

In each case a most harible murder had been committed. Brown and Alvitre had been committed, found guily upon undoubted evidence, and condemned to be hung for an unproveked nurder. Why the Supreme Court interfered in favor of Brown, and not also the same leniency to Alvitre, we do not u derstand. If it was because one was an American and the other not, the act was unworthy, and the people naturally resented it. Such partiality is unjustifiable.

The people of Los Angeles have suffered for years the horible influence and fiendish acts of a set of desperadoes, who have set all law at defiance. The miscreauts who have made themselves so execuable in the northern part of the State that they could no longer, even with all our loose way of treating murders, remain here, have been in the habit of migrating to the sothern part of the State, where the paneity of population and comparative weakness of the public authorines have given them a safer field for the perpetation of crime. When, therefore, the people and courts had succeeded in detecting and dooming to merited punishment some of the most deserving chastisement, it was not very becoming to attempt interfering.
