society of Antiquity, having carried on the work in the past, and borne the principal expense of the same, is desirous of continuing the publication until completed, which can soon be accomplished with the aid of a small annual appropriation by the City.

We, the undersigned, citizens of Worcester, fully appreciating the importance of this undertaking, and believing that the present opportunity to have placed in permanent and convenient form all the Town Records of Worcester at small expense to the City should be improved, respectfully petition your Honorable Body to appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and authorize the payment of the same to the Treasurer of The Worcester Society of Antiquity, for the purpose of defraying half the expense of copying, editing, indexing, and printing, the Town Records of Worcester from 1801 to 1815 inclusive, one hundred copies of which are to be delivered to the City Clerk for the use of the City.

We the Com"tee appointed to view & report our opinion respecting the most suitable ground on the Town Common whereon Horse Sheds may be erected, agreeably to the request of M^r. N. 

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of Worcester, qualified to vote in Town affairs, on the fourth day of April 1808, as by adjournment from the fourteenth day of March last, were call'd to order by the Moderator, and the following votes passed. Viz.

Voted, to accept the report of the Committee respecting the expending of school money, on condition, the Centre district will comply with the proposals therein made, which are as follows-

The Committee appointed to consider of a proper arrangment of the public schools to be kept within the Town the year insuing, and of an apportionment to the several Districts of the money to be raised for that purpose; having attended to the objects of their appointment now present,

That it appears to the Committee it would be as benificial to the Town and more agreeable to a large portion of its inhabitants, to make the grammar School stationary within the Centre District rather than to continue it a moving school as heretofore derected, and that a compensation be made to the other districts, as an equivalent for the advantages they relinquish on that account.

The Committee therefore recommend for the consideration of the Town the following mode of apportioning the money to be raised for the benefit of public schools the present year (viz.)

That a sum not exceeding four hundred dollars be taken in the first place from the whole sum to be raised for that purpose, which shall be applied to the support of a grammar School to be kept within the centre district according to law under the directions of the Selectmen—

And if that sum shall prove insufficient, the remainder to be supplied out of the money apportioned to that district for the support of english schools—That the remainder of the money be applied to the support of english schools under the directions of the school committee man in each district, and shall be divided in the first instance according to the number of minor children in each district respectively, and from the dividend arising to the centre district, let one hundred and seventy six dollars be deducted and equally divided to the eight other districts giving twenty two dollars to each in addition to their respective dividends, as an equivalent for their not having the gramar School kept in those districts any part of the year.

The Committee further report, that from the best information they could obtain it appears that since the grammar school has been made a moving school in the Town; it has been kept eighteen months within the centre district, exclusive of the present term now in keeping, which has about half expired—That it has been kept six months in the school-house near Cap^t. W^m_ Gates — Eight months & three weeks in that on burncoat plain and nine months in each of the other districts

Voted, that the accounts named in the above memorandum, should be adjusted by the Selectmen—

Agreeable to the fourth article in the warrant, on the petition of Jeremiah Robinson and others, a Committee was chosen for the purpose therein named, who now make their report, which is accepted by the Town, and is in the words following Viz.

The Committee appointed to view and report whither any, and if any, what repairs are necessary to be made at the Bridge near the goal, have attended to the object of their appointment and now report—

That this bridge, in its present situation, consists of three narrow sluice ways, so low, that before the water can pass over the dam on the lower side of the Bridge, those sluice ways are compleatly filled up with dead water, and whenever there is a sudden increase (which frequently happens in the Spring of the year) the the water must accumulate on the upper side and flow over it thereby greatly endangering the Bridge and discommoding the Inhabitants—

The Committee are therefore fully of opinion, that both for the safety of the Town and convenience of the public travil it is in-

dispensibly necessary this bridge should be taken up and rebuilt and raised so as to be nearly upon a leavel with the abutment at the end of the turnpike.-That, to afford sufficient conveniency for the accomodation of the public, it will also be necessary to extend the Bridge further South so as to occasion the removal of the Hatters Shop now there and embrace a portion of Mr. Lincolns land-The terms upon which Mr. Lincoln will consent, as the Committee are informed to a removal of this shop and that a strip of land about two rods wide should be laid out into a public highway are as follows. viz. That the shop shall -- removed and fitted up in such a manner as shall be suitable for improvement -That the water shall be conveyed into the canal for the accomodation of the works below; either by constructing a dam of a sufficient heighth below the Bridge, or by extending the canal through, so as to receive the water on the North side, all which is to be at the expence of the Town, and that he shall be paid two hundred dollars for the land-The whole it is believed will amount to five hundred dollars, which added to the probable expence of rebuilding the Bridge will make nearly fifteen hundred dollars in the whole-This sum if raised by an additional tax upon the Inhabitants at large would impose so heavy a burden as to prove a discouragement to the undertaking—

The Committee have therefore, sought for other means of effecting the object—And on examination, it is found that out of the annual tax of two thousand dollars, which for several years past has been appropriated to the repairs of highways within the Town, about one half has *be* assessed on the Inhabitants of the centre school Distrect—And considering the present favorable situation of the roads and Bridges in the extreme parts of the Town; it is therefore recommended to the Town to make an appropriation of all the monies that may be assessed for highways on the Inhabitants of the centre school district for their polls and estates lying within the same during the two next succeeding years to the purpose of rebuilding the Bridge aforesaid, and for keeping the highways within that District in suitable repair—On condition however, that sufficient assurances shall be given that within the two years aforesaid, the Bridge shall be compleated in such a manner as shall be satisfactory and without any other expence to the Town—And upon the further condition, that the plan upon which the Bridge is to be Built, shall be exhibited and approved of by the Town, by a Committee appointed for that purpose before the commencement of the work—
